AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 25th day of October, 1967, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1966.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1966, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas The Colonial Mutual Life Assurance Society Limited, of Saint George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury securities to wit \$25,000 5 per cent. Commonwealth Inscribed Stock 15/9/1985, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The Colonial Mutual Life Assurance Society Limited from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1966 for a period terminating on the 15th day of September, 1969.

Poisons Act, 1964-1966.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 21 of the Poisons Act, 1964-1966, it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, amend any of the Schedules referred to in section 20 of that Act by—

- (a) the addition thereto or the deletion therefrom of any substance;
- (b) the transference of any substance from any Schedule to any other Schedule; or
- (c) the alteration of any item in any schedule;

And whereas by Orders in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th June, 1965, the 28th January, 1966, the 26th April, 1967 and the 2nd June, 1967, the Governor did amend the schedules so referred to as set out in the Appendices to those Orders in Council; and whereas it is deemed expedient to further amend the schedules so referred to in the manner hereinafter set forth: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby further amend the schedules referred to in section 20 of the Poisons Act, 1964, as amended by the abovementioned Orders in Council in the manner set out in the Appendix to this Order in Council.

APPENDIX.

- (a) Immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
 - (b) in such positions as would divide the land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.
- (5) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained, or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and such bulldozing, chaining and preparing of the bush is completed after the 15th day of November, 1967, you shall, within 28 days of completing the bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 1 chain wide in the following positions on that land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated:—
- (a) Immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
 - (b) in such positions as would divide land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.

If for any reason it is considered to be impractical to clear firebreaks or to remove the inflammable material from land as required by part A of this notice you may apply in writing to the Council or its duly authorised officer, on or before the 1st day of November, 1967, for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Public Service Allowances (Miscellaneous)
Agreement, 1967.

No. 2 of 1967.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966, of Western Australia, this twenty-sixth day of October, 1967, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated (hereinafter referred to as the Association) of the one part and the Public Service Commissioner (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth that the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Public Service Allowances (Miscellaneous) Agreement, 1967 and supersedes and replaces the Public Service Allowances Agreement, 1961, dated the 20th day of April, 1961 insofar as it relates to those allowances enumerated in clause 2 hereof.

2.—Arrangement.

4. Definitions.
5. Meal Allowance.
6. Travelling Allowance.
7. Transfer Allowance.
8. Removal Allowance.
9. Relieving Allowance.

14. Board Allowance for Annual Leave.
15. Dirty Work Allowance.

3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers and temporary employees, hereinafter referred to as officers, employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904-1966, whose offices are not included in the Special Division of the Public Service.

4.—Definitions.

In this Agreement, the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the meaning hereby respectively applied to them, namely:—

"Metropolitan Area" means that area within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the Perth Railway Station.

Reference throughout this Agreement to an "Item" by number shall be construed as a reference to the Item bearing the corresponding number in the Schedule appearing at the end of the clause in which such reference appears.

"Public Service Holidays" means the days mentioned in Section 57 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1966, and any other days which the Governor may appoint as public service holidays under the said Act.

5.—Meal Allowance.

(a) An officer required to work before or after prescribed working hours on any week day, shall, when such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from his usual place of residence, be reimbursed for each meal purchased at the rate of 80 cents for breakfast and \$1 for the evening

meal: Provided that the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two hours. Such reimbursement shall be in addition to any payment for overtime to which he is entitled.

(b) An officer required to work on a Saturday, Sunday or public service holiday shall, when such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from his usual place of residence, be reimbursed for each meal purchased at the rate of 80 cents for breakfast, 85 cents for the midday meal and \$1 for the evening meal: Provided that the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two hours. Such reimbursement shall be in addition to any payment for overtime to which he is entitled.

6.—Travelling Allowance.
Intra-State.

