### PROCLAMATION

IL.S.J WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honour-able Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Com-monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 18 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, that the Governor may, by proclamation, declare any part Governor may, by proclamation, declare any part of the State lying north of the twenty-sixth parallel of South Latitude, named or defined in the pro-clamation to be a proclaimed area for the purposes of section 18 of the said Act; and whereas any proclamation previously issued under the authority of this section may be varied or cancelled: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that the proclamation issued on 24th April, 1963, under the authority of the said section declaring that part of the State lying north of the twenty-sixth parallel of South Lati-tude and described in the Schedule thereto and shown marked and defined on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 40192 as kept in the Public Works Department, is hearby upride as described in the schedules hourds hereby varied as described in the schedules hereto.

# Child Welfare Act, 1947-1965. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

# Traffic Act, 1919-1966. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

# Land Act, 1933-1965.

# ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any and reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the conditions that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 1250/65.—That Reserve No. 28409 (Rockingham Lot 1241) should, subject as afore-said be granted in fee simple to the Western Aus-tralian Fire Brigades Board, to be held in trust for the purpose of a "Fire Station Site".

Corres. 1848/64.—That Reserve No. 28453 (Wyndham Lot 1265) should, subject as aforesaid he granted in fee simple to the Royal Flying Doctor Service of Australia, to be held in trust for the purpose of a "Radio Receiving Station Site".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforemen-tioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid bodies, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.
