SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1964.

Rule of Court.

(Sittings and Winter Vacation for 1967.)

WE, the Honourable Sir Albert Asher Wolff, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, the Honourable Sir Lawrence Jackson, Kt., Senior Puisne Judge, and the Honourable John Evenden Virtue, the Honourable Roy Vivian Nevile, the Honourable Gordon Bede D'Arcy, the Honourable John Hale, and the Honourable Oscar Joseph Negus, Puisne Judges, being the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1964, and the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, and of every other power enabling us in this behalf, hereby order as follows:—

1.—CIVIL SITTINGS.

The Civil Sittings of the Supreme Court for the trial of actions and issues of fact during the year 1967 shall be eleven in number and shall commence on the days hereunder mentioned, that is to say—

2.—FULL COURT.

The Sittings of the Full Court for the year 1967 shall be eight in number, and shall commence on the third Tuesday in the months of March, April, May, June, August, September, October and November.

The Full Court shall sit on such other days or at such other times as the Full Court may think fit to sit.

3.—CIRCUIT COURTS.

(a) Sittings of the Supreme Court in the respective circuit districts referred to in the table hereunder, for the transaction of all such business as may be brought before it, shall be held during the year 1967 at the places and commencing on the days shown in the said table.

Shire of Upper Gascoyne.

Alteration of Awards, Increase of Membership and Direction Concerning Election.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 832/65.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraphs (g) and (h) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, upon effectual presentation of a petition bearing the Common Seal of the Municipality, alter the boundaries of Wards existing in the district or create new wards in a district; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (j) of the said subsection that the Governor may, within the limits prescribed by this Act, determine and alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of subsection (4) that the Governor may give effect to an alteration in the number of members of a Council; and whereas it is further provided by subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act that where the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12 he may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected by the exercise of the power shall go out of office and may direct the holding, on a day appointed by the Order, of an election to elect members so affected; and whereas the municipality of the Shire of Upper Gascoyne has submitted a petition under its Common Seal praying for the division of the Central Ward into two Wards to be known as the Central Ward and Town Ward respectively and to increase the membership by one member; and also to describe the North West, East, South and North East Wards; and whereas it is considered expedient to grant the prayer of the petition: now,

therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (1) alter the boundaries of the existing Central Ward by the creation therefrom of a new Ward to be designated the Town Ward as described in the schedule hereto, leaving the remaining portion as the Central Ward, as described in the Schedule hereto; and to describe in the Schedule hereto the boundaries of the North West, East, South and North East Wards.
- (2) alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to the municipality from 5 to 6 and determine that the additional member shall be allocated to the Town Ward;
- (3) direct that on the 27th day of May, 1967 the member now holding office for the Central Ward shall retire from office and an election shall be held on that day to elect one member for the Central Ward and one member for the Town Ward;
- (4) further direct that the member now holding office for the Central Ward shall continue to represent that Ward and also the new Town Ward until an election is held on the 27th day of May, 1967.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the northernmost northwestern corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/711, a point on the present boundary on the Shire of Upper Gascoyne and extending generally south easterly along boundaries of the Central Ward and the East Ward to the present boundary of the Shire of Upper Gascoyne aforesaid and thence generally westerly and generally northerly along that boundary to the starting point. Northeast Ward.

- (1) alter the boundaries of the existing Koorda Ward by the creation therefrom of a new Ward to be designated the Town Ward as described in the Schedule hereto, leaving the remaining portion as the Koorda Ward, as described in the Schedule hereto;
- (2) alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to the municipality from 7 to 8 and determine that the additional member shall be allocated to the Town Ward;
- (3) direct that on the 27th day of May, 1967, the member now holding office for the Koorda Ward shall retire from office and an election shall be held on that day to elect one member for the Koorda Ward and one member for the Town Ward;
- (4) further direct that the member now holding office for the Koorda Ward shall continue to represent the Ward and also the new Town Ward until the election is held on the 27th day of May, 1967.
