Constitution Act, 1889-1950. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 59/65.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1950, by which the appointment of all public Officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments, which by Order in Council are vested in heads of departments, or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the minor appointments of persons who are exempt from the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904, employed by the Department of Lands and Surveys should be vested in Frederick William Byfield (Accountant) and that the like powers vested in Gerald Joseph Clarke and Ronald George Sproxton, by Orders in Council, dated 24th July, 1963, and 7th September, 1960, shall be cancelled: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby declares that the power of making such minor appointments shall vest and the same is hereby vested in Frederick William Byfield (Accountant), and that the like powers vested in Gerald Joseph Clarke and Ronald George Sproxton by Orders in Council dated 24th July 1963 ton by Orders in Council dated 24th July, 1963, and September, 1960, shall be cancelled accordingly.

Land Act, 1933-1965. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1070/64.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said Section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 28149 (Ongerup Lot 179), should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to The St. John Ambulance Association in Western Australia, incorporated, to be held in trust for the purpose of an "Ambulance Depot Site": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Land Act, 1933-1965. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Council of the City of Perth is desirous, under the by-law making power conferred by section 193 of the Local Government Act, 1960, of making by-laws for regulating public bathing and the costumes of bathers and the conduct of bathers and others in the sea adjoining though outside its district for a distance of two hundred (200) yards from low water mark at ordinary spring tides; and whereas it is enacted by sub paragraph (iv) of paragraph (a) of that sec-tion, that such by-laws may be made only pursuant to an order made under subsection (8) of section 190 of the Act; and whereas it is enacted by the subsection lastmentioned, that where in the opinion of the Governor a by-law making power conferred by the Act on a Council should be extended to an area which is outside the district, the Governor may by Order declare that for the purpose of the exercise of the power the area is to be regarded as being within the district and that the Council may exercise the power in respect of the area as if in fact it were within the district; and whereas the Governor is of the opinion that the said by-law making power should be extended to the said area outside the district of the said Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, pursuant to the powers conferred by subsection (8) of section 190 of the Local Government Act, 1960, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that for the pure tive Council, doth hereby declare that for the purpose of the exercise of the said by-law making power an area which is outside the district of the City of Perth, namely the area which adjoins that district and extends for a distance of two hundred (200) yards seaward from low water mark at ordinary spring tides is to be regarded as being within the district of the City of Perth, and that the Council of the City of Perth may make by-laws for regulating public bathing and the costumes of bathers and the conduct of bathers and others in respect of that area as if in fact it were within the municipal district of the City of Perth.

the area as if in fact it were within the district; and whereas the Governor is of the opinion that the said by-law making power should be extended to the said area outside the district of the said Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, pursuant to the powers conferred by subsection (8) of section 190 of the Local Government Act, 1960, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that for the purpose of the exercise of the said by-law making power an area which is outside the district of the Shire of Exmouth, namely the area which adjoins that district and extends for a distance of two hundred (200) yards seaward from low water mark at ordinary spring tides is to be regarded as being within the district of the Shire of Exmouth, and that the Council of the Shire of Exmouth may make by-laws for regulating public bathing and the costumes of bathers and the conduct of bathers and others in respect of that area as if in fact it were within the municipal district of the Shire of Exmouth.




