the recommendation of the Minister, doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 9 of the said Act—

- (a) alter the boundaries of the Osborne Park No. 18 District by excising from the area of land comprising that district as defined and described in Schedule "B" to the Order in Council dated the 28th October, 1964, so much of the land as is included in the Osborne Park No. 25 District defined and described in Schedule "B" to this Order in Council, and substituting for the area of land defining Osborne Park No. 18 District the area of land defined and described in Schedule "A" to this Order in Council;
- (b) alter the boundaries of the Canning Road District by substituting for the area of land comprising the Canning Road District specified in the Second Schedule to the Order in Council dated the 18th April, 1947, as defining that district, the area of land defined in Schedule "C" to this Order in Council;
- (c) subdivide the Osborne Park No. 18 District as defined and described in Schedule "B" to the Order in Council dated the 28th October, 1964, into two districts being Osborne Park No. 18 District comprising the area of land defined in Schedule "A" to this Order in Council and Osborne Park No. 25 District comprising the area of land defined and described in Schedule "B" to this Order in Council; and

(d) On all cleared land not less than six feet in width within one chain of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

(a) Lots used for grazing purposes or in agricultural pursuits—

(i) Not less than six feet in width inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land which enjoy a common boundary with a formed public road, provided that the burning of the road verge along the boundary referred to herein shall be deemed to be a sufficient alternative.

(ii) Not less than ten feet in width immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks, with a further break six feet in width within one chain of the perimeter of haystacks.

(iii) Not less than six feet in width around the perimeter of land on which a cereal crop is planted.

(iv) On all cleared land not less than six feet in width within one chain of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

(b) All other lots : Effective firebreaks around the perimeter of all buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least three feet; or where the boundary is closer than three feet then for that lesser distance.

(c) All townscape lots: To be cleared of all inflammable material and rubbish on or before the 30th day of November, 1966, and kept clear of such material until the 13th day of March, 1967.

Provided that if, for any reason, it is impracticable to clear firebreaks in the situation required by this notice, any suitable alteration to the foregoing may be nominated or approved by either the Bush Fire Control Officer or Captain of the Bush Fire Brigade in the area concerned.

The owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects to comply with the above requirements is guilty of an offence under subsection 3 of section 33 of the Act and is liable to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more than two hundred dollars, in addition to which the Council may have the work carried out and may recover the cost of such work from the owner and/or occupier.