(a) If an officer travels on official business between his headquarters and a place situated outside a radius of 15 miles measured from his headquarters, and is necessarily absent from his headquarters overnight, he shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 1 or 2, as the case may require. Where an allowance under this subclause is payable for less than a day the allowance shall represent in equal proportions the expenses for three meals and a bed. For the purposes of computing expenses in respect of arrival at or departure from an officer's headquarters, breakfast shall be allowed for if arrival is later or departure earlier than 8 a.m. lunch if arrival is later or departure earlier than 1 p.m., dinner if arrival is later or departure earlier than 6 p.m., and bed if arrival is later than 11 p.m.

Provided that—

- (i) an officer who travels on official business which does not involve an absence from headquarters overnight, shall only be paid at the rates prescribed by Item 3, as the case may require, subject to the officer's certification that each meal claimed for was actually purchased: Provided that where an officer departs from his headquarters before 8 a.m. and does not arrive back at his headquarters until after 11 p.m. on the same day, he shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 1;
- (ii) when an officer travels by railway and is provided with a sleeping berth, one-fourth deduction shall be made from the daily rate, except when a bed has been paid for elsewhere for a portion of the night and a certificate to that effect is supplied by the officer when lodging his claim;
- (iii) when an officer travels on board a vessel and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses shall be at a rate equal to fifteen per cent. of the passage money calculated on the single fare or one-third of the rate prescribed by Item 1, whichever is the greater; and
- (iv) an officer who, when travelling on official business, stays at any government institution or travels in a ministerial railway coach free of charge, shall only be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 4 or 5, as the case may require, for the period spent at such institution or on such coach.

(b) An officer with headquarters located outside the metropolitan area who travels to Perth on official business and, as a result, is required to stay at a metropolitan hotel over one or more nights, shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 6 for expenses necessarily incurred in respect of such metropolitan hotel accommodation.

If such country officer does not stay at a hotel or is not absent from his headquarters overnight, any expenses necessarily incurred in respect of his travel to Perth shall be reimbursed at the appropriate rate prescribed by subclause (a).

(c) An officer stationed in the metropolitan area who is relieving at or temporarily transferred to any place within that area shall not be reimbursed the cost of midday meals purchased, but an officer

travelling on duty within the metropolitan area which requires his absence from his headquarters over the usual midday meal period shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 7 for each meal necessarily purchased. Provided that—

- (i) such travelling is not within the suburb in which the officer resides; and
- (ii) an officer's total reimbursement under this subclause for any one pay period shall not exceed the amount set out adjacent to Item 8 in the schedule hereto.

Inter-State.

(d) An officer who travels on official business beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 9 or 10, as the case may require. Where an allowance under this subclause is payable for less than a day the allowance shall be computed in accordance with subclause (a) hereof. Provided that—

- (i) when an officer travels by railway between Perth and Adelaide and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses shall be at a rate equal to 15 per cent. of the single fare of such journey;
- (ii) when an officer travels on board a vessel and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses for the time spent at sea or on board vessel shall be at a rate equal to either 15 per cent. of the passage money calculated on single fare or one third of the rate prescribed by Item 1, whichever is the greater; and
- (iii) an officer shall be reimbursed at the rate prescribed by Items 9 and 10, as the case may require, for any period spent in travelling by aircraft to and from Perth or in travelling by aircraft or railway between other States.

General.

(e) If on account of lack of suitable regular transport facilities an officer necessarily engages lodgings in Perth or other place in which his headquarters are situated, for the night prior to commencing travelling in order to travel by an early morning transport, he shall be reimbursed the reasonable cost of such lodging in addition to such other reimbursements authorised by this clause.

(f) An officer who travels on official business shall be allowed first class fares and in addition to any reimbursement of expenses at the appropriate rate prescribed by this clause, shall be reimbursed reasonable incidental expenses by the permanent head such as tram, bus and motor fares.

(g) Reimbursement of expenses at the rates prescribed by this clause shall not be suspended should an officer become ill whilst travelling, provided leave for the period of such illness is approved in accordance with the provisions of the Public Service Regulations.

