WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1950, by which the appointment of all Public Officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council, are vested in heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the minor appointments of persons who are exempt from the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904, employed by the Department of Lands and Surveys should be vested in Joseph Richard Waldron (Sub-Accountant): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Council, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the power of making such minor appointments shall vest, and the same is hereby vested in Joseph Richard Waldron accordingly.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1966, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas CSEP & Farmers Ltd, a company having its registered office at 133 St George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond to the value of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt CSBP & Farmers Ltd from the operation Act, 1912-1966, for a period expiring on the 30th day of June, 1968.
