WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act Amendment Act, 1966, that the Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by proclamation, and that it shall not be necessary to proclaim that the whole of the Act shall come into operation on one date, but the several sections of the Act may be proclaimed to come into operation on such dates as are respectively fixed by proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby fix the 1st day of July, 1967, as the date on which sections one, two, six, seven, eight, nine, nineteen and twenty-one of the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act Amendment Act, 1966, shall come into operation.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Jetty at Learmonth, Exmouth Gulf.

L.G. 154/67.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 299 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1966, that a sea jetty, the approach to which is in a district is, if the Council consents and the Governor makes the necessary Order, to be regarded as being within that district, and if the jetty is a public jetty, and the Council consents, and the Governor makes the necessary Order, it is committed to the care, control and management of the Council of that Municipality; and whereas the approach to the sea jetty known as the Learmonth Jetty at Exmouth Gulf is in the district of the Shire of Exmouth and the jetty is a public jetty; and whereas the Council of the Shire of Exmouth has consented to the jetty being regarded as being within the district of the Shire of Exmouth and has consented to the jetty being committed to the care, control and management of the Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 299 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1966, doth hereby order that the Learmonth Jetty at Exmouth Gulf be regarded as being within the district of the Shire of Exmouth and the jetty is committed to the care, control and management of the Council of that Shire.

THE SCHEME TEXT.

The City of Nedlands Town Planning Scheme.

1.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 The Council of the City of Nedlands, under and by virtue of all powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1962 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme comprising—

Land Use Map.
Approved Planning Scheme Map.
Scheme Text.

This Scheme complies with the requirements of section 35 of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act.

1.2 Scheme Title: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as **THE CITY OF NEDLANDS TOWN PLANNING SCHEME** hereinafter called "**THE SCHEME**" and shall come into operation on the publication of the notice of the Minister's approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.3.1 General Intent of Scheme: The intent of the Scheme is to direct and control the development of the Scheme area (hereinafter referred to as the District) in such a way as shall promote and safeguard the health, safety and convenience and economic and general welfare of its inhabitants and the amenities of every part of the District.

It is complementary to and not a substitute for the Metropolitan Region Scheme. The provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time, shall continue to have effect.

1.3.2 Use Zoning Policy: In making the zoning policy expressed subsequently in this text and Scheme Proposals Map, the Council recognizes that changes will have to be made to it over a period of time. One particular instance where the Council will be prepared to consider amendment of its Scheme upon receipt of bona fide, good quality applications for flat development, to GR5 standards, is in that area bounded by Edward Street on the south, the rear boundaries of lots facing Broadway on the east, the rear boundaries of lots facing Stirling Highway on the north and by Bruce Street on the west.

1.4 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land set out in the Maps in the appendices hereto and bounded by a broken black line delineating the district of the City of Nedlands as described in *Government Gazette* No. 76 dated the 14th day of September, 1956, with the correction published in *Government Gazette* No. 97 dated the 20th day of November, 1964.

1.5 Revocation of Claremont Road Board District Scheme: The Town Planning Scheme adopted by the Claremont Road Board for the district formerly known as the Claremont Road District and which now comprises the municipality of the City of Nedlands, and which was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th day of March, 1931, and subsequently from time to time amplified and amended is hereby revoked.

1.6 Responsible Authority: The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the City of Nedlands (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

1.7 General Obligations: Subject to the provisions of the Act and all regulations made thereunder and to Section 4 of this Scheme, no person shall depart or permit or suffer any departure from the requirements and provisions of the Scheme nor shall any person use or permit the use of any land or building or undertake or permit any new work if the use, new work, reconstruction, alteration, or modification does not conform with the Scheme or would tend to delay the effective operation of the Scheme.

1.8 Relationship of Scheme to By-laws: The Provisions of this Scheme shall have effect, notwithstanding any by-law for the time being in force in the District, and where the provisions of the Scheme are inconsistent with the provisions of any by-law the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.

1.9 Uniform General Building By-laws: In addition to the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws, the conditions set down in Section 3 shall apply to the erection of dwelling houses, duplex, dual and flat accommodation units in the various zones PROVIDED THAT where the provisions of this Scheme are inconsistent with the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws then the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.

1.10 Appeal Rights: Any person feeling aggrieved by a decision of Council exercising the discretionary powers embodied in Section 3 of this Text or by a decision of Council under Clauses 5.3, 5.4, 5.5 and 5.6 of the Text, may appeal from such decision to the Minister for Town Planning who may uphold, reverse or vary the decision of Council, and the order of the Minister shall be binding and final.

1.11 Interpretation: With the exception of the terms defined hereunder, in this Scheme unless the context otherwise provides the terms used will have the respective interpretation set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations, 1963, as amended from time to time. Appendix D will be available to the public at the offices of the Council.

