WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, DOUGLAS ANTHONY KENDREW, Governor. [L.S.] By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honour-able Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies In the Com-monwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of the Bank Holidays Act, 1884, I, the Governor of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the following special Bank Holidays:

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth on this 24th day of August, 1967, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:-

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 614 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that where in accordance with subsection (1) of that

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required on or before the date referred to below to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March, 1968, on land referred to in sections 1 (a) and 1 (b) below and up to and including the 31st day of May, 1968, on land referred to in sections 2 and 3 below.

### Rural Land.

(1) (a) Where land owned or occupied by you is cleared or partly cleared you shall on or before the 31st day of October, 1967, clear firebreaks not less than 10 feet wide inside and parallel to the boundaries of that part of the land which is cleared or partly cleared. The outside perimeter of the firebreak required by this section is to be situated within 5 chains of the boundary of the cleared or partly cleared land.

(2) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained, or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) you shall on or before the 31st day of October, 1967, clear a firebreak not less than one chain wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated.

(3) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and such bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the Bush is completed after the 31st October, 1967 you shall forthwith clear a firebreak not less than one chain wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land on which bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated.

(4) If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or your local bush fire control officer, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions. If permission is not granted by the council or your local bush fire control officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

(5) The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

(6) If you propose to carry out the requirements of this notice by burning the necessary firebreaks, and the burning is to be carried out between the 1st day of October, 1967 and the 31st day of October, 1967 or between the 1st day of February, 1968 and the 31st day of May, 1968 a permit for the burning would be required under section 18 of the Bush Fires Act. The burning would be subject to any conditions stated in the permit and to all other relevent provisions of the Bush Fires Act. All burning is prohibited within the Shire of Ravensthorpe from the 1st day of November, 1967 until the 31st day of January, 1968. (Both dates inclusive).

(7) Aerial Survey. An aerial inspection will be made early in November, 1967.

#### Townsites.

(8) Blocks with buildings: Provide by the 31st October, 1967 and maintain thereafter until the 31st March, 1968, a firebreak cleared of all infiammable material to a width of at least three feet inside and around the boundary of each block.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required, on or before the date referred to below, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you all infiammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the date referred to below.

- (b) Urban Land—Remove all inflammable material on the land from the whole of the land situated within the townsites of Wanneroo, Quinns, Yanchep, Mullaloo and Mariginiup.
- (c) Fuel Dumps—Remove all infiammable material from all land where fuel drum ramps or dumps are located and where fuel drums, whether containing fuel or not, are stored and to a distance of at least 10 feet outside the perimeter of any drum, ramp or stack of drums;

and thereafter the land must be maintained clear of inflammable material until the 14th day of March, 1968.

If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Metropolitan Fire District" is defined for the purposes of this order as all that portion of land, situate within the Municipal District of the Shire of Wanneroo, bounded by lines starting from a point on the shore of the Indian Ocean situate west of the south-western corner of lot 156 of Swan Location 1315 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4953 and extending east to that corner; thence southerly along the eastern side of a one-chain road passing along the western boundary of lot 160 and onwards to the northern boundary of location 1472; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that location to the northeastern corner of Marmion Townsite; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that townsite to the northern side of Beach Road (road number 246); thence generally westerly along that side and onwards to the shore of the Indian Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally northerly along that shore to the starting point.

The definition is very wide and includes, amongst other things, trees, bushes, plants, stubble (i.e., hay, straw, grass, herbage and all other vegetation), scrub and undergrowth of all kinds, whether alive or dead, standing or not standing, severed or not severed.

The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.



Regulation 1 amended.

2. Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the passage, "Part IIB (regulation 26C). Loans of Money in Deposit with the Savings Bank Division to Persons and Bodies;" the following passage:—

Part IIB (regulations 26C to 26D). Loans of Money in Deposit with the Savings Bank Division to Persons and Bodies.

Part IIC added. Part IIC (regulation 26E). Receipt of Deposits to be inscribed as "Deposit Stock".

3. The principal regulations are amended by adding after Part IIB, the following Part:---

#### PART IIC.

Receipt of Moneys to be inscribed as "Deposit Stock".

26E. Deposits received by the Bank and inscribed as "Deposit Stock" pursuant to paragraph (c) of section 46 of the Act are repayable on the giving of seven days', ten days', three month', six months', one year's or two years' notice, according to the terms upon which the deposit was so received.