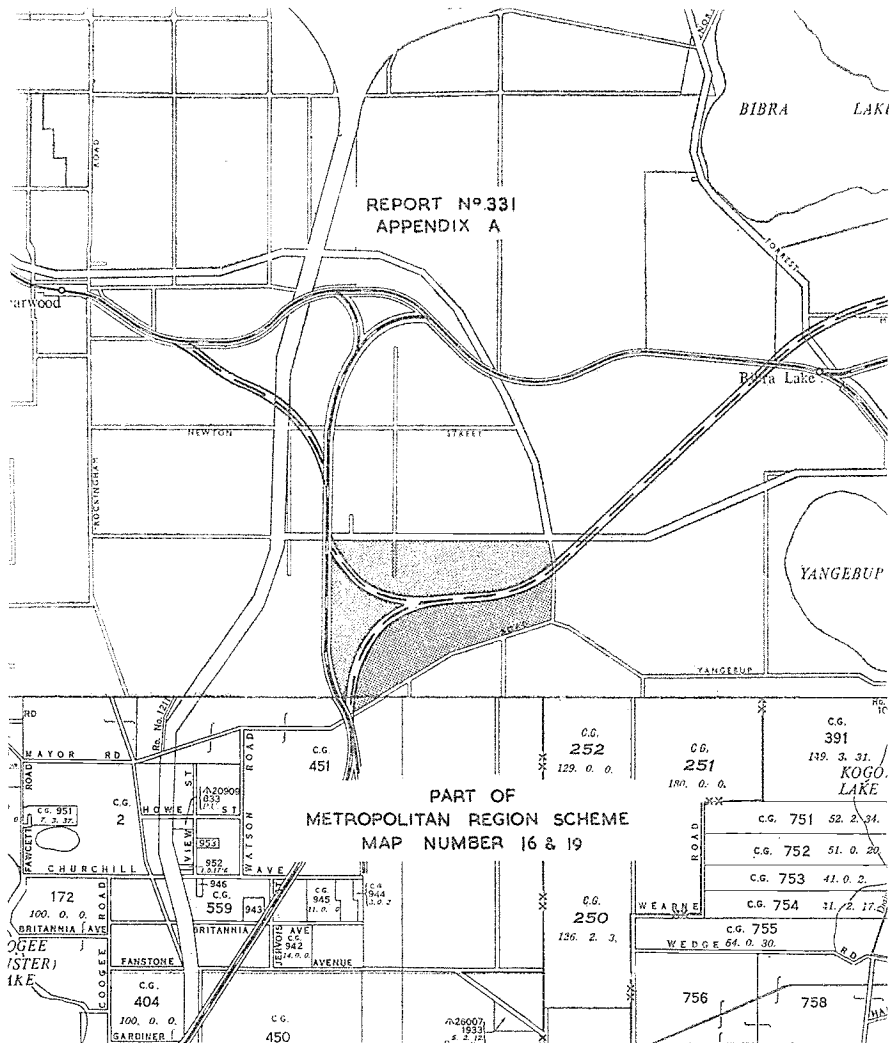

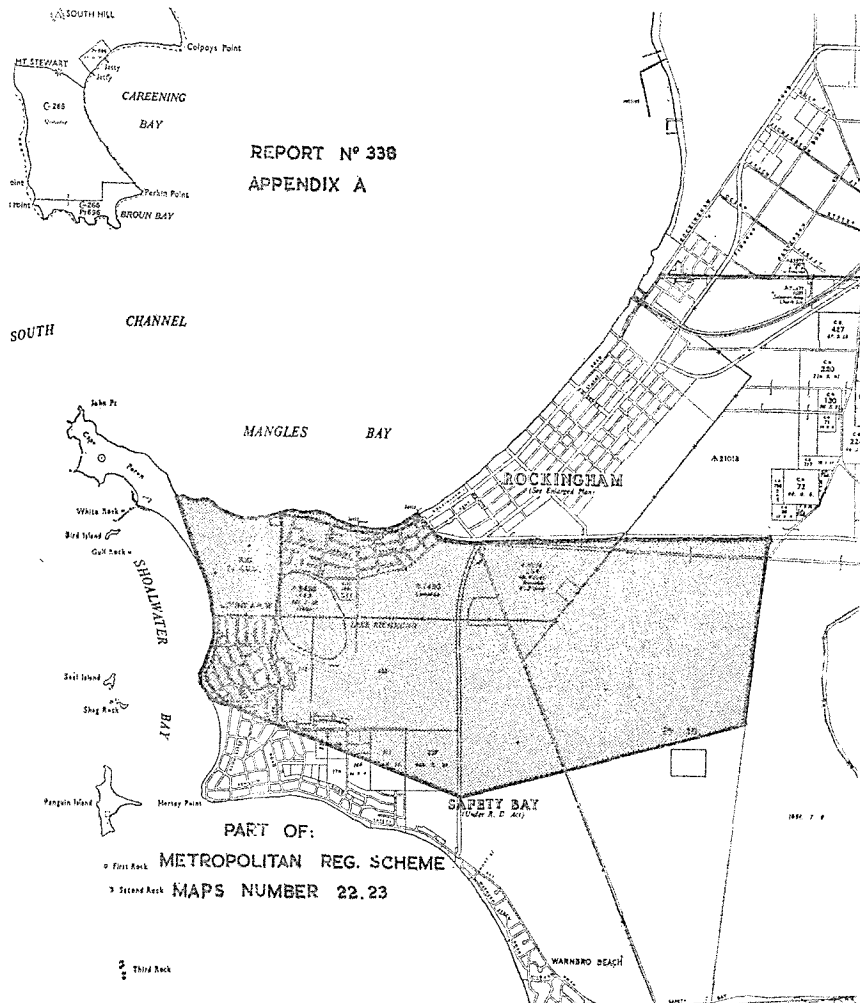
