 By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 150 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1965, that such section applies only to such portion or portions of the State as the Governor may by Proclamation declare to be an area or areas to which the provisions of that section shall apply; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (4) of that section that the Governor may from time to time, and at any time by proclamation declare any portion or portions of the State to be an area or areas for the purpose of the said section and thereupon the provisions thereof shall apply to each area so proclaimed; and whereas it is enacted *inter alia* by subsection (5) of the said section that a proclamation made under this section may be cancelled by a subsequent proclamation; and whereas the Lieutenant-Governor, by a proclamation made the 24th June, 1964, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th June, 1964, did declare that on and after the 1st day of July, 1964, all that portion of the State that is not comprised within the South-West Division of the State as that Division is defined and described by and in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, shall be an area for the purposes of section 150 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1965; and whereas it is now deemed desirable that on and after the 1st day of November,

1966 such proclamation be cancelled and the provisions of section 150 of the last mentioned Act shall apply to the portions of the State hereinafter specified in this proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby declare that on and after the 1st day of November, 1966, the proclamation made on the 24th June, 1964, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th June, 1964, be cancelled, and that those portions of the State that are respectively comprised within—

- (a) each of the municipal districts of the towns of Kalgoorlie and Boulder;
 - (b) each of the municipal districts of the shires of Broome, Coolgardie, Dundas, Esperance, Halls Creek, Kalgoorlie, Laverton, Leonora, Menzies, West Kimberley, Wiluna and Wyndham-East Kimberley;
 - (c) so much of the municipal district of the shire of Marble Bar as is situate east of the route of No. 1 Rabbit Proof Fence; and
 - (d) so much of the municipal district of the shire of Nullagine as is situate east of the route of No. 1 Rabbit Proof Fence,
- shall be areas for the purposes of section 150 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1965.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section eight of the Prisons Act, 1903-1963, *inter alia*, that the Governor may, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare any police station or lock up to be a police gaol and may in like manner discontinue and close any such police gaol; and whereas by a proclamation made the 30th September, 1909 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th October, 1909 the Governor did, *inter alia*, direct the Lockup at York to be a Police Gaol within the meaning of the Prisons Act, 1903-1918; and whereas it is now desirable to discontinue and close the Police Gaol at York: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Police Gaol at York situated at the Police Station, York, be discontinued and closed as from the date of the publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

WHEREAS by section 31 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, the Governor may by proclamation and subject to such conditions as may be expressed therein, classify as of Class "A" any lands of the Crown reserved to Her Majesty for any of the purposes specified in the said Sections; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the addition to Reserve "A" 1790 (Plantagenet) "Recreation" comprising the land contained in the closed portion of road 3079 extending from the most western northwest corner

of Plantagenet Location 148, northward to and along the eastern boundary of location 81 to a surveyed road at the northeast corner of the latter location, should be classified as of Class "A": Now, therefore, I, the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation classify as of Class "A" the addition to Reserve "A" 1790 comprising the land contained in the closed portion of road 3079 extending from the most western northwest corner of Plantagenet Location 148, northward to and along the eastern boundary of location 81 to a surveyed road at the northeast corner of the latter location and increase the area of the said Reserve to 81 acres 0 roods 21 perches, accordingly. WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 9809/09.— That Class "A" Reserve No. 23172, should vest in and be held by the Shire of Waroona, in trust for the purpose of "Camping".

Corres. 71/64.— That Reserve No. 27552, should vest in and be held by The Western Australian Fire Brigades Board, in trust for the purpose of "Fire Station Site".

Corres. 2197/66.— That Reserve No. 28272 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kwinana in trust for the purpose of "Park and Playground".

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1964, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 28th day of October, 1964, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown land as State Forest No. 21 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

the powers contained in section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, doth hereby declare the Kukerin Water Supply (Excavated Tank and Catchment) on the land coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 42458 to be subject to the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1964 (being an Act mentioned in the Schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950) and to vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage.

Bunbury Water Board.

