Deepening of Success and Parmelia Channels.

MARINERS and others are notified that from the 13th September, 1966, one and later two trailer dredgers will be operating in the Success and Parmelia Channels until further notice.

Details:

- (1) The channels are being dredged to 45 feet below low water.
- (2) The channel beacons will be removed, lengthened and replaced in opposite pairs as required and will be repositioned with centres fifteen (15) feet outside the bottom width of the channels, i.e., 20 feet closer to the bottom width than as at present chartered.

Dredger Signals: Dredgers will exhibit the signals required by the International Regulations for prevention of collision at sea, Rule 4(c).

Suspension of the Prohibited Burning Times.

Bush Fires Board,

IT is hereby notified that the Hon. Minister administering the Bush Fires Act, under the authority contained in section 17 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1965, hereby suspends the operations of all declarations prohibiting the setting fire to the bush only so far as the declarations extend to the burning of bush, during the period from the 1st October, 1966, to the 30th November, 1966, inclusive, on land in prohibited burning times Zone No. 1 (Metropolitan Fire District Zone) as defined in the *Government Gazette*, No. 84 of the 16th September, 1966, subject to the conditions that all burning carried out under the provisions of this suspension shall be carried out in accordance with the conditions specified hereunder:—

Specified Conditions.

1. Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place does not exceed one-half of an acre:

- (a) Stumps, fallen trees, limbs of trees, branches, logs, cleared scrub and other debris resulting from clearing operations may be burnt provided that a permit to burn be first obtained from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments, and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with. The permit must be obtained from the nearest manned fire station to the land upon which the burning is to take place.
- (b) Standing bush may be burnt without a permit provided that:
 - (i) a firebreak at least three feet wide cleared of all inflammable material has first been provided inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land;
 - (ii) at least two adult persons are in attendance during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning;
 - (iii) a hose long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt is provided and has water flowing through it continuously during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning; or
 - (iv) where reticulated water is not available, alternative firefighting equipment of the nature of shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets, or similar equipment, sufficient to control the escape of the fire is provided.

2. Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place exceeds one-half of an acre, bush may only be burnt provided that a permit to burn is first obtained from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments, and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with. The permit must be obtained from the nearest manned fire station to the land upon which the burning is to take place.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 herein, an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and Amendments, and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act, may refuse to issue a permit to set fire to the bush on any land, if in his opinion, it would not be safe for the proposed burning to be carried out.

AGREEMENT—CIVIL SERVICE ASSOCIATION
AND COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORT.

(Salaried Officers—Department of Transport.)
(Registered 19th September, 1966.)

THIS Agreement, to be known as the "Salaried Officers' (Department of Transport) Agreement", made pursuant to the provisions of Part 10 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1963, this 1st day of September, 1966, between The Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter referred to as the "Association") of the one

part and the Commissioner of Transport (hereinafter referred to as the "Commissioner") of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

3.—Salary Rates—Interpretation.

(a) In this Agreement the term "basic rate" means in the case of—

- (i) Male Officers—Clerical and General Divisions—the result (to the nearest \$ (£)) obtained by multiplying the male basic wage, as determined from time to time by the Industrial Commission of Western Australia, by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 $\frac{1}{6}$);
- (ii) Female Officers—Clerical and General Divisions—seventy-five per cent. (75%) to the nearest \$ (£) of the male basic rate as determined in paragraph (i) of this sub-clause.

(b) The basic rates as determined in accordance with subclause (a) of this clause are as follows:—

Female officers	\$1,267 (£633)

(c) If, during the currency of this Agreement, The Western Australian Industrial Commission should prescribe a basic wage differing in amount from that prescribed as at the 25th January, 1966, and as shown as an annual equivalent in paragraph (b) above, then the margins (or percentages in the case of officers not in receipt of margins) set out hereinafter in this Agreement shall be deemed to be decreased or increased as the case may be to the same extent that such basic wage (as expressed as an annual equivalent) is increased or decreased

by the said Commission, so that, subject to the provisions of subclause (d) of this clause and clauses 11 and 15 of this Agreement, the total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement shall remain constant.

(d) The total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement are based upon the Federal Basic Wage for Perth expressed as an annual equivalent of \$1,711 (male officers). If during the currency of this Agreement the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission should prescribe a basic wage for Perth differing in amount from that prescribed and shown as an annual equivalent in this subclause, then the total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement shall be increased or decreased as the case may be to the same extent (or proportion thereof in the case of officers not in receipt of margins) that the Federal Basic Wage for Perth, as expressed as an annual equivalent, is increased or decreased.

4.—Male Officers—Clerical Division—Classes and Grades.

