WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 28194, should vest in and be held by the Shire of Mukinbudin, in trust for the purpose of "Sheep Sale Yard": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Mukinbudin, in trust for Sheep Sale Yard, with power to the said Shire of Mukinbudin, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the 5th May, 1926 under the Road Districts Act, 1919 (since repealed), and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th May, 1926, His Excellency the Governor, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by that Act did sever that portion of the Tambellup Road District, as described in Schedule "C" to that order and annex it to the Plantagenet Road District; and whereas there was an error in the order occurring in the description of that portion of land as described in the said Schedule "C"; and whereas the said order is an order under, and for the purposes of, the Local Government Act, 1960-1965: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 691 (1) of the Local Government Act, 1960-1965, doth by this order rectify the said error by amending the said Schedule "C" by substituting for the passage, "the eastern boundary of 3449, part of the west, the north and east boundary of location 5000, part of the north boundary of 5335, the north boundary of location 2973 part of the west, the north and part of the east boundary of location 4343", therein appearing, the passage, "to the southernmost south-eastern corner of location 3449; thence generally northerly along eastern boundaries of that location to a point situate west of the westernmost south-western corner of location 5000; thence generally easterly, generally southerly, easterly and generally north-easterly along boundaries of that location and generally easterly along the northern boundaries of locations 5385 and 2973 and northerly, easterly and southerly along boundaries of location 4343".

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (a) of section 73 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that where the mode of election to the office of president is by the Council, the Councillors at the commencement of the first meeting of the Council held after the annual election shall by secret ballot elect one of their number to the office of president; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of the said section that if the councillors because of an equality of votes or for any other reason do not elect one of their number to the office of president, the meeting shall be adjourned to the corresponding day and time of the next following week at the same place; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (e) of that section that if at that meeting the councillors fail to elect one of their number to the office of president the chairman of the meeting shall report the fact to the Minister and the meeting shall be further adjourned to a date to be fixed by the Minister; and whereas at a meeting of the Municipality of the Shire of Hall's Creek held on the 20th June, 1966, there was an equality of votes in an election for the office of president; and whereas by accidental omission the meeting was not adjourned as required; and whereas by section 638 where through an accidental omission anything required to be done by or under this Act is not done, the Governor for the purpose of giving effect to the intention and purpose of the Act, may, by order, take such

steps as are necessary for rectifying the omission: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor doth by this order rectify the omission of the Municipality of the Shire of Hall's Creek to adjourn the meeting of the Council held on the 20th June, by appointing the 18th day of July, 1966, for a meeting of the Council for the purpose of electing a president.

WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by section 556 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1965, that the Governor may, from time to time, by order constitute such Valuation Appeal Courts as he thinks necessary for hearing of appeals under Division 5 of Part XXV of that Act and appoint such person or persons specified in the order to constitute a Valuation Appeal Court; and whereas by an order made the 7th June, 1961, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th June, 1961, and amended by orders so published in the *Government Gazettes* of the 8th September, 1961, 6th October, 1961, 2nd March, 1962, 14th December, 1962, 6th December, 1963 and 16th July, 1965, the Governor did (*inter alia*) constitute the Metropolitan Valuation Appeal Court and did appoint the three persons specified in Item 1 of the schedule to that order (as so amended) to constitute that court; and whereas it is now expedient to appoint William Arthur Petterson as the person to constitute the Metropolitan Valuation Appeal Court in place of the three persons previously specified in the said Item 1: Now, therefore, His Excellency, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 556 of the said Act, doth hereby appoint William Arthur Petterson of 289 Marmion Street, Cottesloe, as the person to constitute the Metropolitan Valuation Appeal Court in the place of the three persons named in Item 1 of the Schedule to the said order (as so amended).

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 136/64.

WHEREAS by an order made the 15th April, 1964, the Governor did pursuant to the provisions of section 373 (2) of the Local Government Act, 1960-1965, suspend the operation of Part XV of the said Act to the pastoral leases of Yardie Creek and Exmouth Gulf Stations within the district of the Shire of Exmouth; and whereas pursuant to the provisions of subsection (1) of section 433A of the said Act, the Governor did—

- (a) by notice, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th October, 1965, make the uniform general by-laws cited as the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965; and
- (b) by an order made the 27th April, 1966, declare (*inter alia*) that the whole of those by-laws should apply to the district of the Shire of Exmouth, less the portion of the district comprised in pastoral leases of Yardie Creek Station and Exmouth Gulf Station;

and whereas it is now expedient that both Part XV of the Local Government Act, 1960-1965, and the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965, should apply to the whole of the district of the Shire of Exmouth: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by—

- (a) section 373 (1) (b) of the said Act, with respect to the application of the said Part XV; and

(b) section 433A of the said Act, with respect to the application of the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965,

doth by this Order apply the said Part XV and doth declare the said Uniform Building By-laws, 1965, to apply, to the portion of the district of the Shire of Exmouth comprised in the pastoral lease of Yardie Creek Station and Exmouth Gulf Station, with the intent that both shall apply to the whole of the district of that Shire.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 593/63.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made the 11th December, 1963, the Governor in exercise of his powers under Section 329 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1965 did constitute as a regional district for the local government purpose of the rehabilitation and maintenance of the No. 1 Vermin Fence, the whole of the area of the districts of the Shires of Cue, Meekatharra, Mt. Magnet, Sandstone and Yalgoo and did by that order assign to the regional district the name "Murchison Regional Vermin District," and specify that ten members, of whom two should be nominated by each constituent council, should be allotted to the district; and whereas it is enacted (*inter alia*) by subsection (4) of that section that local government in a regional district is committed to a regional council, consisting of the allotted number of persons appointed not later than the fifteenth day of June in each year for one year by each of the constituent councils; and whereas each of the constituents councils of the Murchison Regional Vermin District, by accidental omission, did not appoint before the 15th June, 1966, the allotted number of persons to the council of the Murchison Regional Vermin District; and whereas it is enacted by section 688 of the said Act that where through an impediment or accidental omission anything required to be done by or under that Act is not done or is not done within the prescribed time, manner or form, the Governor, for the purpose of giving effect to the intention and purposes of that Act, may by order take such measures as are necessary for rectifying the omission or the impediment, and may validate anything which has been done otherwise than in the prescribed time, manner or form: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council, doth hereby appoint the 31st day of July, 1966, as the day not later than which each of the constituent councils of the Murchison Regional Vermin District shall appoint the allotted number of persons to the regional council of the said regional district, as required by subsection (4) of section 329 of the said Act.

Application for Transfer of a License.

To the Court of Petty Sessions at Perth:
