partnership or the individual members thereof unless it is incorporated under that Act or is formed in pursuance of some other Act or letters patent; and whereas it is further provided by subsection (4) of section 14 of the Companies Act, 1961-1966 that where the association or partnership to be formed is for the purpose of carrying on any profession or calling declared by proclamation to be a profession or calling that is not customarily coursid on in the Company of carried on in the Commonwealth by a corporacarried on in the Commonwealth by a corporation, subsection (3) of that section shall apply to that association or calling as though the word "twenty" therein were the word, "fifty": Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby declare the profession or calling of accountant to be a profession or calling that is not customarily carried on in the Commonwealth by a corporation.

WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 186 of the Health Act, 1911-1966, that the Governor may by proclamation declare that any process or class of trade within any trade that is an offensive trade for the purposes of Division 2 of Part VII of that Act, is a process or class of trade to which the provisions of that Division, other than section 194, do not apply; and whereas the trade usually carried on in laundries is an offensive trade for the purposes of that Division: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the trade usually carried on in establishments, commonly known as laundromats, in which-

- (a) laundering is carried out by members of the public using, on payment of a fee, machines and equipment provided by the owners or occupiers of those establishments;
- (b) laundering is not carried out by those owners or occupiers for or on behalf of other persons; and
- (c) provision is made for the discharge of all liquid waste therefrom into a public sewer,

is a class of trade within the class of trade usually carried on in laundries to which the provisions of Division 2 of Part VII of the Health Act, 1911-1966, other than section 194, do not apply.

I, JAMES FREDERICK CRAIG, being the Minister for the time being charged with the administration of the Traffic Act, 1919-1966, acting pursuant to regulation 1101 of the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, do by this general authority, authorise the movement of overwidth agricultural implements on roads, subject to their being towed by licensed vehicles and subject to the further following conditions, namely-

(a) the movement may be made by virtue of

this authority, alone,

(i) where the width of the towed implement exceeds 8 ft. but not 10 ft., if a warning flag is affixed at each lateral extremity of the implement; and

- (ii) where the width of the towed implement exceeds 10 ft. but not 16 ft., if a warning flag is affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement and a warning sign indicating that the tow is overwidth is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement;
- (b) the movement may be made by virtue of a permit which the local authority is hereby authorised to issue, where the width of the towed implement exceeds 16 ft. but not 22 ft., if a warning flag is affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement, a warning sign indicating that the tow is overwidth is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement and the tow is preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it and is followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle is ahead of it;
- (c) where the width of the implement exceeds 10 ft. it is not to be towed within 15 miles of the General Post Office, Perth;
- (d) the movement of the tow is not to take place during the hours of darkness and parking of the tow on the made portion of the road is prohibited at all times; and
- (e) overwidth signs are to be removed or covered immediately on completion of movement.
- 2. A permit referred to in this authority shall be in accordance with regulation 12 of the Traffic (Licensing Authorities) Regulations, 1965, and may be issued in respect of a single movement or in respect of a number of movements within a period not exceeding three months.
- 3. The movement of agricultural implements exceeding 22 ft. in width may be made pursuant to specific Ministerial authority in each case, and not otherwise.
- 4. This notice shall be read in conjunction with the Ministerial Direction published contemporaneously in the Gazette.

I, JAMES FREDERICK CRAIG, being the Minister for the time being charged with the administration of the Traffic Act, 1919-1966, acting pursuant to regulation 9 of the Traffic (Licensing Authorities) Regulations, 1965, do by this general authority authorise every licensing authority to issue licenses, as of Class B, within the meaning of that regulation, for any vehicle that is owned by a person engaged in the business of farming or grazing and that is fitted, or adapted, for the purpose of fire fighting or fire prevention, if the use of the vehicle, on a road, is limited to those purposes, and to that of its repair at the nearest practicable place, without the payment of a licence fee, but subject to such other charges as are prescribed by law.

Licensing Authorities shall issue number plates in accordance with paragraph (b) of subregulation (5) of Regulation 24 of the above regulations, for any vehicle licensed pursuant to this authority.

- I, JAMES FREDERICK CRAIG, being the Minister charged with the administration of the Traffic Act, 1919-1966, in exercise of the powers conferred by that Act and the above cited regulations, hereby direct as follows:—
- 1. Licensing authorities may license a motor vehicle as of Class B, where the vehicle—
 - (a) is not equipped with lights in conformity with the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, conditioned upon the vehicle not being used during the hours of darkness;
 - (b) is a tractor or self-propelled agricultural implement not exceeding 22 ft. in width of which the use is limited to agricultural or horticultural pursuits and is limited to such areas as the licensing authority may direct, subject to the following conditions, namely—
 - (i) where the width of the vehicle exceeds 8 ft. but not 10 ft.—a warning flag is to be affixed at each lateral extremity;
 - (ii) where the width of the vehicle exceeds 10 ft. but not 16 ft.—a warning flag is to be affixed to each lateral extremity and a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overwidth is to be affixed to the front and to the rear of the vehicle:
 - (iii) where the width of the vehicle exceeds 16 ft. but not 22 ft.—a warning flag is to be affixed to each lateral extremity, a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overwidth is to be affixed to the front and to the rear of the vehicle and the vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it and be followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle is ahead of it; and
 - (iv) where the vehicle is such as is mentioned in subparagraphs (ii) and (iii), of this paragraph, the vehicle is not to be driven within 15 miles of the General Post Office, Perth.