(a) Except where otherwise provided in this Agreement, the classes and grades applicable to male officers in the Clerical Division shall be as indicated in Schedule A to this Agreement.

(b) The incremental scale except where specifically provided for in this Agreement shall be as follows:—

(b) Classes and grades beyond a salary of \$2,945 per annum shall be those set out in clause 4 of this Agreement, provided that an officer shall not be eligible for promotion to a position classified above the automatic range or to claim or receive a salary higher than \$2,945 per annum, until he has passed a promotional examination as determined by the Commissioner from time to time or has acquired equal or higher qualifications as approved by the Commissioner.

(c) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment to the automatic range may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

(d) A male clerk classified in the automatic range who is a married man or is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the Commissioner, shall be paid an allowance equivalent

to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale of the automatic range, with a maximum salary inclusive of such allowance of \$2,945 per annum.

(e) A male clerk appointed to the automatic range who, at the date of such appointment, has successfully completed—

- (i) English and three other subjects including either Mathematics A, General Mathematics, Economics or Accountancy at the Leaving Certificate examination of the University of Western Australia; or
- (ii) the Promotional Examination as determined by the Commissioner from time to time; or
- (iii) such examinations as may be accepted by the Commissioner as being of a standard equivalent to or higher than that attained in acquiring the requirements contained in paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subclause;

shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum on and from the date of his appointment to the automatic range.

(f) A male clerk appointed to the automatic range who, subsequent to the date of such appointment, successfully completes one of the examination requirements contained in paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of subclause (e), shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum on and from the first day of the month following the date on which the final examination paper was held.

(g) Payment of an allowance prescribed by subclause (c) or subclause (f), shall be in addition to any allowance received by the officer in accordance with the provisions of subclause (d).

(h) Payment of an allowance prescribed by subclause (e) or subclause (f) shall cease on the date when—

- (i) the officer becomes eligible to receive a Qualifications Allowance in accordance with clause 15 of this Agreement; or
- (ii) the officer becomes eligible to receive an allowance in accordance with subclause (i) of this clause.

(i) A male clerk classified in the automatic range who has passed the promotional examination or has acquired equal or higher qualifications approved by the Commissioner, and who has been retained on the maximum margin of the automatic range for at least one year, shall be paid an allowance of \$130 per annum which shall be increased to \$260 per annum on completion of a further year's service on the automatic range. Thereafter the allowance shall be increased—

- (i) to \$390 per annum when the officer has been in receipt of the allowance of \$260 per annum for a period of twelve months; and
- (ii) to \$520 per annum on the completion of a further twelve months' service.

Provided that—

- (a) an allowance under this subclause shall not be granted unless the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties;
- (b) on the promotion of an officer to a higher position, any allowance received by him under this subclause shall be reduced by the amount which is required to bring his salary up to the minimum of the position to which he is promoted, and thereafter, any allowance still received by the officer shall be reduced and converted to salary as and when the officer becomes eligible for annual grade increments; and
- (c) an allowance paid under this subclause shall cease, should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(j) A male clerk classified in a Class 1 position shall be paid an allowance of \$130 per annum after completion of twelve months' service on the maximum margin of such Class 1 position, which allowance shall increase to \$260 per annum after completion of a further twelve months' service.

Provided that—

- (a) in each case, the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties;
- (b) on the promotion of an officer to a higher position, any allowance received by him under this subclause shall be reduced by the amount which is required to bring his salary up to the minimum of the position to which he is promoted and thereafter, any allowance still received by the officer shall be reduced and converted to salary as and when the officer becomes eligible for annual grade increments;
- (c) an allowance paid under this subclause shall cease, should the officer refuse to accept promotion; and
- (d) an officer shall not be eligible to receive an allowance under this subclause unless he has completed not less than nine years' service in the Clerical Division as an adult permanent officer.

6.—Male Officers—Inspectorial and General Division Staff—Classes and Grades.

(a) The classes and grades applicable to Male Officers of the Inspectorial and General Division staff of the Department shall be as indicated in Schedule (B) to this Agreement.

7.—Inspectorial Staff.

(a) Hours of Duty: The normal hours of duty to be observed by Inspectors will be 80 hours in each fortnight. Hours of duty will be in accordance with rosters which will provide each Inspector with 48 hours notice of the fact that he is required to report for duty, and also provide breaks of 12 hours duration between individual tours of duty. Provided that where an Inspector is called out for duty without the required notice he shall receive overtime, or time in lieu thereof at the rate of time and one half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. Provided further that payment shall be made or leave in lieu granted for a minimum period of 2½ hours.

(b) Meal Allowance: Where a tour of duty extends over two normal meal periods, an Inspector shall be reimbursed the cost of one meal at the rate prescribed in the Public Service Allowances Agreement.

