### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas  
TO WIT, } Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the  
DOUGLAS ANTHONY } Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and  
KENDREW, } Saint George, Companion of the Most Honour-  
Governor. } able Order of the Bath, Commander of the  
[L.S.] } Most Excellent Order of the British Empire,  
Companion of the Distinguished Service Order,  
Governor in and over the State of Western  
Australia and its Dependencies in the Com-  
monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, that the Governor may by proclamation declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives and abolish any Reserve so declared; and whereas by proclamation issued under the Native Welfare Act, 1963, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th April, 1967, the Governor declared an area at Mukinbudin more particularly described as Reserve 24101 and defined in the schedule to such proclamation to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said Reserve: Now, therefore I, the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, do hereby abolish the Reserve for Natives as declared and described and defined in the hereinbefore mentioned proclamation as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th April, 1967, as aforesaid.

Forests Act, 1918-1964.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL,

F.D. 429/65; L. & S. 1956/65.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1964, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament, his proposal dated the thirteenth day of October, 1965, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown land as State Forest No. 42 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

### SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1964.

#### The Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909.

WE, the Honourable Sir Albert Wolff, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, the Honourable Sir Lawrence Walter Jackson, Kt., Senior Puisne Judge, the Honourable John Evenden Virtue, the Honourable Roy, Vivian Nevile, the Honourable Gordon Bede D'Arcy and the Honourable Oscar Joseph Negus, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, being a majority of the Judges of the said Court, acting in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1964, and of every other power enabling us in this behalf, do hereby amend Order LVIII rule 1 of The Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, by adding after subrule (2) the following subrules:—

(3) Without affecting the specific provisions of the foregoing subrules, it is not sufficient to allege that a judgment or order is against the evidence or the weight of evidence or that it is wrong in law: the notice must specify the particulars relied on to demonstrate that it is against the evidence and the weight of evidence and the specific reasons why it is alleged to be wrong in law.

(4) Where the notice of grounds of appeal does not comply with this rule the Master shall not list the appeal for hearing, and in case of doubt or difficulty may refer the question to the Chief Justice for his direction.

- (3) Removal of existing gut running and salt store buildings.

#### Addendum.

Investigation has been made by the Public Works Department of the mechanical and electrical condition of this works.

No consideration has been given in the above list of requirements to any defects resulting from this particular report.

  - (b) edible room.
6. Provisions as previously stated on general submission with regards to equipment, construction, repairs, yards, drainage, etc., still apply.

- Part I—Preliminary.
- Part II—Reserved Land.
- Part III—Zones.
- Part IV—Preservation of Amenities.
- Part V—Non-conforming Uses.
- Part VI—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are  
appended as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2".
- (2) Planning Proposals Maps marked "Map  
No. 3" or Approved Planning Scheme  
Map marked "Map No. 4" (as the case  
may be).

The Scheme Report is also appended.

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms  
used will have the respective interpretations set out  
in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regula-

**PART II—RESERVED LAND.**

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part  
a person shall not carry out any development on

ority shall have regard to the ultimate purpose

## PART IV—PRESERVATION OF AMENITIES.

4.1 The Council may refuse to approve any plans of development or redevelopment of lots if in its opinion the siting, appearance, design and harmony of the proposed buildings would be detrimental to or destroy the amenities of the neighbourhood nor shall any building be so constructed, finished or left unfinished that its external appearance would disfigure the locality or tend to depreciate the value of adjoining properties. Further, all land and buildings shall be so maintained as to preserve the amenities of the neighbourhood in which they are situated.

## PART V—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

5.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

5.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 5.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Responsible Authority has been obtained in writing.

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 5.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under

that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

## 5.3 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use—

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

## PART VI—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purposes of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

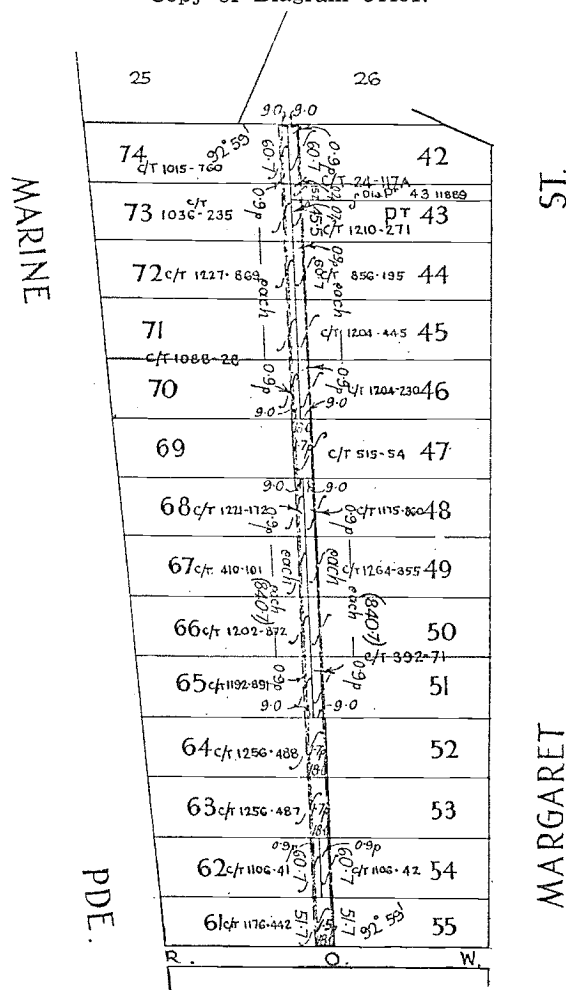

Shire of Gingin.

