Constitution Act, 1889-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1060/58 "A".

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1963, provides that the Governor in Council may vest in Heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments; and whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board) should be vested in Walter Maxwell Thorbjornsen: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby vests in Walter Maxwell Thorbjornsen the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage.

Mental Health Act, 1962-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 147/65.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (3) of section 19 of the Mental Health Act, 1962-1965, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time, set aside any one or more buildings or places, or part of a building or place, provided by the State or part of a public hospital, within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1927, for the purpose of any service mentioned in subsection (1) of that section, and may, in like manner, declare any such building or place or part of a building or place or any part of a public hospital to be an approved hospital; and may vary or cancel any order made under that subsection; and whereas it is expedient that certain places and part of a place be set aside for the purposes aforesaid and that certain places and part of a place be declared approved hospitals and to that end it is necessary to cancel the Order in Council hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the

Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth, by this Order—

- (a) cancel the Order in Council made the 13th July, 1966, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd July, 1966, and recorded in the minutes of the Executive Council under number 1636;
- (b) declare Claremont Hospital, less Ward X.1., known as Nedlands House; Heathcote Hospital and Lemnos Hospital to be approved hospitals; and
- (c) set aside—
 - (i) Ward X.1 of Claremont Hospital, known as Nedlands House; Whitby Falls Hospital, Mundijong; Greenplace Hospital, Mosman Park and Belmont Hostel, 52 Great Eastern Highway, Belmont, as hostels;
 - (ii) Pyrtton Training Centre, Seventh Avenue and Walter Road, Bassendean and the Nathaniel Harper Homes, Earlsferry, Swan Street, Bassendean and Fairholme, 39 Market Street, Guildford, as training centres;
 - (iii) Havelock Clinic, 1 Havelock Street, West Perth; Fremantle Psychiatric Clinic, 1 Stirling Street, Fremantle and the Child Guidance Clinic, 590 Newcastle Street, West Perth, as outpatient clinics;
 - (iv) Shenton Park Day Hospital, Boas Street, Shenton Park as a day hospital; and
 - (v) the Industrial Training Centre, Graylands; North Fremantle Industrial Workshop, 98 Stirling Highway, North Fremantle and A.T.U.L. Sheltered Workshop, Claremont, as sheltered workshops.

Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by subsection (2) of section 42 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961, that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council declare any substance to be dangerous goods and classify that substance in the Third Schedule to that Act; and whereas it is further enacted by subsection (4) of that section that a substance may be declared and classified pursuant to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section when that substance is being applied or used for prescribed purposes or in prescribed quantities or is contained in prescribed packages or containers, but that nothing in that section shall apply to that substance when not being so applied or used or so contained; and whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the flammable liquids hereinafter mentioned to be dangerous goods and to classify them in the Third Schedule when being applied or used in the quantities hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 42 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961, do hereby declare the flammable liquids set forth in the first column of the schedule below, when applied or used in the respective quantities specified in that column, to be dangerous goods, and classify those substances in the Third Schedule to that Act as set forth in the second column opposite the respective descriptions of those substances in the first column, of the Schedule below, and I do also hereby declare that this Order in Council shall take effect on the date of the publication of notice thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Australian Public Service Fellowships.

THE Harkness Fellowships for education and travel in the United States are offered in different categories to candidates from the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and Western Europe.

2. In Australia, up to three Public Service Fellowships are offered in open competition each year to outstanding men and women holding appointments under the Commonwealth and State Governments of Australia.

3. A candidate must be between 21 and 35 years of age and qualified by education and experience to carry out a definite scheme of advanced study, research or inquiry related to a problem which is of importance to the candidate's Government and can be investigated to special advantage in the United States. Probationers or junior officers desiring elementary grounding or University degrees are not eligible for these Fellowships.

4. All applications from State Public Servants and employees of semi-Government and statutory authorities must be returned to the Public Service Commissioner, 184 St George's Terrace, Perth, by 15th August, 1967.

