Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 Redcliffe Extension

ORDER IN COUNCIL

M.W.B. 60803/65.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1965, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or of any District, or Metropolitan Main Drainage District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as at present defined should be extended: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby order and declare as follows:

That the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 be and are hereby extended by including therein the land described in the schedule hereto.

Schedule.