Proposed Loan of \$35,072.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 317/53.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1964, a Water Board may with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works for the storage, distribution and supply of water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1964, of the Bunbury Water Board borrowing the sum of thirty-five thousand and seventy-two dollars (\$35,072) from the Commonwealth Savings Bank, repayable with interest by thirty (30) half-yearly instalments over a period of fifteen (15) years, with interest at the rate of five dollars, seventy-five cents (\$5.75) per annum for the purpose of financing the works referred to as Bunbury Water Board Plan No. 137, and approved by Order in Council on the 5th October, 1966 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th October, 1966, subject to the said works being commenced not later than the first day of April, 1967.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1965, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas the Broken Hill Proprietary Company Limited, a company incorporated in the State of Victoria, having its registered office in the State of Western Australia at T. & G. Building, 37 St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond to the value of Ten

thousand dollars (\$10,000) charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The Broken Hill Proprietary Company Limited, from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1965, for a period expiring on the 31st day of August, 1968.

Milk Act, 1946-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (1) of section 9 of the Milk Act, 1946-1965, that the Governor may from time to time on the recommendation of the Minister by Order in Council divide any dairy area into districts, define the boundaries of a district, alter the boundaries of a district and subdivide any district into two or more districts; and whereas by an Order in Council dated from the 18th April, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th April, 1947, the Governor, did *inter alia*, divide the South Coastal Dairy Area, constituted and declared by that Order in Council, into the districts specified and defined in the Second Schedule thereto; and whereas the districts so specified and defined included (*inter alia*) the district now known as the Municipality of Bunbury District; and whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the Municipality of Bunbury District and subdivide that district as amended by such alteration of boundaries into several districts: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister, doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 9 of the said Act—

- (a) alter the boundaries of the Municipality of Bunbury District by substituting for the area of land comprising that portion of the State contained in the Municipality of Bunbury as specified in the Second Schedule to the Order in Council dated the 18th April, 1947, as defining that district, the areas of land defined and described in Schedule "A" to this Order in Council; and
- (b) subdivide the Municipality of Bunbury District as defined and described in Schedule "A" to this Order in Council, into the several districts specified and defined in Schedule "B" to this Order in Council

Schedule "A".

Alteration and Redescription of Municipality of Bunbury District.

(a) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the left bank of the Collie River with the eastern boundary of Leschenault Location 26 and extending southerly along that boundary to the northeastern corner of Collie Agricultural Area Lot 46; thence southerly and southeasterly along boundaries of that lot to its southeastern corner; thence southeasterly to the northern corner of part of Wellington Location 53 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 13627; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that part of Location 53 and onwards to the southern side of the South-Western Highway (Road No. 50); thence generally southeasterly along that side to the eastern boundary of location 53 aforesaid; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the northernmost northeastern corner of Leschenault Location 12; thence westerly and southerly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the south-

P.S.C. No. 3 of 1966.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of Part X of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1963, of Western Australia, this 21st day of October, 1966, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter referred to as the Association) of the one part and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Title.

The parties having by negotiation revised, altered and amended the Agreement (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1963) dated the 26th March, 1963, as amended by P.S.C. No. 2 of 1963, P.S.C. No. 1 of 1965 and P.S.C. No. 1 of 1966, insofar as it relates to officers employed in the General Division, hereby agree that this Agreement, to be known as the "Public Service (General Division) Salaries Agreement, 1966", (P.S.C. No. 3 of 1966), shall insofar as it relates to officers employed in the General Division and subject to clause 17 hereof supersede and replace the said Agreement (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1963).

3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers employed in the General Division under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904-1963, whose maximum margins over the basic rate are less than \$4,643 (£2,322) per annum. Provided that persons temporarily employed in the General Division shall be subject to the rates of pay referred to in clause 16 of this Agreement.

4.—Salary Rates—Interpretation.

