Land Act, 1933-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 4671/65.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27918 (Avon Locations 24364 and 23247), should vest in and be held by the Minister for Water Supply, in trust for the purpose of "Water Supply (Country Water Supplies)": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Water Supply, in trust for "Water Supply (Country Water Supplies)", with power to the said Minister for Water Supply to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1964, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 28th day of October, 1964, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown Lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now,

therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown Land as State Forest No. 52 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

Extension of Country Water Area.

Extension of Manjimup Country Water Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the southern alignment of Road Number 4923 with the eastern alignment

of Road Number 9158, a point on the present boundary of the Manjimup Country Water Area and extending generally southerly along the last-mentioned alignment to a line parallel to and 5 chains southerly from the southern side of Road Number 4923 aforesaid; thence generally south-westerly along that line to the eastern boundary of Nelson location 5177; thence northerly along that boundary and onwards to the southern boundary of location 5178; thence generally south-westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location and northerly along the eastern boundary of location 5828 to its northeastern corner; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that location and onwards 20 chains; thence 358 degrees 120 chains; thence 314 degrees 30 minutes to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of the southern severance of location 11925: thence northerly along that prolongation to a southern boundary of location 11926; thence generally east-southeasterly along that boundary and the southern boundaries of locations 6277 and 8980 and onwards to the northernmost north-western corner of location 9769; thence north-easterly and southeasterly along boundaries of that location to the northeastern boundary of location 9767; thence southeasterly along that boundary and southeasterly and southwesterly along the northeastern and southeastern boundaries of location 9766 to the northern corner of location 9762; thence southeasterly and generally southerly along boundaries of that location and generally southerly along the eastern boundaries of locations 9763, 9764, 9765 and 5826 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 9780; thence easterly to and along that boundary to the northwestern corner of location 5824; thence southerly along the western boundaries of that location and location 5822 to a line parallel to and 5 chains northerly from the northern side of Road Number 4923 aforesaid; thence generally north-easterly along that line to the southern side of Walker Street, a point on the present boundary of the Manjimup Country Water Area aforesaid and thence generally easterly along that present boundary to the starting point, as shown red on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 43224, Drawing 1, Sheet 1.

- (5) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained, or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and such bulldozing, chaining and preparing of the bush is completed after the 15th day of November, 1966, you shall, within 28 days of completing the bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 1 chain wide in the following positions on that land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated—
 - (a) immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
 - (b) in such positions as would divide the land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, all owners or occupiers of land in the Shire of Cunderdin are required to observe the following requirements pertaining to the provision of firebreaks in each and every year:—

- (1) A firebreak as prescribed hereunder shall be provided completely surrounding areas of land comprising of not more than 400 acres.
- (2) Such firebreaks as defined shall be completed on or before the 15th October of each year.

Definition of "Firebreak": For the purpose of the above regulation, a firebreak shall be deemed to be a strip of land, not less than eight feet in width, clear and kept clear until the 15th April, 1967, of all inflammable materials by either ploughing, cultivating, burning, etc., so that such strip cannot carry fire.

For the purpose of this regulation, any made road cleared to a width of not less than 20 feet of all inflammable material will be accepted as a firebreak.

Where it is not considered practicable or advisable by reason of possible erosion or other effect to adhere in detail to the regulations, a variation of such may be applied for from the nearest fire control officer.

