- (d) Experience and training in Auditing an advantage. Progress in Accountancy studies will be regarded as an important factor when judging relative efficiency under section 34 of the Public Service Act.
- (e) Basic veterinary qualification registrable in Australia. Considerable graduate training required in veterinary pathology in the broadest sense including parasitology, biochemistry, microbiology and serology. Written proof of ability in research highly desirable.
- (f) Junior Certificate, Harbour and Light Department Certificate of Competency, Skipper Grade II or its equivalent; experience of fish and fisheries, good physique.
- (g) Junior Certificate including English and Maths. essential. Preference for Leaving Certificate or diploma of recognised agricultural college. Experience in handling livestock essential and some knowledge of port operation desirable. Willingness to work occasional off-duty hours at night or weekends.
- (h) Architectural Draftsman's Certificate, Perth Technical College, or approved equivalent, plus four years' practical drawing office experience.
- (i) Junior Certificate, including English and Mathematics A, essential, with science subjects desirable. Preference for Leaving Certificate.
- (j) Applicants must have passed the course in Hydrography with the Sydney Technical College, or, alternatively, have completed the first two years of a relevant University degree or its equivalent. Wide experience in Field Hydrographic work essential.

- (m) Graduate holding a bachelor's degree in Social Studies or a bachelor's degree with a Diploma of Social Studies of an Australian university or of a university of recognised equivalent standard.
- (n) Diplomat without graduate qualification but holding a Diploma of Social Studies of an Australian university or equivalent qualification.

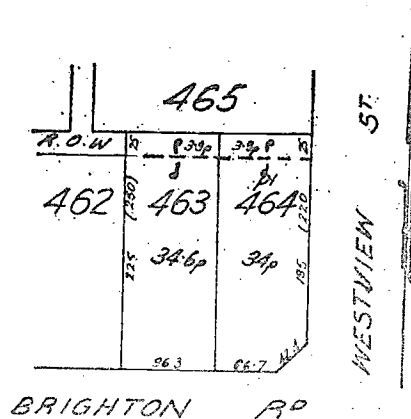