(c) Protective Clothing: Each Inspector shall be provided with a dustcoat, waterproof top-coat and cap.

(d) Travelling Allowance—Shift Work: Where the terms of employment of an officer require that he use a Departmental vehicle, he shall, when he commences or finishes a shift between the hours of 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., be paid travelling allowance to or from the office.

The travelling allowance shall be assessed on the basis that an officer has used a vehicle in excess of 12 Horse Power for the journey and shall be calculated in accordance with the rate provided in Clause 15 of the Public Service Allowances Agreement.

Provided that mileage in excess of 12 for any one journey shall be disregarded in calculating the allowance due under this clause.

8.—Classified Positions—Female Officers.

(a) Except where otherwise provided in this Agreement, the classes and grades applicable to female officers in the Clerical Division shall be as indicated in Schedule "C" to this Agreement.

(b) The incremental scale except where specifically provided for elsewhere in this Agreement, shall be as follows:—

(c) A female Clerical Division officer who has obtained promotion to either Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 as set out in Schedule "C" and who has completed not less than twenty (20) years of continuous permanent service, shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum, provided the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer and provided further that an allowance under this subclause shall not apply to an officer classified in accordance with the provisions of subclauses (d) and (e), hereof.

(d) An adult Female Clerical Division officer who is paid in accordance with the rates prescribed in this clause, may apply to the Commissioner to be paid the same margin as that prescribed for a male officer occupying an identical position, on the grounds that—

- (i) she possesses the same academic qualifications as those required by a male officer occupying an identical position; and
- (ii) the duties and responsibilities of the position which she occupies are identical with those of a male position;

and if the Commissioner is satisfied that she possesses the same academic qualifications as those required by a male officer occupying an identical position, and that the duties and responsibilities of the position which she occupies are identical with those of a male position, she shall be paid the same margin as that prescribed for the male officer occupying the identical position.

(e) An adult female General Division officer who is paid in accordance with the rates prescribed in Schedule (C) to this Agreement may apply to the Commissioner to be paid the same salary as that prescribed for a male officer occupying an identical position, on the grounds that the duties and responsibilities of the position which she occupies are identical with those of a male position; and if the Commissioner is satisfied that the duties and responsibilities of her position are identical with those of a male position, and shall be paid the same salary as that prescribed for the male officer occupying the identical position.

(f) An adult female Professional Division officer who is paid in accordance with the rates prescribed in Schedule (D) to this Agreement may apply to the Commissioner to be paid the same salary as that prescribed for a male officer occupying an identical position and paid in accordance with rates prescribed in Schedule (E) to this Agreement, on the grounds that—

- (i) she possesses the same academic qualifications as those required by a male officer occupying an identical position; and
- (ii) the duties and responsibilities of the position which she occupies are identical with those of a male position;

and if the Commissioner is satisfied that she possesses the same academic qualifications as those required by a male officer occupying an identical position, and that the duties and responsibilities of the position which she occupies are identical with those of a male position, she shall be paid the same salary as that prescribed for the male officer occupying the identical position.

9.—Female Officers—Clerk/Typists, Typists, Machinists, etc.

(a) The rates of pay for female Clerk/Typists, Typists, Machinists, etc. who occupy positions classified in the automatic range shall be as follows:—

(b) Classes and grades beyond a salary of \$2,177 per annum shall be those set out in Schedule (C) to this Agreement.

(c) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

(d) An officer classified in the automatic range shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum.

Provided that—

- (i) in the case of a typist or clerk/typist she passes an efficiency examination approved by the Commissioner in shorthand writing at a speed of 100 words per minute and typewriting at 50 words per minute;
- (ii) in the case of a machinist she passes an examination approved by the Commissioner in typewriting at a speed of 35 words per minute and in the operation of accounting and listing machines; and
- (iii) such allowance shall cease on the promotion of the officer to a higher position or should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(e) An officer classified in the automatic range who has passed either of the examinations referred to in subclause (d) and has completed at least two years' continuous service on a salary of \$2,177 per annum exclusive of allowance, shall be paid an allowance of \$130 per annum, inclusive of the allowance under subclause (d). Thereafter the allowance shall be increased to—

- (i) \$190 per annum when the officer has been in receipt of the allowance of \$130 per annum for a period of 12 months; and to
- (ii) \$250 per annum on the completion of a further 12 months' service.

(f) The payment of an allowance in accordance with subclause (e) shall be subject to a certificate from the Permanent Head as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties and such allowance shall be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or shall cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(g) An officer classified in the automatic range who has not passed either of the examinations referred to in subclause (d) shall be paid—

- (i) an allowance of \$50 per annum on completion of five years' continuous service on a salary of \$2,177 per annum provided the Permanent Head certifies that the officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position or

should the officer refuse to accept promotion; and

- (ii) an allowance of \$60 per annum on completion of not less than 20 years of continuous permanent service, provided the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer.

