Land Act, 1933-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3841/64.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the conditions that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27750 (Dalwallinu Lot 372) should, subject as No. 27730 (Dalwalling Lot 512) Should, Subject as aforsaid be granted in fee simple to The St. John Ambulance Association in Western Australia Incorporated, to be held in trust for the purpose of an "Ambulance Depot": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean situate south of the 246 mile peg on the No. 2 Rabbit Proof Fence and extending north through that mile peg to the southeastern boundary of Kent Location 1708; thence generally westerly along the southern boundaries of that Location to the southeastern boundary of location 1634; thence southwesterly and northwesterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the southeastern boundary of location 1640; thence northeasterly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southernmost corner of location 1644; thence northeasterly along the southeastern boundary of that location and onwards to the westernmost southwestern corner of location 1650; thence northwesterly along southwestern boundaries of that location and location 1706 to the westernmost corner of the lastmentioned location; thence generally northeasterly along northwestern boundaries of that location, locations 1651, 1652, 1690 and 1691 to the northernmost northeastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence northwesterly to and along the northeastern boundary of location 1669 to a north south line