(h) Where it can be shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioner by the production of receipts or other evidence, that reimbursement under this clause would be insufficient to meet the officer's reasonable accommodation and incidental expenses, he shall be paid the difference fully to reimburse him.

(i) Reimbursement of travelling expenses for a period exceeding 14 days in any one month shall not be passed for payment to any officer by a certifying officer until the endorsement of the permanent head has been obtained on the account.

(j) In all cases where commuted amounts for reimbursement of travelling expenses and cost of conveyance are in operation at the date of the coming into force of this Agreement, such commuted amounts shall continue until reviewed as a result of negotiation between the Association and the Commissioner.

(k) The headquarters of an officer engaged on more than one work shall be considered to be the place in which the principal work is carried out, as defined by the permanent head.

(l) An officer shall use State-owned transport unless otherwise approved by the permanent head.

(m) Whenever an officer does not travel by State-owned transport as per subclause (l) he shall be repaid the actual cost of the necessary and most economical means of conveyance upon furnishing receipts for payment. Receipts shall not be required for any amounts under 50 cents but in lieu thereof a certificate on the account form must be made as follows:—

I certify that the sum of has been actually expended by me on public service.

(n) No officer shall engage other vehicles when there are public conveyances available when required unless authorised by the permanent head.

7.—Transfer Allowance.

Intra-State.

(a) Except as provided in subclause (e) a married or single officer who is transferred to a new locality—

- (i) in the public interest, or
- (ii) in the ordinary course of promotion and transfer, or
- (iii) on account of illness due to causes over which the officer has no control,

shall, in addition to payment of any district allowance, be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 1 or 3, as the case may require, for a period of fourteen days after arrival at his new headquarters: Provided that, if an officer is required to travel on official business during the said period of fourteen days, such period shall be extended by the time spent in travelling. Under no circumstances, however, shall the provisions of this subclause operate concurrently with those of clause 6 so as to permit an officer to be paid allowances in respect of both travelling and transfer expenses for one and the same period.

(b) If a married officer is unable to obtain reasonable accommodation for the transfer of his home within the period of fourteen days referred to in subclause (a), and the permanent head is satisfied that the officer has taken all possible steps to secure reasonable accommodation, such officer shall, after the expiration of the fourteen days, be reimbursed at the rate prescribed by Item 2 or 4, as the case may require, until such time as he

has secured reasonable accommodation: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed seventy-seven days without the approval of the Commissioner. A single officer shall not be paid allowances under this subclause.

Inter-State.

(c) Except as provided in subclause (e) a married or single officer who is transferred to a capital city beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, shall, subject to the relevant provisions of subclause (a), be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 5 for a period of twenty-one days after arrival at his new headquarters.

(d) If a married officer who is transferred to a capital city beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, is unable to obtain reasonable accommodation within the period of twenty-one days referred to in subclause (c) and the permanent head is satisfied that the officer has taken all possible steps to secure reasonable accommodation, such officer shall, after the expiration of the twenty-one days, be reimbursed at the rate prescribed by Item 6, until such time as he has secured reasonable accommodation: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed seventy days without the approval of the Commissioner. A single officer shall not be paid allowances under this subclause.

General.

(e) An officer who is transferred to departmental accommodation shall not be entitled to reimbursement under this clause except where entry into such departmental accommodation is delayed through circumstances beyond his control: Provided that, during the period he is travelling to his new headquarters, payment of travelling allowance in accordance with the provisions of clause 6 shall be made.

(f) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that an allowance payable under this clause would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred by an officer on transfer, an appropriate rate of reimbursement shall be determined by the Commissioner.

(g) The provisions of clause 6 subclauses (1) to (n) inclusive, shall have equal application to this clause.

8.—Removal Allowance.

