Local Government Act, 1960. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

2. Townsite Land: (All land within the townsites of Cranbrook and Frankland.) In respect of land owned or occupied by you within the townsites of Cranbrook and Frankland, you shall clear of all infiammable material, firebreaks at least 6 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

3. Fuel Dumps: In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any fuel dump, in addition to the requirements of paragraphs 1, and 2 above, you shall remove all inflammable material from all land occupied by drums used for the storage of liquid fuel whether the drums contain liquid fuel or not, including the land on which ramps for holding the drums are constructed and to a distance of at least 10 feet outside the perimeter of any drum, stack of drums or drum ramp.

4. Sawmills: In respect of land owned or occupied by you on any part of which is situated any sawmill, in addition to the requirements of paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, you shall remove all bush from all land within 5 chains from the centre of the sawmill.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks on the land as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 31st October, 1966, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Bush" is defined in the Bush Fires Act as "includes trees, bushes, plants, stubble, scrub, and undergrowth of all kinds whatsoever whether alive or dead and whether standing or not standing and also a part of a tree, bush plant, or undergrowth, and whether severed therefrom or not so severed."

The term does not include sawdust, and other waste timber resulting from the sawmilling of timber in a sawmill whilst the sawdust and other waste timber remains upon the premises of the sawmill in which the saw-milling is carried on.

(1) An existing drain shall not form portion of a firebreak required by the notice. (2) Land separated from a Railway Reserve and/or land used for railway purposes and/or made roads, only by drain or drainage reserve or easement for such a drain or drainage reserve shall be considered to adjoin such Railway Reserve and/or land used for railway purposes and/or made roads.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the bush fire control officer for your area, and appointed by the Council, not later than the 1st day of November, 1966, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land, or to provide the firebreaks required by this notice by a date other than that fixed in the notice. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Failure or neglect to comply with this notice renders you liable to prosecution. Penalty: a fine of \$200, and the person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work directly in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.
