WHEREAS by the Election of Senators Act, 1903, it is provided that the Governor may by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* not less than seven days before the issue of the writ for any election of Senators for the State of Western Australia, fix the places at which such election shall be held, and the dates for the nomination, the polling, and the declaration of the poll and return of the writ; and whereas Monday the 31st day of October, 1966, has been fixed as the date for the issue of a writ for the election of Senators aforesaid: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix Monday, the 7th day of November, 1966, at 12 o'clock noon, as the day and time before which nominations for the said election are to be made, and Saturday, the 26th day of November, 1966, as the date for the polling at the said election, and on or before Thursday, the 26th day of January, 1967, as the date for the return of the writ; and do hereby fix the Office of the Commonwealth Electoral Officer at 55 William Street, Perth, as the place of nomination for the said election, and the polling places within the said State appointed under the law of the Commonwealth for the time being in force for the

regulation of Parliamentary elections as the places at which such election shall be held.

Suspension of Prohibited Burning Times.

Minister administering the Bush Fires Act has suspended from the 9th January, 1967, to the 31st January, 1967, both dates inclusive, the operation of all declarations prohibiting the burning of bush in the Shire of Esperance so far as the declarations relate to the burning of stubble. - (1) The area of land on which stubble is to be burnt shall be surrounded by a firebreak completely cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least 10 feet or such greater width as is specified in the permit to burn referred to in (3) hereunder.
- (2) He shall before lighting the fire deliver, or cause to be delivered to the occupiers of all land adjoining the land upon any part of which stubble is proposed to be burnt, notice of his intention to burn.
- (3) A special permit to burn stubble shall be obtained from the Local Authority or from a bush fire control officer who is authorised by the Local Authority to issue permits for the burning of stubble during the suspension.
- (4) The burning of an area of stubble shall be carried out at a time between 11 a.m. and midnight of the same day and shall not be commenced earlier than the time specified in the permit.
- (5) An authorised bush fire control officer, at the direction of the Local Authority, shall specify in the permit to burn stubble a stated time between 11 a.m. and midnight of the same day before which stated time burning shall not be commenced.
- (6) The Local Authority or duly authorised bush fire control officer may refuse to issue a permit or may grant a permit subject to such conditions or requisitions as he considers necessary and specifies in the permit. - (7) The area to be burned on any one day under any one permit shall not exceed the area specified by the issuing officer of the permit to burn contained in accordance with paragraph 3.
- (8) A person shall not carry out the burning of an area of stubble under the authority of a permit to burn on a Sunday or on any day on which that burning is not authorised by the permit.
- (9) The owner or occupier of the land on which an area is to be burnt shall himself arrange for and provide at least four men to be constantly in attendance at the fire from the time it is lit until it is completely extinguished to assist in keeping the fire

under control and to prevent it from spreading beyond the area proposed to be burnt.

Shire of Beverley
Town Planning Scheme No. 1.

THE Beverley Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928

(as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development by zoning;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

Part I.—Preliminary.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Beverley Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps in the Appendices hereto.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Beverley.

1.4 In the Scheme the planning area is divided into reserves and zones.

The basic types of reserves are:—

- Public Open Space.
- Public Purposes.
- Communications.
- Special.
- Commonwealth.

The basic types of zones are:—

- Residential.
- Commercial.
- Industrial.
- Rural.

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme is divided into the following Parts and Appendices:—

- Part I: Preliminary.
- Part II: Reserved Land.
- Part III: Zones.
- Part IV: Non-conforming Uses.
- Part V: Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are appended as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2".
- (2) Planning Proposals Map marked "Map No. 3" or Approved Planning Scheme Map marked "Map No. 4" (as the case may be).

The Scheme Report is also appended.

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1963, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

Part II.—Reserved Land.

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the approved Planning Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Responsible Authority.

(c) In giving its approval the Responsible Authority shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.2 (a) Where a Responsible Authority refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Any claim for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Responsible Authority not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Responsible Authority refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Responsible Authority may purchase the land affected by the decision of the Responsible Authority at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions.

Part III.—Zones.

3.1 Table No. 1 appended to clause 3.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

3.2 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

"P" = A use that is permitted as of right under the provisions of this Scheme.

"AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Responsible Authority.

"IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Responsible Authority.

"X" = A use that is not permitted.

Note.—Where a special zone is restricted to one use only it may be excluded from the columns in Table No. 1 and its use determined from the Map.

Part IV.—Non-Conforming Use of Land.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

(a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or

(b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1923 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Responsible Authority has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

(a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

(b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

Part V.—Finance and Administration.

5.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

5.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purposes of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

5.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

5.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.