(a) When a married officer is transferred in the public interest or in the ordinary course of promotion and transfer or on account of illness due to causes over which the officer has no control, he shall be reimbursed—

- (i) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of himself and his wife and children under 16 years of age or other children wholly dependent on him; and
- (ii) subject to the limitations defined in subclause (d) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of his furniture, including insurance of such furniture whilst in transit; and

- (iii) an allowance of \$50 for accelerated depreciation and extra wear and tear on furniture and effects: Provided that the permanent head is satisfied that the value of household furniture moved by the officer is at least \$500.

In the case of a single officer, an application for any reimbursement under this clause shall be considered by the Commissioner, on the recommendation of the permanent head.

(b) An officer who is transferred from one locality to another solely at his own request, or by exchange (except as provided for in subclause (a)), must bear the whole cost of his removal unless otherwise approved by the Commissioner.

(c) When an officer is transferred on account of misconduct, the cost must be borne by the officer at fault, unless otherwise determined by the Commissioner, prior to removal.

(d) The maximum reimbursement for cost of conveyance of furniture, including insurance whilst in transit, shall be \$400 unless a higher sum is approved by the Commissioner in any special case: Provided that only necessary household furniture and effects shall be taken into consideration.

(e) An officer shall be reimbursed the full freight charges necessarily incurred in respect of the removal of his motor vehicle. If authorised by the permanent head to travel to the new locality in his own motor vehicle reimbursement shall be as follows:—

- (i) Where the officer will be required to maintain a motor vehicle for use on official business at his new headquarters, reimbursement for the distance necessarily travelled shall be on the basis of one half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 15 of the Public Service Allowances Agreement, 1961 and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreement or award made in substitution thereof.
- (ii) Where the officer will not be required to maintain a motor vehicle for use on official business at his new headquarters, reimbursement for the distance necessarily travelled shall be on the basis of one half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 15 of the Public Service Allowances Agreement, 1961 and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreement or award made in substitution thereof.

(f) Furniture, and effects, where practicable shall be removed by State-owned transport.

(g) Before removal is undertaken, the officer shall, where practicable, obtain quotes from at least two carriers which shall be submitted to the permanent head, who may authorise the acceptance of the more suitable: Provided that the maximum amount prescribed by subclause (d) is not exceeded without the written approval of the Commissioner having first been obtained.

(h) Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid.

(i) The permanent head may, in lieu of cost of conveyance, authorise payment of an amount not exceeding the maximum prescribed by subclause (d) to compensate for loss in any case where an officer with prior approval of the permanent head, disposes of his furniture and effects instead of removing them to his new headquarters: Provided that such payment shall not exceed the sum which would have been paid if such furniture and effects had been removed by the cheapest method of transport available.

(j) Where an officer is transferred to departmental accommodation where furniture is provided and as a consequence is obliged to store his own furniture, he shall be reimbursed the actual cost of such storage up to a maximum allowance of

\$100 per annum. An allowance under this subclause shall not be paid for a period in excess of one year without the approval of the Commissioner.

9.—Relieving Allowance.
Intra-State.

(a) A married or single officer who is required to take up duty away from his usual headquarters to relieve another officer or to perform special duty, and necessarily lodges or resides temporarily away from his usual place of residence, shall, except where otherwise provided, be paid, in addition to any district allowance, at the rate prescribed by Item 1 or 4, as the case may require, up to a maximum period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the new locality.

(b) If the period of relief or special duty exceeds twenty-eight days, a married officer shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 2 or 5 and a single officer shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 3 or 6 as the case may require for the period of relief on special duty in excess of twenty-eight days. Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed sixty-three days without the approval of the Commissioner.

(c) If an officer, whose normal duties do not involve camp accommodation, is required to relieve or perform special duty resulting in a stay at a camp, he shall be paid camp allowance in accordance with the provisions of clause 10, for the duration of the period spent in camp, and, in addition, shall be paid a lump sum of \$20 to cover incidental personal expenses: Provided that an officer shall receive no more than one lump sum grant of \$20 in any one period of three years.