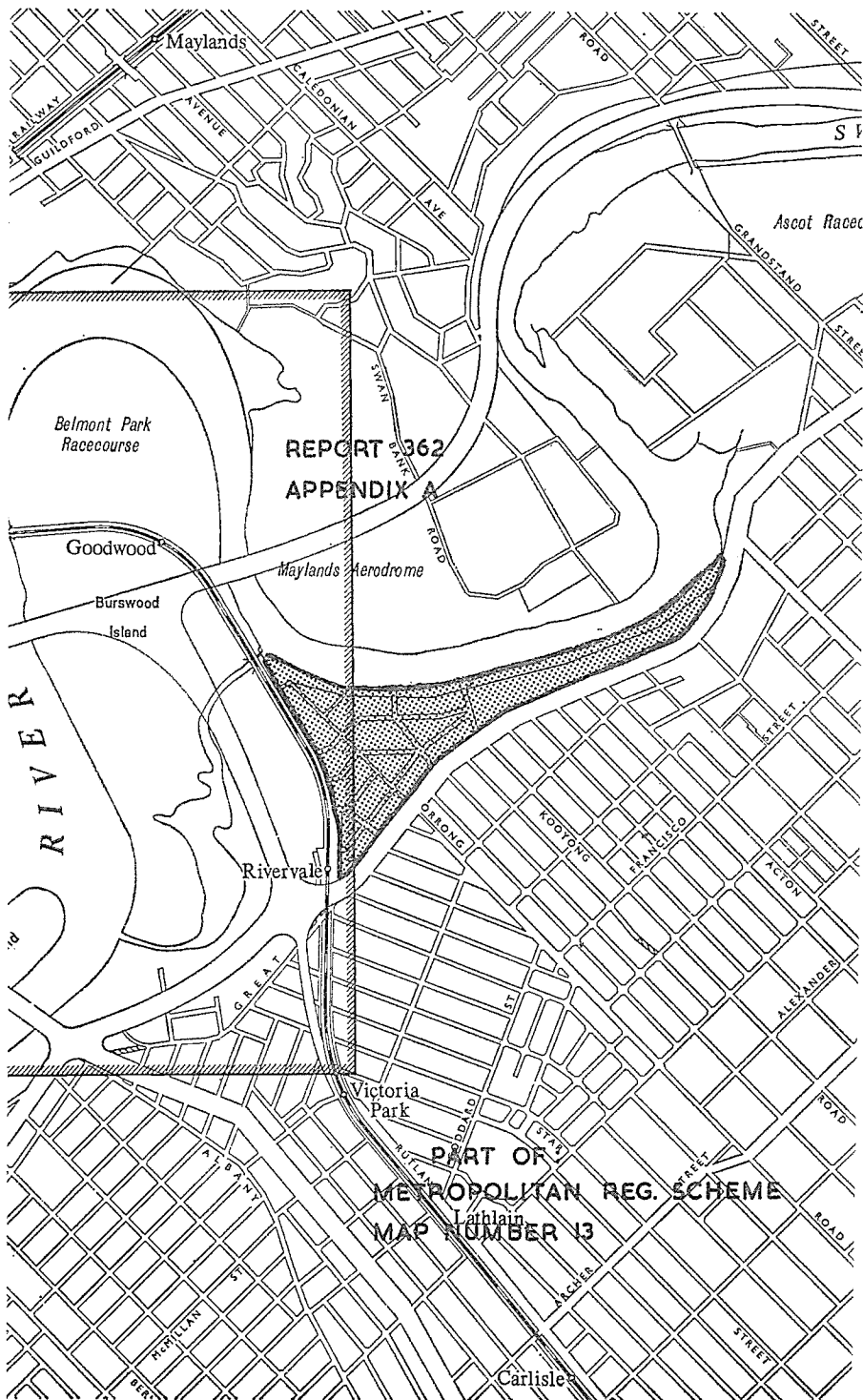

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the Shire of Kulin Interim Development Order, No. 1, made by the Minister for Town Planning, pursuant to the provisions of section 7B of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1965, and set out in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

Interim Development Order, No. 1.

1.—Application.

This order applies to that part of the Shire of Kulin constituted as the town of Kulin under the Land Act, 1933 (as amended).

2.—Administering Authority.

The authority responsible for administering this order is the Kulin Shire Council.

3.—Approval under this Order required for certain Development.

The carrying out of any development (other than permitted development as set out in paragraph 6 of this order) on land within the scope of this order is prohibited unless approval is first obtained in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 4 of this order in addition to any other permission or approval which may otherwise be required by law.

4.—Application for, and Grant of, Approval.

(a) No person shall carry out development (other than permitted development as set out in paragraph 6 of this order) on land within the scope of this order until he has applied for approval from the local authority and has received the written approval or conditional approval of the local authority in accordance with the provisions of the Act and this order.

(b) Application shall be made by or on behalf of the owner of the land and shall be accompanied by three copies of a plan or plans drawn to scale illustrating the proposed development and its location and indicating the type and construction of any buildings or works proposed.

(c) The application shall be dealt with by the local authority in accordance with the terms of this order and the approval, conditional approval, or refusal of the local authority shall be issued to the applicant together with one copy of the plan or plans.

5.—Development by Public Authority.

(a) Any public authority intending to carry out development (other than permitted development) within the area covered by this order is required to consult the local authority in writing and to supply such information as may be necessary to explain the proposal.

