WHEREAS by section 13 of the Main Roads Act, 1930, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, declare by proclamation that

any road shall be a main road or shall cease to be a main road; and whereas the Commissioner has recommended that the portions of roads specified in the schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and pursuant to the said recommendation do declare that on and after the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixty seven, the portions of roads specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be main roads and that the footpaths, if any, of such roads be excluded from the main roads and that the portions of roads specified in Part II of the Schedule shall cease to be main roads.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Child Welfare Act, 1947-1965. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Land Act, 1933-1965. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Local Government Act. 1960. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised the apprivate affects of which or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils

mentioned in the schedule hereunder have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such lands shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedi-cated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Water Boards Act, 1904-1964. Bunbury Water Board Proposed Loan of \$23,186. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

LAND AGENTS ACT, 1921.

Application for License in the First Instance.

To the Court of Petty Sessions at Fremantle:

I, GIACOMO BOMBARA, of 8 McCallum Crescent, Applecross, Health and Meat Inspector, having attained the age of 21 years, hereby apply on my behalf for a license to carry on the business of a land agent under the Land Agents Act, 1921. DECISION OF THE BOARD TO HEAR THE APPEAL OF R. P. BOWE OF THE BUSH FIRES BOARD

THE appellant/applicant in this case is appealing against his classification in consequence of a decision of the Public Service Commissioner to amend the duties and title of his position and he claims that the duties now performed warrant a higher classification than C-II-5. He further claims that the amendment of his duties and title has given rise to an anomaly in treatment affecting him in respect of his classification, salary and position and he is applying for redress or correction of an anomaly pursuant to section 6, subsection (i), clause (c).

The Public Service Commissioner has raised a preliminary objection to the jurisdiction of the Board to hear the appeal and/or application. It is submitted that as the classification and salary has not been changed neither section 6, subsection (i) (a) (i) nor section 6 subsection (i) (c) has any application to the circumstances of this case. The facts agreed by both sides are that at 1/1/63 the position held by the appellant/applicant was titled Clerk Assistant to the Bush Fires Board with a classification of C-II-4. Following the 1963 reclassification, he appealed to this Board which allowed his appeal and altered the classification to C-II-5 with the title of Assistant Secretary as from 1/1/63.

On 18/8/64 the Chairman of the Bush Fires Board wrote to the Public Service Commissioner recommending the creation of a new office of Senior Inspecting Warden, who would visit country areas and be responsible for the coordination of the work of Bush Fire Wardens and establish a close liaison with the Shire Councils charged with the duty of administering the Bush Fires Act in their respective districts.

The Public Service Commissioner refused to agree to this proposal and suggested that this work should be performed by the then Senior Warden and that another Warden on G-II-3 classification should be appointed to relieve him of some of his

The Bush Fires Board opposed this proposal and suggested as a counter proposal that a Public Relations clerical officer on C-II-5/6 classification be appointed and a new item created. This also was rejected and eventually on 19/2/65, it was agreed by the Public Service Commissioner that the appellant/applicant would undertake special liaison duties with the Shire Councils to assist in solving local problems and to ensure better enforcement of the Bush Fires Act in country areas for a trial period of six months.

This arrangement continued until 12/10/65 when again it was urged upon the Public Service Commissioner that a new item of Shire Liaison Officer and Assistant Secretary should be created with a classification of C-II-6 and the position of Assistant Secretary abolished.

Again the Public Service Commissioner disagreed and finally in a minute to the Acting Under Secretary for Lands dated 16th March, 1966, he stated his contention to amend the duty list of the position to conform to the new duties being performed and the title to Shire Liaison Officer and Assistant Secretary, but he considered the classification should remain C-II-5. A new item of clerk C-II-3 was created to relieve the appellant/applicant of some of his former duties.

Mr Barblett submits firstly, that there is a right of appeal under section 6 (1) (a) (i) which grants jurisdiction to the Board "to hear and determine any appeal, by any public servant or class of public servant from the Public Service Commissioner . . . in respect of (i) the classification, reclassification, salary or allowances of such public servant or class of public servants or his or its office or offices."

My first impression on reading this provision was that as the disjunctive "or" is used that a right of appeal may have been intended in respect of an appellant's office. If the word "of" had been inserted before "his" or its "office" the intention would have been quite clear. I am satisfied, however, that it was the intention of the legislature to deal in subsection (1) (a) (i) with the specific matters of classification, reclassification, salary and allowances and not to give a general right of appeal in respect to any decisions made relating to the office.