"religious purposes" refers to places of public worship, which expression includes buildings used primarily for the religious and social activities of a church, but does not include an institution for primary, secondary or higher education, or a residential training institution.

2.—RESERVED LAND.

2.1. Reservation of Land: Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Approved Planning Scheme Map. The reservations of the Metropolitan Region Scheme are shown in the Scheme to comply with the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act.

2.2 Development on Reserved Land: Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

2.3 Approval of Development on Reserved Land: In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

2.4 Existing Use Rights on Reserved Land: No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

3.—USE ZONING—EFFECT AND PROCEDURES.

3.1 Zones Specified in Scheme: The following use zonings are specified and described in this Scheme and more particularly in Table I, Zoning Table:—

Residential A.
Residential B.
General Residential GR5.
Shops.
Office, Showroom, Warehouse.
Light Industry.
Hotel.
Service Station.
Special Uses.

3.2 Residential Development Control Code: Development within Residential Zones shall be in accordance with the controls and standards set out hereunder. For the purposes of applying these standards and controls:—

PLOT RATIO shall be calculated so as to include stairs, lobbies and amenity areas in the gross floor area figure and to exclude floor space in basements, lift shafts, machinery rooms, garages and roofed parking areas from the gross floor area; and

SITE COVERAGE shall be calculated as that area of the site covered by buildings excluding roofed parking areas where the roof area is available for use as pedestrian or planting space.

SETBACKS FOR LOTS WITH MULTIPLE STREET FRONTAGES.

Setbacks from all street frontages shall conform to the standards for front boundaries set out in the following tables.

EFFECTIVE FRONTAGE shall be calculated as—

- (i) where the side boundaries of a lot of land are parallel to one another the length of a line drawn at right angles to one of such boundaries so as to bisect the other;
- (ii) where the side boundaries of a lot of land are not parallel to one another the length of a line drawn parallel to the street frontage and bisecting the side boundaries at a point being one-third of the mean depth of the lot measured from the main street frontage;
- (iii) where the lot is of such irregular proportions that neither of the foregoing methods can be applied such length as the Council may determine.

The Council may permit a building of Class I occupancy single dwelling unit, to be erected on a lot smaller in area and frontage than in the Scheme prescribed, if the site comprises the whole of any lot shown on a plan or diagram of subdivision approved in accordance with the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, as amended.

Where comprehensive architectural plans and designs are submitted for multi-unit development with a lot area exceeding 2½ acres, the Minister may, after considering reports from the Council and the Town Planning Board, modify any standard, other than plot ratio, if he is satisfied that the modifications are both socially and aesthetically desirable.

Where comprehensive subdivision plans and development designs for precincts or neighbourhoods are submitted for a minimum area of 10 acres, the Minister may, after considering reports from the Council and the Town Planning Board, modify any standard, if he is satisfied that the modifications are both socially and aesthetically desirable.

Site Coverage: Buildings shall not occupy a greater percentage of a lot than is shown in the following table:—

Distances Between Buildings on the Same Lot: Where more than one building is erected on a lot, all standards shall be observed, as though the development were a single structure. In addition, the minimum distance between any two buildings shall be 30 feet or the minimum distance required under the formula set out below, whichever is the greater. The formula regulating the minimum distance between any two buildings (referred to as "Building A" and "Building B") is as follows:—

$$D = \frac{La + Lb + 2(Ha + Hb)}{6}$$

where

D is the required minimum horizontal distance between any wall of Building A and any wall of Building B or the vertical prolongation of either.

La is the total length of Building A.

The total length of Building A is the Length of that portion or portions of a wall or walls of Building A from which, when viewed from directly above, lines drawn perpendicular to Building A will intersect any wall of Building B.

Lb is the total length of Building B.

The total length of Building B is the length of that portion or portions of a wall or walls of Building B from which, when viewed from directly above, lines drawn perpendicular to Building B will intersect any wall of Building A.

Ha is the height of Building A.

The height of Building A is the height above natural ground level of any portion or portions of a wall or walls along the length of Building A.

Natural ground level is the mean level of the ground immediately adjoining the portion or portions of the wall or walls along the total length of the building.

Hb is the height of Building B.

The height of Building B is the height above natural ground level of any portion or portions of a wall or walls along the length of Building B.

Natural ground level is the mean level of the ground immediately adjoining the portion or portions of the wall or walls, along the total length of the building.

The minimum required distance between two buildings as derived from the formula set out above may be reduced by 15 per cent. if—

- (a) any one of the two buildings has a height of two storeys or less and the other has a height of six storeys or more; and
- (b) the difference in the height of the two buildings is 60 feet or more.