(a) In this Agreement the term "basic rate" means in the case of—

(i) Male Officers—the result (to the nearest \$ (£)) obtained by multiplying the male basic wage, as determined from time to time by the Industrial Commission of Western Australia, by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th);

(ii) Female Officers— seventy-five per cent. (75%) to the nearest \$ (£) of the male basic rate as determined in paragraph (i) of this subclause.

(b) The basic rates as determined in accordance with subclause (a) of this clause are as follows:

(c) If, during the currency of this Agreement, the Western Australian Industrial Commission should prescribe a basic wage differing in amount from that prescribed as at the 25th January, 1966, and as shown as an annual equivalent in paragraph (b) above, then the margins (or percentages) in the case of officers not in receipt of margins) set out hereinafter in this Agreement shall be deemed to be decreased or increased as the case may be to the same extent that such basic wage (as expressed as an annual equivalent) is increased or decreased by the said Commission, so that, subject to the provisions of subclause (d) of this clause and clause 17 of this Agreement, the total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement shall remain constant.

(d) The total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement are based upon the Federal Basic Wage for Perth expressed as an annual equivalent of \$1,607 (\$803) (male officers). If during the currency of this Agreement the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission should prescribe a basic wage for Perth differing in amount from that prescribed and shown as an annual equivalent in this subclause, then the total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement shall be increased or decreased as the case may be to the same extent (or proportion thereof in the case of officers not in receipt of margins) that the Federal Basic Wage for Perth, as expressed as an annual equivalent, is increased or decreased.

Provided that the total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement shall not be increased in accordance with the provisions of this subclause until such time as the Federal Male Basic Wage for Perth as expressed as an annual equivalent, exceeds \$1,627 (£813) per annum, whereupon the total rates of pay shall be increased by the amount (or proportion thereof in the case of officers not in receipt of margins) by which such basic wage, expressed as an annual equivalent, exceeds \$1,627 (£813).

5.—Fundamental Basis.

The fundamental basis or principle upon which the classes set out in Schedules A and B of this Agreement have been determined, either alone or in relation to other classes, and the placement of offices within such classes, is in accordance with the nature of the duties and responsibilities of such offices. Insofar as the classes set out in clauses 6 (a), 7, 8, 9, 11, 12 and 13 of this Agreement are concerned, the fundamental basis or principle is in accordance with the nature of the duties and responsibilities together with age or period of employment.

6.—Male Officers—General Division.

Public Service (Professional Division) Salaries Agreement, 1966.

P.S.C. No. 4 of 1966.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of Part X of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-63, of Western Australia, this 21st day of October, 1966, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter referred to as the Association) of the one part, and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Title.

The parties having by negotiation revised, altered and amended the Agreement (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1963) dated the 26th day of March, 1963, as amended by P.S.C. No. 2 of 1963, P.S.C. No. 1 of 1965 and P.S.C. No. 1 of 1966, insofar as it relates to officers employed in the Professional Division, hereby agree that this Agreement, to be known as the "Public Service (Professional Division) Salaries Agreement, 1966" (P.S.C. No. 4 of 1966), shall, insofar as it relates to officers employed in the Professional Division and subject to clause 14 hereof, supersede and replace the said Agreement (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1963).

This Agreement shall apply to all officers employed in the Professional Division under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904-63, whose maximum margins over the basic rate are less than \$4,152 (£2,076) per annum: Provided that persons temporarily employed in the Professional Division shall be subject to the provisions of Clause 13 of this Agreement.

4.—Salary Rates—Interpretation.

(a) In this Agreement the term "basic rate" means in the case of:—

(i) Male Officers—the result (to the nearest \$ (£) obtained by multiplying the male basic wage, as determined from time to time by the Industrial Commission of Western Australia, by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th);

(ii) Female Officers—seventy-five per cent (75%) to the nearest \$ (£) of the male basic rate as determined in paragraph (i) of this subclause.

