WHEREAS by section 109 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, the Governor may resume, for any purpose as in the public interest he may think fit any portion of land held as a Pastoral Lease; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Pastoral Lease 394/855 as described in the schedule hereto should be resumed for "Museum—Meteorite Crater". Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portion of Pastoral Lease 394/855 for the purpose aforesaid. (Public Plan 54/300.)

### Schedule.

All that portion of land containing 640 acres having the Dalgara Meteorite Crater as its centre and being bounded by lines starting from a point situate about 280 chains west from and about 110 chains south from the northernmost north-eastern corner of pastoral Lease 394/855 (Dalgara Station) and extending east 80 chains; thence south 80 chains; thence west 80 chains and thence north 80 chains to the starting point.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 26 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1965, that where in the opinion of the Minister, it is desirable that any plant should be burnt, during prohibited burning times in order to eradicate the plant, the Governor, may, on the recommendation of the Minister, by proclamation authorise the burning of the plant during prohibited burning times or during any period of prohibited burning times and declare that such proclamation shall take effect either generally or in the particular district specified in the proclamation; and whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable that the plants specified hereunder should be burnt during prohibited burning times in order to eradicate the plants in the particular districts specified hereunder: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby authorise the burning, subject to the Regulations, of the undermentioned plants during the periods and in the particular districts set out in the schedule hereto.

### Schedule.

Name of Plant; Period in which burning may take place; District.

*Tribulus terrestris* L. (Caltrop); *Xanthium spinosum* L. (Bathurst burr); The whole of the prohibited burning times; The whole of the South-West land division together with the Shires of Westonia, Yilgarn, Dundas, Ravenshorpe and Esperance.

Corres. 1036/66.—That Reserve No. 28504 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Albany, in trust for the purpose of a "Rubbish Disposal Site."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the aforementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1675/66.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said Section) subject to the conditions that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 28493 (Broadwater Suburban Lots 29 and 30)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 60803/65.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1965, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or of any District, or Metropolitan Main Drainage District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as at present defined should be altered: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby order and declare as follows:—

That the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 be and are hereby altered by excising therefrom the land described in the schedule hereto.
