WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*) by section 16 of the Stamp Act, 1921-1966, that the stamp duties to be charged upon the several instruments specified in the Second Schedule to that Act shall be the several duties in the said schedule specified and shall be subject to the exemptions contained in the Act; and whereas by that Schedule certain exemptions are provided in the case of a Receipt, including a Receipt of any other kind (than those thereinbefore mentioned) which the Governor may by proclamation exempt: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt from stamp duty under the Stamp Act, 1921-1966, a receipt given for any payment to, or for the use of, the Parents and Friends' Federation of Western Australia and its constituent Associations.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section three of the Hairdressers Registration Act, 1946-1965, that, subject to subsection (2) of that section, the Act applies only within twenty-five miles from the General Post Office at Perth; and whereas subsection (2) of section three of the said Act provides that the Governor may from time to time, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board, by proclamation declare that the Act shall apply, as from the date specified in the proclamation, to such other area or areas of the State as is or are so specified; and whereas the Minister and the Hairdressers Registration Board of Western Australia have recommended that the Act apply to that area of the state comprising the municipal district of the Town of Albany: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, do hereby declare that the provisions of the Hairdressers Registration Act, 1946-1965, shall apply on and from the date on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette*, to the municipal district of the Town of Albany.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 5th day of April, 1967, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1966.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1966, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas Australian Iron & Steel Pty. Ltd. a company incorporated in the State of New South Wales having its registered office in the State of Western Australia at T. & G. Building, 37 Saint George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for \$10,000 charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt Australian Iron & Steel Pty. Ltd. from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1966 for a period terminating on the 25th day of January, 1969.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.R. 3/67-2.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1899, by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments, which by Order in Council are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Commissioner of Main Roads should be vested in the officer whose name is set out in the attached schedule: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the officer named in the attached schedule and any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in their place, the appointment of foremen and all persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages.

Constitution Act, 1889-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1060/58.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1963, provides that the Governor in Council may vest in Heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments; and whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board) should be vested in Thomas Alexander Albert Herzfeld: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby vests in Thomas Alexander Albert Herzfeld the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Exmouth, more particularly described in the schedule hereunder, a fire district;
- (b) assign the name Exmouth Fire District to that district; and

- (c) include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Exmouth Fire District" and in column two opposite that name, the name of the local authority, "Municipal District of the Shire of Exmouth."

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the southernmost southern corner of Lyndon Location 43 and extending 284 degrees 31 minutes 40 chains; thence 306 degrees 18 minutes 40 chains; thence 333 degrees 16 minutes 7 chains 88 links; thence 180 degrees 0 minutes 133 chains 50 links; thence 159 degrees 0 minutes 86 chains 67 and four-tenths links; thence 90 degrees 1 minute to the Low Water Mark of Exmouth Gulf; thence generally northerly along that mark to the easternmost southeastern corner of Lyndon Location 43 aforesaid; thence 217 degrees 48 minutes 9 chains 85 and six-tenths links and thence 262 degrees 45 minutes 40 chains to the starting point. Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966, that, subject to the provisions of that section, the municipal districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that schedule; and whereas it is further enacted by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council adjust the boundaries of a fire district; now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Bunbury Fire District referred to in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act by substituting for the portion of the Town of Bunbury, as adjusted by an Order in Council made on the 11th September, 1963 and published in the *Government Gazette* published on the 16th September, 1963, and set out in column two of that Part opposite the Bunbury Fire District the land described and set out in the Schedule to this Order.