(b) The development shall not be commenced until the local authority advise the public authority either that the development is in conformity with the proposed town planning scheme or can be co-ordinated with it; but before so advising the local authority may require modification to the development.

(c) In the event of the modification not being acceptable to the public authority, the development shall not be commenced but the matter shall be referred to the Minister for determination by the Governor as provided by subsection (9) of section 7B of the Act.

6.—Permitted Development.

The following classes of development do not require approval under this order and are subject only to local authority by-laws and other provisions of law:—

- (i) Development by public authorities and local authorities for the purpose of their undertaking or functions on land owned by them at the time of coming into operation of this order.
- (ii) Construction, reconstruction, repair and maintenance of roads, railways, pipe lines, service mains, sewerage and drainage lines by public and local authorities on any public roadway or reserve or on any reserve or easement established for the purpose.
- (iii) Extensions of or alterations, renovating or maintenance to existing buildings within the curtilage of the land on which such buildings stand provided that the floor space of any such buildings or group of buildings is not increased without prior consent of the Kulin Shire Council.

7.—Existing Use.

No provision in this order shall prevent the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which the land or building was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into operation of this order or shall prevent the carrying out of any development for which immediately prior to the coming into operation of this order, a permit or permits, if any, required under this or any other Act authorising the development to be carried out had been obtained and was current.

8.—Appeals.

(a) In the event of a person being aggrieved by the refusal of approval or by the conditions subject to which approval is granted in respect of an application for permission to carry out development under this order, he may appeal to the Minister against the decision. The appeal must be lodged in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraph (c) of this paragraph within sixty days after the refusal or conditional approval is served on him.

(b) Where the local authority fails to grant approval to an application for permission to carry out development within a period of sixty days after receipt of the application by the local authority, the failure shall be regarded as a refusal of approval and a person aggrieved by such refusal may appeal to the Minister against the refusal. The appeal must be lodged in accordance with the provisions of subparagraph (c) of this paragraph within sixty days after the expiration of a period of sixty days from the receipt of the application by the local authority.

(c) Every appeal shall be in writing, shall state the grounds on which the appeal is made, and must be lodged within the prescribed time at the office of the Minister.

- (b) That, subject as therein stated, the Kulin Shire Council is the authority responsible for its administration.
- (c) That the carrying out of certain development on land within the scope of the order without approval as stated therein is prohibited.

- (d) Relating to the application for, and grant of approval for, development other than development permitted by the order.
- (e) Relating to development by a public authority.
- (f) Relating to certain development permitted by this order.
- (g) Relating to the continuance of the lawful use of land and buildings.
- (h) Relating to appeals against refusal of approval for development or against conditions subject to which approval to carry out development is granted.

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development by zoning;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

Part I.—Preliminary.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Irwin Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps in the Appendices hereto.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Irwin.

1.4 In the Scheme the planning area is divided into reserves and zones.

The basic types of reserves are:—

- Public Open Space.
- Public Purposes.
- Communications.
- Special.
- Commonwealth.

The basic types of zones are:—

- Residential.
- Commercial.
- Industrial.
- Rural.

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme is divided into the following Parts and Appendices:—

- Part I: Preliminary.
- Part II: Reserved Land.
- Part III: Zones.
- Part IV: Non-conforming Uses.
- Part V: Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are appended as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2".
- (2) Planning Proposals Map marked "Map No. 3" or Approved Planning Scheme Map marked "Map No. 4" (as the case may be).

The Scheme Report is also appended.

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1963, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

Part II.—Reserved Land.

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the approved Planning Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Responsible Authority.

(c) In giving its approval the Responsible Authority shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.2 (a) Where a Responsible Authority refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Any claim for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Responsible Authority not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Responsible Authority refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Responsible Authority may purchase the land affected by the decision of the Responsible Authority at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions.

(b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

Part III.—Zones.

3.1 Table No. 1 appended to clause 3.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

3.2 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

"P" = A use that is permitted as of right under the provisions of this Scheme.

"AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Responsible Authority.

"IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Responsible Authority.

"X" = A use that is not permitted.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Responsible Authority has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

(a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

(b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

Part V.—Finance and Administration.

5.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

5.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purposes of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

5.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

5.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

Part IV.—Non-Conforming

Use of Land.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

(a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
