ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1327/52.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 433 (A) of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, *inter alia*, make and publish in the *Government Gazette* uniform general by-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a Council under Part XV of the Act, and by Order declare that all or any such uniform general by-laws as are specified in the Order, shall apply to the whole or any portion of a district so specified; and whereas the Governor has so made and published the uniform general by-laws herein-after in this Order appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid doth hereby declare that the whole of each of the uniform general by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th October, 1965, and amendments thereto published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter shall apply to the townsites of Mukinbudin, Lake Brown and Bonnie Rock within the district of the Shire of Mukinbudin.

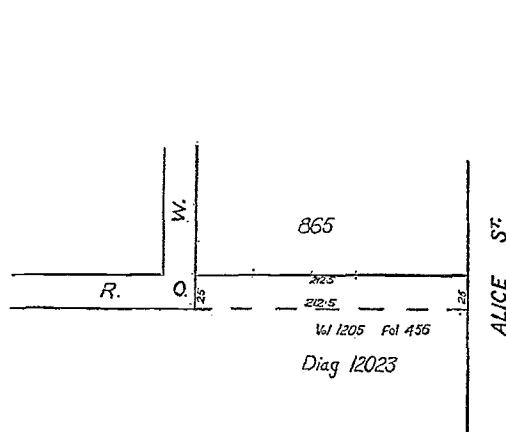