(d) When an officer, who is required to relieve or perform special duties in accordance with subclause (a), is authorised by the permanent head to travel to the new locality in his own motor vehicle he shall be reimbursed for the return journey as follows:

(i) Where the officer will be required to maintain a motor vehicle for the performance of the relieving or special duties, reimbursement shall be in accordance with the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 15 of the Public Service Allowances Agreement, 1961, and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreement or award made in substitution thereof.

(ii) Where the officer will not be required to maintain a motor vehicle for the performance of the relieving or special duties, reimbursement shall be on the basis of one half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 15 of the Public Service Allowances Agreement, 1961, and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreement or award made in substitution thereof.

Provided that the maximum amount of reimbursement under paragraph (ii) of this subclause shall not exceed the cost of the first class fare by public conveyance which otherwise would be utilised for such return journey.

Inter-State.

(e) A married or single officer who is required to relieve another officer or perform special duty outside the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 7, up to a maximum of twenty-eight days after arrival at the new locality.

(f) If the period of relief or special duty exceeds twenty-eight days, a married officer shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 8, and a single officer at the rate prescribed by Item 9, as the case may require, for the period of relief or special duty in excess of twenty-eight days: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed sixty-three days without the approval of the Commissioner.

General.

(g) The rate applicable to a married officer under sub-clause (b) and (f) shall be paid to a single officer if the Commissioner is satisfied that the officer has to maintain a home and support dependent relatives therein, in a locality other than that to which he has been sent. A certificate to this effect must be furnished by a single officer claiming the higher rate.

(h) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that an allowance payable under this clause would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred, an appropriate rate of reimbursement shall be determined by the Commissioner.

(i) The provisions of clause 6 shall not operate concurrently with the provisions of this clause so as to permit an officer to be paid allowances in respect of both travelling and relieving expenses for the one and the same period: Provided that the provisions of subclauses (1) to (n) of clause 6 shall have equal applications to this clause.

10.—Camp Allowance.

(a) An officer who, in accordance with his duty, is stationed in a fixed camp provided by a Department, or is occupying a caravan located in a fixed camp, shall be paid an allowance at the rate prescribed by Item 1 or 2 as the case may require, for the period spent in such camp: Provided that no such allowance shall be paid when an officer occupies a departmental house within or near the precincts of a camp.

(b) For the purpose of this clause a "fixed camp" shall be a camp of a permanent nature where living facilities of a good standard are provided.

(c) Whenever an officer provided with a caravan is obliged to park the caravan in a caravan parking area, he shall, in addition to payment of the appropriate rate prescribed by Item 1 or 2, be reimbursed any rental charges paid to the authority controlling the caravan parking area.

(d) An officer, who, in accordance with his duty, is stationed in a camp provided by a Department (other than a fixed camp) or is required to camp out, shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 3 or 4, as the case may require. The rates prescribed by this subclause shall be reduced by the amount prescribed by Item 7 when a fitted caravan is provided.

(e) If an officer is authorised by the permanent head to stay at a hotel or lodging house in lieu of camping out, he shall be paid at the appropriate rate prescribed by clause 6 for such period concerned.

(f) The rates prescribed by subclauses (a), (c) and (d) shall be increased by the amount prescribed by Item 5 when a cook is not provided in a camp, and shall be increased by the amount prescribed by Item 6 when a camp is located north of the 26th degree of south latitude including Shark Bay.

(g) Payment of the rates prescribed by subclauses (a), (c) and (d) shall be made on the basis of a seven day week and no deduction shall be made when an officer does not spend the whole or part of his weekend in camp: Provided that payment for any broken portion of a week shall be based on the appropriate daily rate for the number of days actually spent in camp and payment for any portion of a day shall be computed in accordance with clause 6 (a).

(h) A single officer who supplies proof that he is the main support of relatives resident in the State, may, with the approval of the Commissioner, be paid the rates applicable to a married officer under this clause.