Bunbury Fire District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the low water mark of Koombana Bay situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of Leschenault Location 24 and extending easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to the low water mark of the north-western shore of Leschenault Inlet; thence generally southwesterly along that low water mark to a point situate in prolongation southeasterly of the northeastern boundary of Wellington Location P403; thence southeasterly along that prolongation to the low water mark of the southeastern shore of Leschenault Inlet aforesaid; thence generally southwesterly along that low water mark, excluding Gerrard Island (Reserve 13532), to a point situate in prolongation northwesterly of the northeastern boundary of lot 28 of Leschenault Location 26, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3734; thence southeasterly along the northeastern boundaries of that lot and lots 33 to 47, inclusive, to the northeastern side of Australind Road; thence

generally northeasterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation northwesterly of the north-eastern side of Vittoria Road; thence generally southerly to and along that side to the southern boundary of location 26 aforesaid; thence easterly along that boundary to the northwestern corner of Collie Agricultural Area Lot 46; thence southerly and easterly along boundaries of that Lot to its southeastern corner; thence southeasterly to the northern corner or part of Wellington Location 53, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 13627; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that part of location 53 and onwards to the southern side of the South Western Highway (Road No. 50); thence generally southeasterly along that side to the left bank of the Ferguson River; thence generally westerly downwards along that bank and generally westerly downwards along the left bank of the Preston River to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western boundary of Lot 1 of Leschenault Location 12 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 12060; thence southerly to and along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Wellington Location 140; thence westerly to and along that boundary and the northern boundary of location 167 and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 337; thence northerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to its north-western corner; thence southwesterly to the intersection of the prolongation easterly of the southern side of Brittain Road with the prolongation southerly of the western side of Hales Street; thence westerly to and along the southern side of Brittain Road aforesaid and onwards to the western side of Bussel Highway (Road No. 48); thence generally northwesterly along that side to the southeastern corner of location 4656 (Reserve 23839); thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location to its southwestern corner; thence southwesterly along the northwestern boundary of Reserve 4660 to the southeastern corner of lot 297 of location 41, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3097; thence northwesterly along the southwestern boundary of that lot and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean and thence generally north-northeasterly and generally easterly along that low water mark and the low water mark of Koombana Bay aforesaid to the starting point. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 2800/62.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the conditions that the

person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 28172 (Bunbury Lot 473) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the State Electricity Commission, to be held in trust for the purpose of "Oil Tank Site": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 638/67.—That Reserve No. 28536 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Busselton, in trust for the purpose of "Tennis and/or Squash".

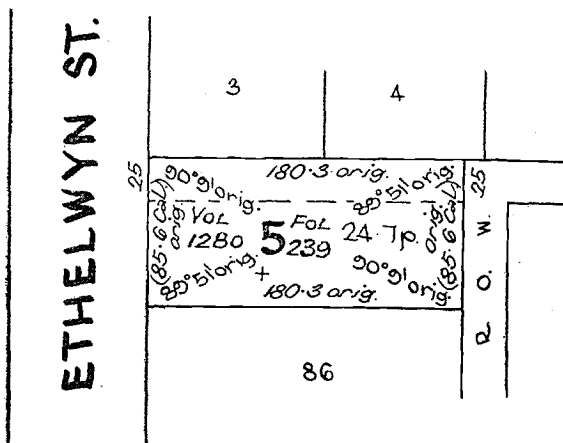

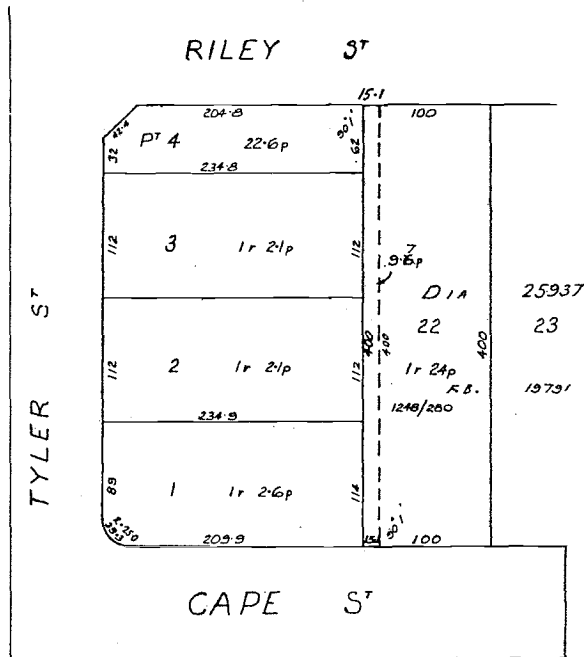