(b) The basic rates as determined in accordance with subclause (a) of this clause are as follows:—

(c) If, during the currency of this Agreement, the Western Australian Industrial Commission should prescribe a basic wage differing in amount from that prescribed as at the 25th January, 1966, and as shown as an annual equivalent in paragraph (b) above, then the margins (or percentages in the case of officers not in receipt of margins) set out hereinafter in this Agreement shall be deemed to be decreased or increased as the case may be to the same extent that such basic wage (as expressed as an annual equivalent) is increased or decreased by the said Commission, so that, subject to the provisions of subclause (d) of this clause and clause 13 of this Agreement, the total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement shall remain constant.

(d) The total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement are based upon the Federal Basic Wage for Perth expressed as an annual equivalent of \$1,607 (£803) (male officers). If during the currency of this Agreement the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission should prescribe a basic wage for Perth differing in amount from that prescribed and shown as an annual equivalent in this subclause, then the total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement shall be increased or decreased as the case may be to the same extent (or proportion thereof in the case of officers not in receipt of margins) that the Federal Basic Wage for Perth, as expressed as an annual equivalent, is increased or decreased.

Provided that the total rates of pay prescribed by this Agreement shall not be increased in accordance with the provisions of this subclause until such time as the Federal Male Basic Wage for Perth as expressed as an annual equivalent, exceeds \$1,626 (£813) per annum, whereupon the total rates of pay shall be increased by the amount (or proportion thereof in the case of officers not in receipt of margins) by which such basic wage, expressed as an annual equivalent, exceeds \$1,627 (£813).

5.—Male Officers—Classes and Grades.

(a) The classes and grades applicable to male officers in the Professional Division shall be as indicated in Schedule A to this Agreement.

(c) In making a classification under this clause the Commissioner may amalgamate any two or more classes.

(d) A female Professional Division officer who has obtained promotion to either Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 as set out in Schedule B to this Agreement, and who has completed not less than twenty (20) years of continuous permanent service, shall be paid an allowance of \$60 (£30) per annum, provided the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer, and provided further that an allowance under this subclause shall not apply to an officer classified in accordance with subclause (e) hereof.

(e) An adult female Professional Division officer who is paid in accordance with the rates prescribed in this clause, may apply to the Commissioner to be paid the same margin as that prescribed for a male officer occupying an identical position, on the grounds that—

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land Within the Shire of Boddington.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required on or before the 30th day of November, 1966, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1967.

1. In respect of land owned or occupied by you within any Townsite, you shall—
 - (a) where the area of land is one-half of one acre or less, remove all inflammable material creating a fire hazard on the land from the whole of the land; and
 - (b) where the area of the land exceeds one-half of one acre, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 8 feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land; and
 - (c) where a liquid or gas fuel depot or ramp is situated on any land within a townsite, you shall clear of all inflammable material an area immediately surrounding the depot or ramp and the radius of that area being not less than 20 feet.

2. In respect of land owned or occupied by you which is less than 10,000 acres and is not situated in a townsite, you shall—

- (a) clear firebreaks at least 8 feet wide along boundaries of your property which adjoin any trafficable road, burning of road side at least 8 feet wide will be accepted in lieu of ploughed breaks on the adjoining land; and
- (b) clear firebreaks at least 8 feet wide immediately around all land which is carrying established pasture or crop; and
- (c) clear of all inflammable material an area immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks and the radius of that area being not less than one chain; and
- (d) either spring burn or provide a 1 chain firebreak round all bush country.

3. In respect of land owned or occupied by you which exceeds 10,000 acres—

- (a) divide your property by firebreaks, not less than one chain wide, into sections not less than 10,000 acres and not greater than 15,000 acres; and
- (b) clear firebreaks at least 8 feet wide immediately around all land which is carrying established pasture or crop; and
- (c) clear of all inflammable material an area immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks and the radius of that area being not less than one chain.

The requirements of section 3 may be dispensed with provided the owner or occupier furnishes the Council with a plan, prior to 30th November, showing all the protective burning that has been carried out to that date.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from the land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of November, 1966, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

The penalty for failure to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 and not more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.
