## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 1618/96.—That Class "A" Reserve No. 1634 (Buckland Hill Suburban Lot 115 and Mosman Park Lot 594), should vest in and be held by the Town of Mosman Park in trust for the purpose of "Recreation."

Corres. 2224/66.—That Reserve No. 28222 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Perth, in trust for the purpose of "Kindergarten Site."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the aforesaid bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, with power to the said bodies, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserves for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions

and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 635/61.—That Reserve No. 26956 (Canning Location 1965) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the "Western Australian Fire Brigades Board" to be held in trust for the purpose of a "Fire Station Site."

Corres. 1015/28.—That Reserve No. 28210 (Geraldton Lot 1928) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Baptist Union of Western Australia (Incorporated) to be held in trust for "Church Site (Baptist)".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid bodies, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Corres. 561/66.—That Reserve No. 28204 should vest in and be held by The Baptist Union of Western Australia (Incorporated) in trust for the purpose of "Youth Camp Site (Baptist Church)".

Corres. 554/66.—That Reserve No. 28209 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Meekatharra, in trust for the purpose of "Transport Parking Area".

Corres. 3694/65.—That Reserve No. 28219 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Gnowangerup in trust for the purpose of a "Memorial Park".

Corres. 4756/99.—That Reserve No. 28226 should vest in and be held by the City of Fremantle, in trust for the purpose of "Park".

Corres. 4011/65.—That Reserve No. 28227 should vest in and be held by the City of Fremantle, in trust for the purpose of "Parking Area".

Corres. 2450/65.—That Reserve No. 28228 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Albany, in trust for the purpose of a "Hall Site".

Corres. 1037/66.—That Reserve No. 28232 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Albany in trust for the purpose of a "Tourist Lookout".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Forests Act, 1918-1964.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 710/64; L. & S. 3342/63.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1964, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the twenty-eighth day of October, 1964 for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown land as State Forest No. 30 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 815032/66.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1965, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply.  
Shire of Canning.

24 inch Distribution Main in Treasure Road.

The construction of a twenty-four inch diameter water main approximately four thousand, four hundred feet in length.

The above works are shown on plan M.W.B. 9521.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 5th day of August, 1966.

Gas (Standards) Act, 1947-1956.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 7 of the Gas (Standards) Act, 1947-1956, that every undertaker shall pay to the Commission annually such sum as the Governor by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* prescribes; and whereas by an Order in Council made on the 9th April, 1952, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th April, 1952, the Governor prescribed a rate of  $\frac{1}{4}$ d. for every 2,000 cubic feet of gas sold by any undertaker (other than those undertakers exempted from the provisions of the said Act by virtue of subsection (3) of section 4 thereof) being paid to the Commission for a period of 12 months ended on the 30th day of June, 1951, and for subsequent years; and whereas the Governor is now desirous of prescribing that the rate to be paid by the undertakers during the period of 12 months ended on the 30th day of June, 1966, and for subsequent years be one-tenth of a cent for every 2,000 cubic feet of gas sold in lieu of  $\frac{1}{4}$ d.: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby prescribe a rate of one-tenth of a cent for every 2,000 cubic feet of gas sold by any undertaker (other than those undertakers exempted from the provisions of the said Act by virtue of subsection (3) of section 4 thereof) being paid to the Commission for a period of 12 months ended on the 30th day of June, 1966, and for subsequent years.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before the 6th day of November, 1966, to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 1st day of April, 1967.

1. Rural Land.—In respect of land owned or occupied by you other than within the townsites of Cuballing, Yornaning or Popanyinning, you shall—

- (a) clear all inflammable material, firebreaks at least 9 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also at a distance of not less than 22 yards and not more than 50 yards from the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks so as to completely surround the buildings and/or haystacks; and
- (b) clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land; and
- (c) where your property exceeds 500 acres you shall clear of all inflammable material additional firebreaks at least 9 feet wide so as to divide your property into areas of not more than 500 acres which are completely surrounded with a firebreak at least 9 feet wide.

2. Townsite Land.—(All land within the townsites of Cuballing, Yornaning or Popanyinning.) In respect of land owned or occupied by you within the townsites of Cuballing, Yornaning or Popanyinning, you shall clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

3. Fuel Dumps.—In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any fuel dump, in addition to the requirements of paragraphs 1 and 2 above, you shall remove all inflammable material from all land occupied by drums used for storage of liquid fuel whether the drums contain liquid fuel or not, including the land on which ramps for holding the drums are constructed and to a distance of at least 10 feet outside the perimeter of any drum, stack of drums or drum ramp.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks on the land as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th October, 1966, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.
