WHEREAS by section 13 of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1961, it is enacted that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Commissioner, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a Main Road and may, in like manner and on the like recommendation, declare that any Main Road shall cease to be a Main Road; and whereas the Governor, by Proclamation, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of September, 1938, declared, *inter alia*, that the road described in Schedule I hereto shall be a Main Road; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of the said road described in Schedule I hereto shall cease to be a Main Road and that the portion of the said road described in Schedule II hereto shall be a Main Road: Now therefore, I, the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that the portion of the Midland Junction-Merredin-Southern Cross Road described in Schedule I hereto, heretofore declared to be a Main Road as aforesaid, shall cease to be a Main Road and that the portion of the Midland Junction-Merredin-Southern Cross Road, as aforesaid and described in Schedule II hereto shall be a Main Road within the meaning of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1961, that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the Main Road and that the said Proclamation is hereby varied accordingly.

Schedule I.

Midland Junction-Merredin-Southern Cross Road.
Shire of Kellerberrin.

That portion of a public road commencing at the intersection of the West Railway Crossing within the Townsite of Doodlakine, with the southern boundary of the Eastern Goldfields Railway Reserve; crossing the said Railway Reserve to its northern side; thence generally north-eastwards along the northern boundary of the Railway Reserve within the Doodlakine Townsite to the east boundary of the said Townsite; thence along the southern boundary of Doodlakine A.A. Lot 16, Lot 15, Lot 14 and Lot 13 to a point on the south boundary of Doodlakine A.A. Lot 12, where the said boundary is intersected by the prolongation of the east boundary of Doodlakine A.A. Lot 26; being portion of the road described in the schedule to the Proclamation dated 2nd September, 1938, declaring as Main Road, that portion of the Midland Junction-Merredin-Southern Cross Road lying within the boundaries of the Kellerberrin Shire Council district.

Schedule II.

Midland Junction-Merredin-Southern Cross Road.
Shire of Kellerberrin.

That portion of a public road commencing from a southerly prolongation of the eastern boundary of the West Railway Crossing within the Townsite of Doodlakine, across Moore Street to the southern boundary of the said Moore Street; thence along Moore Street to the eastern boundary of the Doodlakine Townsite; thence generally north-eastwards between the southern boundary of the Eastern Goldfields Railway Reserve and the northern boundaries of Doodlakine A.A. Lots 23, 24 and 25 to a point 18 chains from the intersection of the northern and western boundaries of Doodlakine A.A. Lot 26, crossing the Eastern Goldfields Railway Reserve to its northern side, to join the

declared Midland Junction-Merredin-Southern Cross Road at the prolongation of the eastern boundary of Doodlakine A.A. Lot 26, at its intersection with the southern boundary of Doodlakine A.A. Lot 12.

WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by subsection (2) of section five of the Stock Diseases Act, 1895-1960, that a proclamation made pursuant to that section may be varied or revoked by subsequent proclamation; and whereas the Governor, by proclamation made on the 24th February, 1966, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th February, 1966, prohibited, for a period of six months from and including that date of publication, the introduction into this State of all poultry and all carcasses or portions of the carcasses of any poultry and all eggs of poultry from any of the States of Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and Tasmania; and whereas it is now deemed expedient to revoke that proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revoke the abovementioned proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th February, 1966.

Forests Act, 1918-1964.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 710/64; L.& S. 2519/21.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1964, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 28th day of October, 1964, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the

advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown land as State Forest No. 22 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the Schedule hereto.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W.C.B. 377/60.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1965, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas The National Bank of Australasia Limited of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has, duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for £5,000 in terms of the currency existing at the time of such deposit, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The National Bank of Australasia Limited from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1965 for a period terminating on the 31st day of December, 1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 433 (a) of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, *inter alia*, make and publish in the *Government Gazette* uniform general by-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a Council under Part XV of the Act, and by Order declare that all or any such uniform general by-laws as are specified in the Order, shall apply to the whole or any portion of a district so specified; and whereas the Governor has so made and published the uniform general by-laws herein-after in this Order appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid doth hereby declare that the whole of each of the uniform general by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th October, 1965, and amendments thereto published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter shall apply to all townsites within the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbrook.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 305/65.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 688 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that where through an impediment or accidental omission anything required to be done by or under this Act is not done, or is not done within the prescribed time, manner or form, the Governor for the purpose of giving effect to the intention and purposes of this Act, may by order take such measures as are necessary for rectifying the omission or removing the impediment and may validate anything which has been done otherwise than in the prescribed time, manner or form; and whereas section 91 of the Local Government Act requires the returning officer to cause notice of a vacancy in an office of a member of a Council and the nomination day and nomination place to be published in a newspaper circulating in the district, if the district is a northern district, not more than sixty-three days and not less than forty-nine days before the nomination day; and whereas in respect of the nomination day, appointed as 15th April, 1966, the returning officer of the Shire of Carnarvon omitted to cause the prescribed notice to be published within the prescribed period; and whereas the said publication was made 29 days before the nomination day: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth by this Order validate the omission of the returning officer of the Shire of Carnarvon to cause notice of the vacancies for the annual elections to be published within the prescribed period.