(i) This clause shall be read in conjunction with clauses 6, 7 and 9 for the purposes of payment of allowances and payment of camp allowance shall not be made for any period in respect of which travelling, transfer or relieving expenses are reimbursed.

11.—Boat Allowance.

(a) An officer who, in accordance with his duty, is required to live aboard a departmental vessel, shall be paid an allowance at the rate prescribed by Item 1 or 2, as the case may require, for the period he is required to live on board such vessel.

(b) The rate prescribed by subclause (a) shall be increased by the amount prescribed by Item 3 when a cook is not provided on board a vessel, and shall be increased by the amount prescribed by Item 4 when the vessel is operating north of the 26th degree of South latitude including Shark Bay.

(c) A single officer who supplies proof that he is the main support of relatives resident in the State, may, with the approval of the Commissioner, be paid the rates applicable to married officer under this clause.

(d) Payment of the rates prescribed in subclauses (a) and (b) shall be made on the basis of a seven day week provided that payment for any broken portion of a week shall be based on the appropriate daily rate for the number of days an officer actually lives on board a vessel and payment for any portion of a day shall be computed in accordance with clause 6 (a).

(e) Payment of allowances under this clause shall not be made for any period in respect of which travelling, camp, transfer, or relieving expenses are reimbursed.

12.—Allowance to Officers Paying Wages.

(a) An officer away from his headquarters, other than one whose classified duties include the payment of wages, shall, when paying wages outside the metropolitan area or at construction works within the metropolitan area, or at such other works as may be approved by the Commissioner, be paid an allowance of 70 cents per day or part of any day whilst so engaged in recognition of the added responsibilities. Provided that—

- (i) the allowance shall not exceed \$1.40 in any one week;
- (ii) no allowance shall be paid to an officer when in receipt of higher duties allowance for relieving or acting in a position, the classified duties of which include the payment of wages; and
- (iii) no allowance shall be paid to an officer whose gross salary exceeds the maximum prescribed for Class 3 in Schedule A of the "Public Service (Clerical Division) Salaries Agreement, 1966", and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreements or awards made in substitution thereof.

(b) An officer employed in the metropolitan area, when paying wages outside that area, shall, in addition to any allowance payable in accordance with subclause (a), be paid an allowance of 70 cents per day or part of any day whilst so engaged in compensation for damage to clothing and disabilities encountered.

13.—Allowance to Officers Receiving and Paying Cash.

(a) An officer, other than one who is in receipt of higher duties allowance in respect of such work, who relieves in an office classified higher than his own which requires him to receive or pay cash, shall be paid an allowance at the rate of 70 cents per day or 35 cents per half day whilst so engaged.

(b) An allowance so payable shall not exceed, in any one week the difference between the officers weekly rate of salary and the minimum weekly rate of salary for the office in which he is relieving.

(c) For the purpose of this clause half a day shall mean any period of not more than three hours but not less than one hour on any day.

14.—Board Allowance for Annual Leave.

When on annual leave, an officer who does not avail himself of the board and lodgings provided in his classification shall be granted an allowance for the period of his leave at the rate of \$3.00 per week.

15.—Dirty Work Allowance.

A special allowance, to be determined by the Commissioner, shall be paid to an officer when engaged in any dirty work (including moving or sorting old books and documents) which is not part of the regular duty of the officer concerned: Provided that a dispute or disagreement as to the amount of such allowance shall be deemed to be a dispute or disagreement within the meaning of section 11 (1) (f) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966.

16.—Special Conditions.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed so as to take away from the Association the right to make a claim under Section 11 (1) (d) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966, in respect of a specific occupational group covered by this Agreement.

17.—Copies of Agreement.

Every officer shall be entitled to a copy of this Agreement free of charge on application to his or her Officer-in-Charge.

18.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate as from and including the 29th September, 1967, and shall remain in force for a period of three years from that date, provided that either of the parties may after the 29th September, 1968, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement or approach the Arbitrator for an amendment to this Agreement.