3.3 Zoning Table Explanation: Table No. I indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table, qualified by footnotes to the Table and subject to the controls embodied in the Test as a whole. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Scheme, and without prejudice to the generality of clause 1.3.1 of Section 1, the Council may, with the consent of the Minister or when required by the Minister so to do, shall require that the development of any land within the District, however zoned, shall be subject to the provisions of clauses 10, 24 and 30 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

In respect of any use that is not expressly provided for in the Zoning Table the Council shall, on application, determine in which zone or zones the use may be permitted with or without conditions, as the Council deems necessary.

3.4 Zoning Table Symbols: The symbols used in Table I have the following meanings:—

"P" A use that is permitted under the provisions of this Scheme.

"AA" A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.

"IP" A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.

"X" A use that is not permitted.

NOTES:

1. Flat buildings erected on lots between Edward Street and Princess Road having frontage to Broadway, shall be limited to two-storey construction.
2. At the discretion of the Council professional offices may be erected on lots situate in the G.R. 5 Zone abutting Broadway PROVIDING THAT such buildings shall not exceed two storeys in height not 30 ft above footpath level.
3. Shops may be incorporated in buildings in the office, showroom and warehouse zone provided that in each of such buildings there is one shop only, the floor area of which, inclusive of storage space, does not exceed 100 sq. ft.
4. Subject to the provisions of Clause 3.8 of the Scheme Text.
5. Subject to the provisions of Clause 3.9 of the Scheme Text.

3.5 Dual Accommodation: The Council may approve plans for the conversion of an existing dwelling house situate in the residential zones for the purpose of thereby creating dual accommodation, provided that—

- (i) the area of the lot upon which the building is erected is not less than 32 perches.
- (ii) the frontage of the lot is not less than 66 ft.
- (iii) the floor area of the smaller unit is not more than 600 square feet.
- (iv) the accommodation of the smaller units consist of no more than one living room and one bedroom (or one bed-sitting room) with a kitchenette and a bathroom.
- (v) the proportion of the floor area of the smaller unit to that of the larger is not more than 1 : 3.
- (vi) for purposes of conformity to Plot Ratio and Site Coverage ordinances the floor area of the two units is taken together.
- (vii) the two units together form a single building.

3.6 Minimum Floor Areas of Flats: The minimum floor area for flats is restricted as follows:—

- Batchelor Flats—Bed/Sitting Room: 450 sq. ft.
Two Person—Single Bedroom: 650 sq. ft.
Two Person—Two Bedroom: 750 sq. ft.

3.7 Extractive Industry: It shall be lawful for the Council to extract sand from the areas marked with the appropriate symbol appertaining to "Extractive Industry" and shown on sheet Nedlands 9—of the Approved Planning Scheme Map.

3.8 District Shopping Centres: Land has been set aside for the development of integrated retail trading and service centres meeting the shopping needs of district trading areas at—

- (a) Lots 273 to 320 Plan 2160, bounded by Hampden Road, Park Road, Leura Street, and Hardy Street.
- (b) The southernmost 30 feet of Lots 368 to 378 Phillip Road inclusive, Lot 384 Alexander Road, and Lots 385 to 396, inclusive Waratah Avenue.

Planning and development of these shopping areas shall be carried out to the approval of Council incorporating the principles and provisions enumerated below:—

(1) Building and Landscape:

- (i) The building group shall be designed to produce an integrated layout.
- (ii) Buildings shall be of complimentary design with particular reference to height and slope of verandahs and Cantiliver Awnings; and also in terms of colour, tone and texture of facing materials so that all components of form and finish will blend harmoniously.
- (iii) The design shall make provision for general uniformity of future advertising outside of shops to be in keeping with the architectural quality of the development.
- (iv) Provision shall be made for planting and landscaping of the development to enhance its appearance and to secure a harmonious relationship between the centre and the existing or potential use of adjoining land.
- (v) Service access to rear of shops shall be screened from public view to satisfaction of Council.

(2) Traffic—Access, Safety and Circulation:

- (i) Services for shops shall be provided by vehicle access to the rear of such shops.
- (ii) Off-street parking shall be laid out to provide the highest possible degree of safety and convenience to users.
- (iii) Access from public roads to parking area shall be sited to reduce traffic hazards to a minimum.
- (iv) Any service station proposed within the zone shall be located and designed in such a way as to secure the safe and orderly circulation of vehicular traffic and not interfere with the safety and convenience of pedestrian movement.
- (v) Items (i) to (iv) inclusive, shall be to the satisfaction of Council.

3.9 University Development Lands: All that land designated University Endowment on the Scheme Proposals Map shall be used only for educational, research, recreational and residential uses and any such use shall be permitted only with the approval of the Council. In granting its approval of a particular development proposal the Council shall have regard to the standards embodied in the Scheme controlling similar development throughout the District.