It is argued by Mr Barblett for the appellant/applicant that the word "classification" means placing an officer or office in a special salary strata and that the main criterion for such placement is the nature of the duties of the office which is being classified. He argues that while it is a change of classification or reclassification to alter the numerical classification, conversely it is a classification to retain the same numerical classification and alter the duties. An alteration to the duties which makes them more onerous is, in fact, to change the salary of the position. This, however, to my mind was not the intention of the subsection, which I think refers to the numerical placement of an officer in a scheme of classification. In order to classify a position it is necessary to look at the duties being performed, but the act of classifying does not of itself involve any change or alteration to the duties which are being examined at the time of classifying them. Hence in my view an appeal lies in relation to the placement of an officer in a given salary strata or numerical point on the scale or system adopted as the basis of classification, but not in relation to the list of duties being performed. It is argued that an officer's salary is varied if the duties of the position he holds are changed to a considerable degree and are made more onerous, but this is clearly not so—it is the duties and not the salary which are altered.

I agree with the Public Service Commissioner's submission that a right of appeal lies under subsection (1) (a) (i) only if there is a decision by the Public Service Commissioner to alter the classification. My attention has been drawn to the decision of Mr Justice Nevile as the Chairman of this Board on 24th May, 1963, in Appeal No. 3/1963 relating to a group of professional engineers. At page 42 he said "It seems to me that to hold that an appeal lay to this Board from the refusal of the Public Service Commissioner of a request made at any time to increase the salary of any public servant or class of public servants would be contrary to the whole scheme of the Act. In my opinion section 6 (1) (a) (i) gives a right of appeal against a classification or reclassification or any decision varying the then existing salary or allowances of any public servant, but not against a mere refusal to vary the existing provisions. By that statement I do not intend to infer that a refusal to increase an officer's salary may not in some circumstances give rise to an appeal. If all other officers in the Service were given an additional allowance the refusal to give that allowance to some particular officer or group of officers, would be an anomaly in treatment under which an appeal would lie under paragraph (1) (c) of section 6 of the Act." I respectfully agree with the view His Honour expressed. The subsection clearly intends a right of appeal to be from a decision of the Public Service Commissioner and unless a decision to alter classification is made there is nothing to appeal from. This, I think, becomes more evident when we look at section 6, subsection (1) (c), which gives the Board jurisdiction to redress or correct an anomaly in treatment. This clause is apparently intended to enable a public servant to apply at any time to the Board for the redress or correction of an anomaly in treatment. I think there is a clear distinction between an appeal under clause (a) and an application under clause (c). An appeal under the for

By section 15 of the Public Service Act, a reclassification involving this type of inquiry is required to be made by the Public Service Commissioner once at least every five years. This is not to say that classifications and reclassifications are not to be made more frequently. New positions for example, are created from time to time, but at the time of the creation of the new item it is infilled and generally no right of appeal against the classification fixed by the Public Service Commissioner would arise in that case. It is argued in the present case that the appellant in fact occupies a new position the new duties having substantially altered the character of the old position as evidenced by the change of title. This might have had more force if it were not for clause (c), but obviously Parliament intended to make provision for the redress or correction of anomalies in treatment arising inter alia from changes from time to time in the duties of officers and it would be reasonable to infer that the circumstances in the present case are covered by clause (c) rather than an appeal under clause (a).

It is, of course, not every change in duties which will involve a change in responsibility or give rise to an anomaly and in the present case, we have as yet heard no evidence as to whether in fact an anomaly exists or existed.

It is unnecessary for me at this stage to consider the meaning of the term "anomaly" in section 6 of the Act; suffice it to say that the onus is on the applicant to prove such anomaly. I am, however, of the opinion that an anomaly within the meaning of clause (c) is one relating to the system or structure of classification adopted by the Public Service Commissioner and the relationship of officers within that system, and that an application under clause (c) does not involve a work value assessment in the same sense of classifying or reclassifying a position within the meaning of those terms in clause (a). It is not an anomaly in treatment as I understand the meaning of the term, if, for example, salaries paid in another State are higher for similar duties or that the skills employed are of great importance to the community which must be suitable rewarded to attract suitable people to the public service, and so on. These are matters which properly belong to a work value assessment and an appeal lies under clause (a) (i) against such an assessment when a decision is made to vary the classification or when a reclassification takes place.

On the other hand, changes in duties which may increase responsibility and lead to an anomaly in treatment should be adjusted from time to time in between reclassifications, normally held every five years, to avoid dissatisfaction and unrest in the Public Service, and it appears that this is the object of clause (c). This is not to say that a change of duties could not, in some circumstances, give rise to an appeal under clause (a) thus, for example, if the Public Service Commissioner decided to reduce the classification of a position following changes in duties, a work value assessment would be appropriate and an appeal would lie under clause (a) of subsection (1).

I am satisfied, however, that no appeal lies in this case under subsection (1) (a) but the Board is empowered and should proceed to hear the application for redress or correction of any anomaly in treatment under subsection (1) (c).

My colleagues agree with this decision.

