Scheme Text.

1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Town of Narrogin Town Planning Scheme No. 2—Hough Street Scheme (hereinafter called "the scheme").

2. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this scheme is the Town of Narrogin (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

3. Plans: The following plans are attached to the Scheme Text:—

- (a) Plan No. 1: which shows the present subdivision and existing buildings.
- (b) Plan No. 2: the Scheme Map which shows the proposed land subdivision.

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within a blue border on Plan No. 1 and within a blue border on Plan No. 2. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are—

- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To make suitable provision for the better use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
- (c) To make suitable provision for roads and traffic.
- (d) To make provision for land to be used for public open space and public recreation within the Scheme Area.

6. Scheme Works: The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:—

- (a) The Scheme Area shall be resurveyed in conformity with the design shown on Plan No. 2 with such minor variations as may be determined by the Council.
- (b) The lands shown as roads on Plan No. 2 of which the carriage-way is coloured yellow shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earthworks undertaken.
- (c) The lands coloured green on Plan No. 2 shall be set aside for public open spaces.
- (d) Levelling filling and drainage works shall be carried out where necessary or desirable.
- (e) Basic development of public open space within the Scheme Area will be carried out.

(f) Those buildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision may be demolished or otherwise removed and in cases considered desirable by the Council such fences and buildings may be re-erected.

7. Acquisition of Land: So much of the land within the Scheme Area as is in the opinion of the Council necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

8. Closure of Roads and Rights of Way: Those roads and rights of way which are shown hatched green on Plan No. 2 shall be closed and the land used for the purposes shown on Plan No. 2.

9. Valuations: The lots and portions of lots shown on Plan No. 1 (hereinafter called "old lots") shall be valued as at the Eighteenth day of October 1966 on which date the Council passed a resolution to prepare this Scheme and each owner will as soon as the valuation has been made be notified of the value so placed on his old lot.

10. The lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with Plan No. 2 (hereinafter called "new lots") shall be valued as at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme as residential land on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this Scheme have been carried out.

11. The valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or by some person appointed by him to ascertain the value of the land assuming that there are no buildings structures or fences thereon.

12. - (a) The lots shown in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "saleable lots") shall be set aside and subject to the provisions of Clauses 31, 32 and 33 hereof shall be sold to pay the costs of the Scheme.

20.
