# PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas
TO WIT,
DOUGLAS ANTHONY
KENDREW,
Governor.
IL.S.] Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and
Saint George, Companion of the Most HonourMost Excellent Order of the British Empire,
Companion of the Distinguished Service Order,
Governor In and over the State of Western
Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section eight of the Prisons Act, 1903-1963, inter alia, that the Governor may, by proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare any police station or lock up to be a police declare any police station or lock up to be a police gaol and may in like manner discontinue and close any such police gaol; and whereas by a proclamation made the 17th of May, 1922, and published in the Government Gazette on the 19th May, 1922, the Governor did, inter alia, direct the Gaol at Albany to be a Police Gaol within the meaning of the Prisons Act, 1903-1918; and whereas it is now desirable to discontinue and close the Police Gaol at Albany. Now therefore close the Police Gaol at Albany: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Police Gaol at Albany situated at the Police Station, Albany, be discontinued and closed as from the date of the publication of this proclamation in the Government Gazette.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN !!!

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth on this 5th day of October, 1966, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:-

> Local Government Act, 1960. Shire of Kondinin. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 475/63.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 614 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that where in accordance with subsection (1) of that section a council has determined and included a different amount in the general rate to be imposed under section 548 of that Act, the Governor may, notwithstanding that subsection, by order direct (inter alia) that the council may be relieved from the obligation to determine and include the different amount in the general rate; and whereas the Council of the Shire of Kondinin did impose differential rating in respect of a loan raised by it for the purpose of providing works and undertakings in the Kondinin Townsite and the East, West, Karlgarin and Hyden Wards, within its district, and it is now deemed expedient that the council be relieved from the obligation to differentiate in rating in respect of that loan; Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and acting in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (3) of section 614 of the said Act, doth hereby direct that the Council of the Shire of Kondinin be relieved from the obligation to determine and include a different amount in the general rate in respect of Loan No. 46 raised for the purpose of providing works and undertakings in the Kondinin Townsite and the East, West, Karlgarin and Hyden Wards within its district.