APPEAL BY B. R. PEACOCK, MINES DEPARTMENT, RELATING TO CLASSIFICATION OF ITEM 23/4490

Mr Cadee for P.S.C. Mr J. M. Currie for appellant

File 7/66

THESE proceedings have been brought in the form of an appeal against the decision of the Public Service Commissioner to reclassify and change the title of item 23/4490 from Laboratory Technician, Grade 2, G-II-2/3, to Laboratory Technican, Grade 1, G-II-3/4 with effect from 22/7/66.

The facts are briefly that the occupant of this position appealed to this Board following the 1963 Reclassifications, claiming that the duties warranted Grade 1 with a classification of GII-3/4. This appeal was dismissed.

On 20/6/66 the appellant applied by letter to the Director of the Government Chemical Laboratories, requesting review of his classification. The Director then recommended an increase in classification to Grade 1, which was approved by the Public Service Commissioner as from 22/7/66 being the date of the pay period nearest to the date of application.

The appellant claims that the level of work being performed by him was constant for a period extending back even prior to 1/1/64 and he is asking the Board to find that the decision should take effect from 1/1/64 in lieu of 22/7/66.

It is submitted by the Public Service Commissioner that the Board does not have a general power to make its decision effective to a date prior to the decision appealed against, namely 22/7/66. It is further submitted that the power in section 6 (1) (c) "to direct that any adjustment the Board may deem necessary should in the special circumstances of any particular case, have effect from 1/7/19" was intended to meet the special circumstances of anomalies existing at the time of the Civil Service Strike which resulted in the passing of legislation which set up the Public Service Appeal Board.

It would appear that these proceedings have been misconceived if the intention is to appeal under section 6 (1) (a) which confers on the Board, jurisdiction to hear and determine any appeal in respect of the classification, reclassification, salary or allowances of a public servant or class of public servants. In my view an appeal lies under this clause only where the Public Service Commissioner has made a decision to alter an existing classification, in which case the appeal relates only to the classification or salary fixed by the Public Service Commissioner and there is no express or implied power to alter on appeal the operative date, namely the date fixed by the Commissioner's decision.

It would appear that the "appellant" in these proceedings is really an applicant under clause (c) for the redress or correction of an anomaly in treatment affecting him in respect of classification and should be treated as such. That an anomaly existed is impliedly admitted by the Public Service Commissioner from the fact that he has adjusted the title and classification of the position to accord with the higher duties being performed.

I agree with the submission made by the Public Service Commissioner that the words in clause (c) "with power to direct that any adjustment the Board may deem necessary shall, in the special circumstances of any particular case, have effect from the 1st day of July, 1919", were intended to meet the special circumstances of the anomaly cases existing at the time of the passing of the Act. The Act was assented to on 3/2/20 and by section 7 of the Interpretation Act came into operation on that day. Without this special provision the Board would not have had power to make its decision effective prior to 3/12/20 and many anomalies would presumably not have been redressed.

The Act is, however, silent as to whether the Board is to have power in redressing or correcting anomalies to make its decisious effective from the date the anomaly arose, and it appears that regulation 23, which imposes a limitation period of one month for bringing appeals under subsection (1) (a) (i) and (ii), has no reference to applications under clause (c) of subsection (1).

In my view it was not necessary for the Act to expressly provide such a power, which is inherent in the jurisdiction it confers to redress or correct any anomaly; otherwise, in some circumstances it may be impossible for the Board to give full and complete justice. If it were intended that the Board should have limited power to redress or correct any anomaly only from the date of the application or the date fixed by the Public Service Commissioner, it would be reasonable to expect that the Act would say so.

It is also submitted by the Public Service Commissioner that the proviso to subsection (1a) limits the Board's jurisdiction and powers to hearing and determining the question whether or not the office held by an applicant has been placed in its appropriate class and declaring the class in which such office shall be placed. This limitation is, however, expressly applied to limit the jurisdiction of the Board under that subsection, namely, subsection (1a) and it does not purport to impose any limit to the jurisdiction under subsection (1). The limitation to jurisdiction imposed by subsection (1a) is expressly applied, inter alia, to public servants occupying an office in respect whereof the maximum rate of salary is fixed at less than £700 a year. As it is safe to say that there is no officer today receiving a salary of less than £700 a year the subsection is virtually obsolete and has apparently no application to the circumstances under consideration.

I am, therefore, of the opinion, that the Board has power under clause (c) of subsection (1) to redress or correct any anomaly in treatment, without any limitation, according to the merits of the case. If an applicant were successful in proving an anomaly, it would generally be adjusted back to the date when the applicant first applied for review and, in fact, I understand this is the present practice of the Public Service Commissioner. In this case adjustment has been made effective from 22/7/66, which in my view was reasonable in the circumstances, and unless there is fresh evidence to be brought, the appeal would appear to have no merit.

The other members of the Board agree with this decision, except that the member appointed by the Governor does not agree that the Board has power to make retrospective adjustments in dealing with applications under section 6 (1) (c).