10.—Female Officers—Telephonists and Assistants.

(a) The rates of pay for female Telephonists and Assistants shall be as follows:—

(b) An officer who is over the age of twenty-one (21) years on appointment may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

(c) An officer who has completed not less than twenty (20) years of continuous permanent service shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum provided the Commissioner certifies as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer.

(d) A female Telephonist or Assistant who passes an examination in typewriting at 40 words per minute as approved by the Commissioner shall be paid an allowance of \$40 per annum.

11.—Marginal Allowance.

All officers covered by this Agreement shall be paid marginal allowances similar to those applying to officers under the Public Service Act, 1904-1963.

12.—Variations of Salary Rates.

The various salary rates expressed herein shall be automatically varied to conform to any variations which are made from time to time in the equivalent salary rates applying to officers under the Public Service Act, 1904-1963. Any such variations shall apply from the date that the variations have been effected in respect to officers employed under the Public Service Act, 1904-1963.

13.—Annual Increments.

Subject to good conduct, efficiency and diligence, officers shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of their respective classes by annual increments.

14.—Conditions of Service.

Except as otherwise provided herein, the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904-1963, and the regulations made thereunder, and the provisions of the Public Service Allowances Agreement and subsequent amendments thereto, shall apply to officers bound by this Agreement.

15.—Qualifications Allowance—Male Officers.

- (a) Diplomates: A male adult clerk who holds—
the diploma in Commerce of the University of Western Australia; or
the diplomas in Public Administration, Accountancy or Management studies of the Technical Education Division of the Education Department;
or passes the final examinations in all subjects in the syllabus of—
an Institute of Accountants, Secretaries or Cost Accountants approved by the Commissioner; or
The Commonwealth Institute of Valuers; or
The Australian Insurance Institute;

or passes—

in five (5) units (including English I) of a degree course in Arts, Science, Economics or Law at the University of Western Australia; or

the examination in Law prescribed under Section 25 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1963;

or holds or passes—

a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid,

and who is in receipt of a salary which is expressed in column (a) of Schedule (F) to this Agreement, shall be paid qualifications allowance at the rate expressed in column (b) of that Schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's salary.

(b) Graduates and Associates: A male adult clerk who holds—

a degree in Arts, Science, Economics or Law of the University of Western Australia; or

an Associateship in Commerce, Management, Accounting, Business Administration or Public Administration of the Technical Education Division of the Education Department; or

who holds or passes—

a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid,

and who is in receipt of a salary which is expressed in column (a) of Schedule (F) to this Agreement, shall be paid qualifications allowance at the rate expressed in column (c) of that schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's salary.

(c) Payment of an allowance under the provisions of this clause shall cease as a result of the officer becoming entitled to a salary for which no qualifications allowance is provided.

16.—Classification of Officers and Rights of Appeal.

(a) The classification of officers and the fixing of salaries of officers shall be vested in the Commissioner subject to the right of appeal as provided in subsections (c), (d) and (e) of this clause.

(b) The Commissioner shall re-classify officers covered by this Agreement as from the same date as the general reclassification of officers employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904-1963, is effected by the Public Service Commissioner.

(c) An Appeal Board consisting of a Magistrate as Chairman, and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties to this Agreement, shall be set up, as may be required from time to time, to hear and determine any appeal by an officer employed by the Commissioner against a decision of the Commissioner in respect to—

- (i) the title, classification, reclassification or salary of such officer employed by the Commissioner;
- (ii) disciplinary action resulting in the imposition of a fine, reduction to a lower class or grade, or dismissal from the Department;
- (iii) the interpretation or application of the provisions of this Agreement.

(d) The times within which written notice of appeal shall be lodged with the Commissioner shall be as follows:—

- (i) in the case of an appeal in respect of title, classification or reclassification, one (1) month after the publication of such title, classification or reclassification.
- (ii) in the case of an appeal against any other matter, one (1) month after the occurrence of the matter aforesaid.

(e) The decision of the Appeal Board shall be final and binding on all parties.

17.—Fundamental Basis for Determination of Rates of Pay.

The fundamental basis for the determination of the rates of pay expressed in this Agreement is the rate payable under the provisions of subclause (a) of clause 5 to a male clerical division officer at the age of 26 years or during the sixth year of adult service.

18.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate as from the 7th day of January, 1966, and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years from that date, provided that either of the parties may, after the 6th day of January, 1967, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement, or approach the Court for an amendment of this Agreement.