By-laws Relating to Long Service Leave.

The By-laws of the Gingin Road Board published in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th June, 1954, are hereby revoked.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 20th day of April, 1967, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws, the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

- (a) "Council" means the Gingin Shire Council.
- (b) "Employee" means and includes all persons employed in any capacity by the Council, and who are in the regular and full-time employment of the Council.
- (c) "Continuous Service" means service in the employment of the Council during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Council for a continuous period of more than two working days, has not been absent on long service leave and has not been absent without pay without such leave or absence being granted by the Council; provided that an employee who was employed by the Council on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering compulsory service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, shall have such service counted as continuous service with the Council, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. Absence of an employee on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall be certified necessary by a Medical Practitioner and is approved by the Council.

3. An employee dismissed by the Council for neglect of duty or for irregular practices shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of these by-laws.

4. No *pro-rata* long service leave shall be granted to an employee who prior to completing any qualifying period of ten (10) years of continuous service resigns his employment with the Council.

5 (a) All present and future employees of the Council shall, after each period of ten (10) years of continuous service as a permanent full-time employee thereof, commencing from the First day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty three, be entitled to thirteen (13) weeks long service leave, and no long service leave will be granted to any employee, except where otherwise provided therein, without serving a qualifying period of ten (10) years continuous service being first completed.

(b) Provided however that where an employee of the Council has become entitled to long service leave under the provisions of the Long Service Leave Act, 1958, he shall not be entitled to any further long service leave until the expiration of ten (10) years continuous service with the Council from the date he became entitled to long service leave under the provisions of the Long Service Leave Act, 1958.

6. (a) *Pro-rata* entitlements of long service leave shall be the same proportion of thirteen (13) weeks as the length of continuous service of any employee since commencing any qualifying period of service bears to the full qualifying period of ten (10) years continuous service with the Council.

(b) An employee who has completed the initial qualifying period of ten (10) years continuous service with the Council and has taken such long service leave, shall, upon resuming his normal duty with the Council, immediately commence accumulating *pro-rata* long service leave. Such *pro-rata* long service leave may be taken by an employee who has reached the retiring age of sixty-five (65) years or is retired on the grounds of ill health or is dismissed through staff retrenchments or being a female retires for the purpose of and actually marries. Then and in such case such employee shall be granted long service leave by the Council, calculated in accordance with by-law 6 (a).

(c) An employee who prior to completion of the initial qualifying period of ten (10) years continuous service with the Council, but who has completed a minimum of five (5) years continuous service with the Council and who has reached the retiring age of sixty-five (65) years or is retired on the grounds of ill health or is dismissed through staff retrenchments or being a female retires for the purpose of and actually marries, then and in such case such employee may be granted *pro-rata* long service leave by the Council, calculated in accordance with by-law 6 (a).

(d) The Council shall grant a payment in lieu of *pro-rata* long service leave to the personal representatives, or if there be none, to the dependants of an employee who dies after completing the initial qualifying period of continuous service with the Council, taking such long service leave and recommencing duty with the Council. Such payment shall be calculated in accordance with by-law 6 (a).

(e) The Council may grant a payment in lieu of *pro-rata* long service leave to the personal representatives, or if there be none, to the dependants of an employee who dies prior to completing the initial qualifying period of continuous service with the Council. Such payment shall be calculated in accordance with by-law 6 (a).

7. (a) Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Council, who will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Council may require the employee to take the leave by giving not less than thirteen (13) weeks notice.

(b) Long service leave shall be taken by every employee within twelve (12) months of it becoming due, and if not taken, the employee shall not begin to qualify for further long service until the resumption of duty after taking the long service leave already due to him.

(c) Provided that with the express approval of the Council, an employee may be allowed to accumulate long service leave up to, but not exceeding twenty-six (26) weeks.

8. (a) Employees taking long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the permanent rate of pay excluding conditional margins or higher duty payments paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Council shall pay to any employee his salary or wage during his period of long service leave periodically, provided that it may at its discretion pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his salary or wages for the period of his long service leave upon written application being made to the Council for payment in such manner.

9. (a) Nothing in these by-laws contained or implied shall have the effect or be deemed to have the effect of depriving any employee, during any year in which he shall take long service leave of the whole or any part of the annual leave to which he would ordinarily have been entitled in that year nor any other privileges and rights normally conferred by his employer.

(b) All annual leave to which an employee is entitled, or will become entitled, before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave but are to form part of such long service leave.

10. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of Service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term of service to the Council and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward. Any contravention of these by-laws shall entitle the Council to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.
