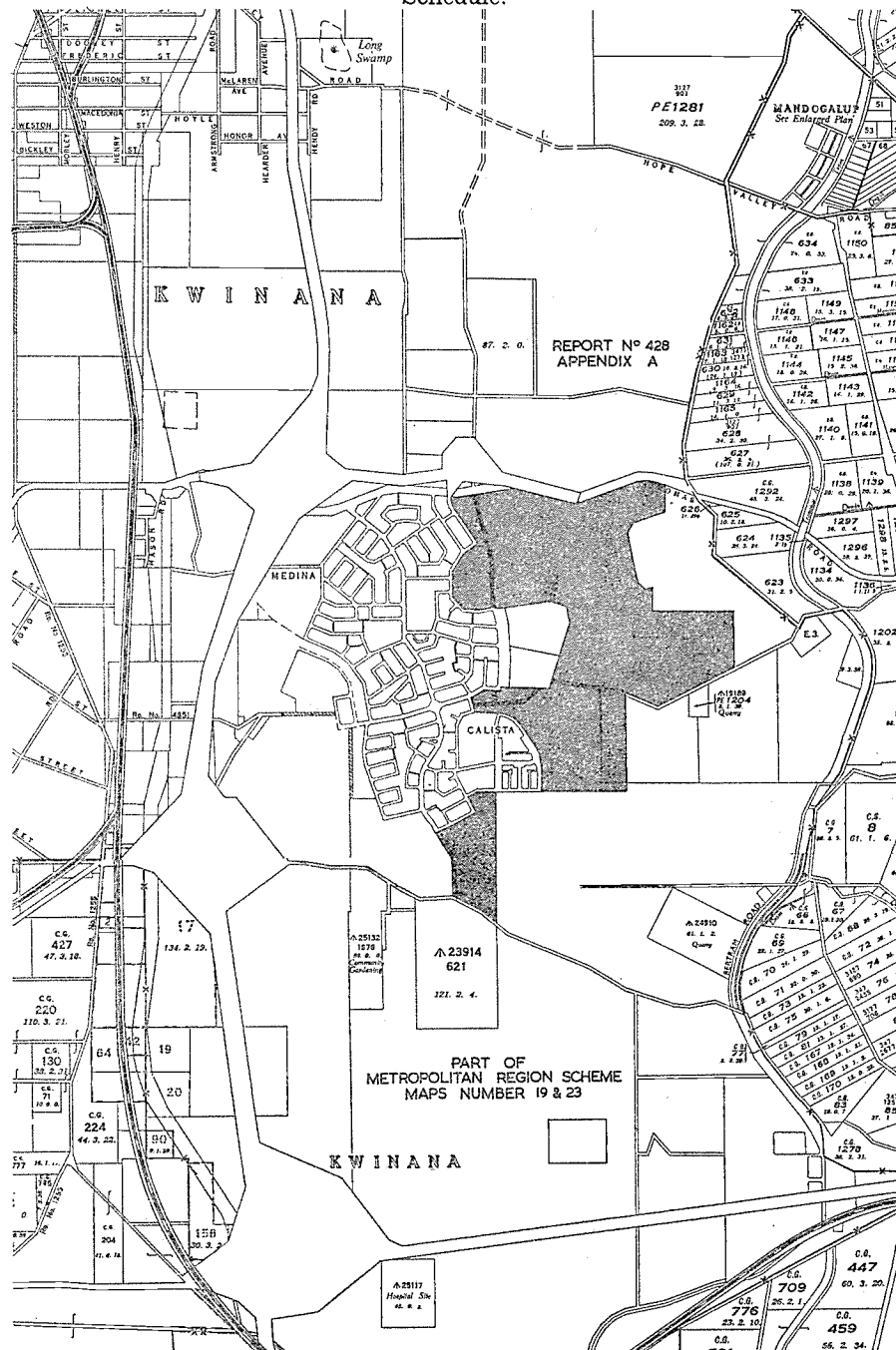

1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Bayswater Town Planning Scheme No. 12.—Coode-Lawrence Streets Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

2. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Bayswater (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

3. Maps: The following maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:—

Plan No. 1 (Existing Use).
Plan No. 2 (Scheme Proposals).

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land coloured blue on Plan No. 1. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To plan the subdivision of the Scheme Area.
- (c) To make suitable provision for roads and traffic within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To ensure the proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage.
- (e) All land within the Scheme Area shall be supplied with reticulated water.

6. Scheme Works: The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:—

- (a) The Scheme Area shall be surveyed in conformity with the design shown on Plan No. 2 with such minor variations as may be determined from time to time by the Council.
- (b) The lands shown as a road on Plan No. 2 of which the carriage-way is coloured yellow shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earth work undertaken.
- (c) A culvert shall be constructed under Gum-mery Street where shown on Plan No. 2.
- (d) Levelling filling and drainage works shall be carried out where necessary or desirable.
- (e) The reticulation of water to the new lots within the Scheme Area.
- (f) Those buildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the land within the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision will be demolished or otherwise removed and in cases considered desirable by the Council such fences and buildings may be re-erected.

7. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is in the opinion of the Council necessary to implement the the Council.

8. Costs of Scheme: The Scheme shall be debited with—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme, including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead or supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme.
- (b) The costs of the works to be carried out.
- (c) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (d) The estimated compensation and the costs payable in respect thereof under the provisions of the following clause.
- (e) The cost of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of any such land being acquired other than by resumption.
- (f) Any contribution made or to be made to the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage & Drainage Board in respect of drainage works for reticulation services.
- (g) The cost of altering existing electricity water sewerage drainage or telephone services or of providing exceptional services rendered necessary by the Scheme to the extent to which and in cases where the Council considers the cost justified.

9. Estimate of Compensation: In the event of any claim for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance of this Scheme the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the net amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

12. Nature of Offers: The offers mentioned in the preceding clause shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and shall be served by registered post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council, and shall specify the new lot on Plan No. 2 the subject of the offer and the old lot or part thereof on Plan No. 1 in respect of which the offer is made. The offer shall also specify the total scheme costs and the proportion thereof payable by the owner to the Council.

13. The offer shall indicate that the owner to whom the offer is made may either —

- (a) accept the offer of the transfer to him of the new lot in which case the amount shown as the owner's proportion of the Scheme costs shall be payable by him to the Council; or

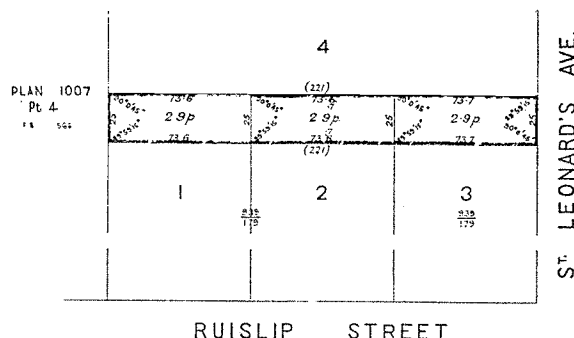