- and, in any event, the vehicle is not to be used during the hours of darkness;
- (c) is a tractor, other than such as is mentioned in paragraph (b) of this clause, not exceeding in height the maximum prescribed by the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, and not exceeding 10 ft. in width or 40 ft. in length, subject to the following conditions, namely—
 - (i) where the length of the vehicle exceeds 31 ft. but not 40 ft. or its width exceeds 8 ft. but not 10 ft—a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overlength, overwidth or both, as the case may be, is to be affixed to the front and rear of the vehicle; and
 - (ii) where the vehicle is a mobile crane falling within the dimensions mentioned in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph—a flag is to be attached to the hook which is to be secured,

and, in any event, the vehicle is not to be used during the hours of darkness; or

- (d) is a tractor plant, other than a mobile crane or tracked vehicle, that exceeds the requirements of the Traffic (Vehicle Weights) Regulations, 1963, if—
 - (i) the tyre-axle loadings and tyre inflation pressures, irrespective of the number of tyres per axle, do not exceed those set out in the Table hereunder—

- (ii) the transverse distance (track) between the centres of the two tyres are not less than four (4) feet;
- (iii) the longitudinal distance between the centres of any two axles is not less than four (4) feet;
- (iv) where the longitudinal distance between the centres of extreme axles of a group of two or more consecutive axles is less than 8 ft., the total load carried by those axles does not exceed 13 tons, and the load of any single axle of the group does not exceed the requirements of the above Table; and
- (v) the vehicle travels in an unladen state, at all times, except when operating within the confines of a road construction job as defined by the Road Construction Authority concerned, and as directed by it.
- 2. Motor vehicles of dimensions, weights and axle loadings greater than those mentioned in clause (1) of this direction may be licensed as of class C, with specific Ministerial approval only.
- 3. Licensing authorities may, subject to the Traffic (Vehicle Weights) Regulations, 1963, issue permits for the carrying of indivisible loads that will occasion any or all of the dimensions of a

vehicle, to exceed those, or that project for a greater distance than that prescribed by the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, where-

- (a) the overall length of vehicle and load does not exceed 70 ft. or the overall width does not exceed 10 ft., subject to the following conditions, namely-
 - (i) the transporting vehicle is to have a sign indicating that the vehicle is overwidth, overlength, overheight or any combination of those things, as the case may require, affixed to the front and rear;
 - (ii) flags are to be placed at the points of greatest extension of the load or of the vehicle and load;
 - (iii) the vehicle is not to travel during the hours of darkness;
 - (iv) the signs provided by this paragraph are to be removed or covered when the movement of the load has been completed;
 - (v) the permit is to be carried on the transporting vehicle; and
 - (vi) the permit is liable to immediate cancellation on the infringement of any condition to which its issue is subject;
- (b) the width exceeds 10 ft. but not 14 ft., subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (a) of this clause and, further, subject to the following conditions, namely-
 - (i) the transporting vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it; and
 - (ii) the headlights of the transporting vehicle and the pilot vehicle are to be kept burning, until the movement of the load is completed; and
- (c) the height exceeds 14 ft. but not 16 ft., subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (a) of this clause and, further, subject to the following conditions, namely-
 - (i) the transporting vehicle is to be escorted by a member of the Police Force or a traffic inspector;
 - (ii) the movement is made in conformity with the requirements of the State Electricity Commission; and
 - (iii) approval for the movement of the load is to be obtained from the Postmaster General's Department of the Commonwealth.
- 4. Permits shall not be issued for the carrying of loads that exceed the maximum dimensions, or that project for a greater distance than that, mentioned in clause (3) of this direction, without specific Ministerial approval, in each case.
- (5) A limitation imposed by this direction does not affect the power of a licensing authority to impose additional limitations relating to time, place or circumstance.
 - 6. In this direction, a reference to-
 - (a) a warning flag is a reference to a red flag of not less than 18 in. square; and
 - (b) to a warning sign is a reference to a sign bearing the words "OVERWIDTH", "OVERLENGTH", "OVERHEIGHT" or any combination of those words, as the case may require, in black lettering, 8 in. in height, on a yellow ground.
 - 7. The authority of the Minister given
 - (a) pursuant to section 46A of the Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 15th August, 1958; and
 - (b) pursuant to regulation 9 of the Traffic (Licensing Authorities) Regulations, 1965, and published in the Government Gazette on the 9th September, 1966,

is rescinded.