4.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 Existing Use Rights: No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1962 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current, provided that the development is substantially completed within 12 months from the date of issue of the Permit.

4.2 Non-conforming Use and Reserved Lands: Where in respect of land reserved under Section II of the Scheme a lawful non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erection, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

4.3 Extension of Buildings: Where in respect of land zoned under Section III of the Scheme a lawful non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Section on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform General Building By-laws hereinbefore referred to, or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Section when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase or resumption of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for the purpose.

5.—AMENITY CONTROL.

5.1 Vehicle Parking and Loading: The purpose of this clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of land so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic on any road or public place. Every owner or occupier who constructs or who substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building on any site or changes the use of any land or building shall make provision in accordance with the requirements of Table II for vehicles used in conjunction with the site (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees or other persons) to stand on or, in the opinion of the Council sufficiently close to the site but not on a street while being loaded or unloaded or awaiting use.

5.2 Size and Location of Car Space: The minimum dimensions of every required car parking space shall be 18 feet by 8 feet, excluding all access drives. When considering any development application, the Council shall have regard to and impose conditions on the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces. In particular the Council shall take into account, and may impose conditions concerning—

- (i) the proportion of car spaces to be roofed or covered;
- (ii) the proportion of car spaces to be below natural ground level;
- (iii) the means of access to each car space and the adequacy of any vehicular manoeuvring area;
- (iv) the location of the car spaces on the site and their effect on the amenity of adjoining development, including the potential effect, if those spaces should later be roofed or covered;
- (v) the extent to which car spaces are located within required building set-back areas;
- (vi) the locations of proposed public footpath, vehicular crossings, of private footpaths within the lot, and the effect on both pedestrian and vehicular traffic movement and safety;
- (vii) the suitability and adequacy of proposed screening or natural planting; and
- (viii) the suitability and adequacy of elevated structural decks for development and service as a proportion of the required area for natural planting and pedestrian space.

5.3 Number of Parking and Loading Spaces to be Provided: The number of spaces to be provided in respect of any particular site shall be determined by Council having regard to the nature of the use and the known or likely volumes of goods, materials or people moving to and from the site, and where the use is stipulated, not less than the number of spaces set down in Table II hereunder.

5.4 Preservation of Amenities: No building shall be so constructed or finished or left unfinished that its external appearance would disfigure the locality or tend to depreciate the value of adjoining property. Further, all land and buildings shall be so used and maintained as to preserve the amenities of the neighbourhood in which they are situated.

5.5 Nuisance: No Lot, building or appliance shall be such in such a manner as to permit the escape therefrom of smoke, dust, fumes, odour, noise, vibration or waste products in such quantity or extent or in such a manner as to create or be a nuisance to any inhabitant of the neighbourhood of such land or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.

5.6 Traffic Entrances: If in the opinion of the Council separate entrances to and exits from any lot for road vehicles are desirable for the avoidance of traffic hazards on public roads adjacent thereto it may require the owner to provide such entrances and exits as it may direct.

6.—ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette* except in the case of land reserved under the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme where the provisions of Division 3, part II of that Scheme shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by its Senior Health Inspector/Building Surveyor, its Assistant Health Inspectors/Building Surveyors or such other officer authorised in writing by the Town Clerk enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Relationship of Scheme Text to other Documents: This Scheme Text is to be read in conjunction with all documents comprising Nedlands City Council Town Planning Scheme.

6.5 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, and its amendments.

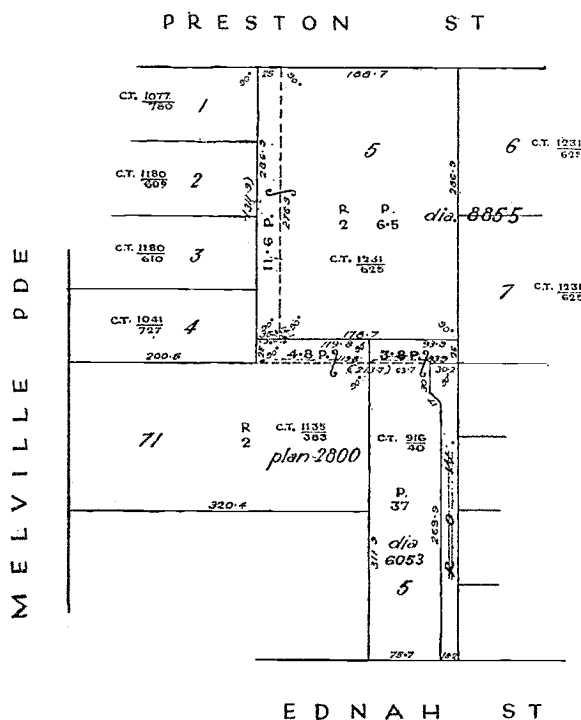