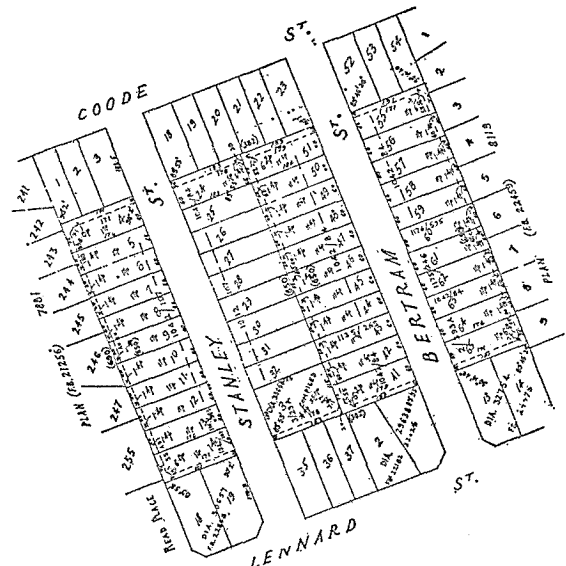

A. That by-laws 2, 2 (a) and 2 (b) be repealed and the following new by-law inserted in lieu thereof:—

2 (a) The Club shall consist of the following:—

- (i) Ordinary Male Members.
- (ii) Junior Male Members.
- (iii) Non-effective Male Members.
- (iv) Non-effective Lady Members.
- (v) Honorary Life Members.

(b) No person (except a Non-effective Male Member) shall be eligible for admission as a Member of the Club unless he shall have resided in Western Australia for a period of at least six (6) calendar months immediately prior to his nomination. Provided that such residential qualification shall not be necessary in the case of a Member of any Club which is a Principal Club in any State or of any other Club (whether within or without Australia) from time to time approved by the Committee or of any male person in respect of whom the Committee may waive such residential qualification for any special reason.

(c) The number of Members of the Club (exclusive of absentee Members, Junior Male Members, Non-effective Male Members, Non-effective Lady Members and Honorary Members) shall not exceed eight hundred and fifty.

B. That by-law 3 (b) be repealed and the following by-law be inserted in lieu thereof:—

3 (b) The widow of a deceased Member may within one year (or within such extended period as the Committee may in any particular case determine) of such Member's death make application in the prescribed form for admission as a Non-effective Lady Member.

(c) If such widow shall not make application for admission as a Non-effective Lady Member within such period of one year or shall earlier renounce the right of application referred to in paragraph (b) preceding any one daughter of such deceased Member may make application for admission as a Non-effective Lady Member and in the event of such admission the widow shall no longer be eligible for Membership.

(d) Any lady who has been actively associated with racing for a period considered by the Committee to be sufficient to demonstrate such association and who is not otherwise entitled to make application for admission as a Non-effective Lady Member may so apply.

(e) Any male person under the age of twenty-five years may make application in the prescribed form to be admitted as a Junior Male Member until he shall attain the age of twenty-five years.

(f) Any male person who has come to reside in the State from outside the State and who has not acquired the residential qualification required under by-law 2 (b) may make application for admission as a Non-effective Male Member until he has acquired such qualification.

(g) The provisions of paragraph (a) preceding shall apply to the election of Junior Male Members, Non-effective Male Members and Non-effective Lady Members.

(h) Junior Male Members and Non-effective Male Members shall not be required to pay any entrance fee and Non-effective Lady Members shall pay an entrance fee equal to one half of the entrance fee payable for the time being of Ordinary Male Members.

(i) A Junior Male Member may at any time before attaining the age of twenty-five years elect to become an Ordinary Member of the Club in which event he shall pay by way of entrance fee an amount equal to one half of the entrance fee then payable by Ordinary Male Members but if he shall not do so before attaining that age he shall on attaining the age of twenty-five years become liable to pay the entrance fee then payable by Ordinary Male Members unless the Committee shall in any particular case otherwise determine.

C. That by-law 9 be amended by deleting the word "No" at the commencement and inserting in lieu thereof the words "No Member other than an Ordinary Male Member or an Honorary Life Member shall attend or vote at any General Meeting of the Club and no Ordinary".
