WHEREAS it is enacted by section 433 (A) of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, *inter alia*, make and publish in the *Government Gazette* uniform general by-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a Council under Part XV of the Act, and by Order declare that all or any such uniform general by-laws as are specified in the Order, shall apply to the whole or any portion of a district so specified; and whereas the Governor has so made and published the uniform general by-laws, hereinafter in this Order appearing; now, therefore, His Excellency, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid both hereby declare that the whole of each of the uniform general by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th October, 1965, and amendments thereto published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter shall apply to the townsites of Muchea, Wannamal and Bindoon within the district of the municipality of the Shire of Chittering.

Alteration of Wards—Increase of Membership and Direction Concerning Election.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 627/67.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraphs (g) and (h) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960 that the Governor may, upon effectual presentation of a petition bearing the Common Seal of the Municipality, alter the boundaries of Wards existing in the district or create new wards in a district; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (j) of the said subsection that the Governor may, within the limits prescribed by this Act, determine and alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of subsection (4) that the Governor may give effect to an alteration in the number of members of a Council; and whereas it is further provided by subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act that where the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12 he may direct the holding, on a day appointed by the Order, of an election to elect members so affected; and whereas the municipality of the Shire of Coolgardie has submitted a petition under its Common Seal praying for the

division of the Country Ward into two Wards to be known as the Country Ward and the Kambalda Ward, respectively, and to increase the membership by two members; and whereas it is considered expedient to grant the prayer of the petition: now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (1) Alter the boundaries of the existing Country Ward by the creation therefrom of a new Ward to be designated the Kambalda Ward as described in the schedule hereto, leaving the remaining portion as the Country Ward,
- (2) Alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to the Municipality from 9 to 11 and determine that the additional two members shall be allocated to the Kambalda Ward;
- (3) direct that on the 3rd day of February, 1968, an election shall be held to elect two members for the Kambalda Ward.

southerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the northwestern boundary of Location 12735; thence generally southwesterly, northeasterly, northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to the western boundary of location 21709; thence southerly and north-easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western boundary of Location 21704; thence northerly along that prolongation to the southernmost southern boundary of Location 19529; thence easterly along that boundary and the southern boundary of location 11295 to the western boundary of Location 16623; thence southerly and generally easterly along boundaries of that location to the northeastern corner of Location 21730; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that location to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the westernmost northern boundary of Location 21978; thence easterly, northerly, northeasterly and southerly along boundaries of that location to the northern boundary of Location 23986; thence easterly along that boundary to the southeastern corner of Location 18480; thence easterly to the southwestern corner of Location 21891; thence easterly along southern boundaries of that location and location 18661 to the southeastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence easterly, southerly, again easterly and northerly along boundaries of location 21985 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 18692; thence easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to the western boundary of location 18690; thence southerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and easterly along southern boundaries of locations 18689 and 18694 to the western boundary of location 18698; thence southerly along that boundary and onwards to the northern boundary of location 23506; thence generally easterly along that boundary and northern boundaries of location 23611, Roe locations 1716, 1717, 2104, 2105, 2085, 2086, 1713, 1815 again 1713 and 1288 to the northeastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence easterly to the southwestern corner of location 1044; thence generally southerly and easterly to and along boundaries of location 1514 to its southeastern corner; thence northerly 65 chains along the easternmost eastern boundary of that location; thence east to the western boundary of location 2370; thence southerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and easterly and northerly along boundaries of location 1516 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Location 1509; thence easterly to and along that boundary and northern boundaries of location 2494 and 2495 and onwards to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of location 1408; thence northerly along that prolongation to the southwestern corner of that location; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that location to its southernmost southeastern corner; thence southeasterly to and along the southwestern boundary of location 1132 to its southern corner; thence northeasterly along the southeastern boundary of that location and onwards to the western boundary of location 1133; thence northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and generally easterly along northern boundaries of location 1407 to the north-eastern corner of the lastmentioned location, a point on the southern side of a protected road passing along northern boundaries of that location, through location 2488 and Reserve 19770; thence generally easterly along that side and generally northeasterly along northwestern boundaries of location 1124 to the northern corner of that location; thence generally southeasterly along northeastern boundaries of that location and location 1405 to intersect with a line joining the north-eastern corner of Avon Location 23611 and the 133 Mile Peg on the No. 1 Rabbit Proof Fence; thence easterly along that line to the southwestern boundary of Roe Location 2426; thence generally southeasterly along that boundary and generally easterly and northerly along boundaries of location 1120 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of a southern boundary of location 1119;

## WESTERN AUSTRALIAN TROTTING ASSOCIATION.

## Amendment of By-laws.

THE following resolution was passed by an absolute majority in number of the Committee:—

That By-law 99 in the First Schedule of the Western Australian Trotting Association Act of 1946 be repealed and the following substituted:—

99. The following by-law shall apply exclusively to place totalisators and, subject thereto, the foregoing by-laws shall also apply.

- (a) (i) If eight or more horses remain in a race when the totalisator is opened on that race, three separate pools (one for each horse placed first, second or third) shall be established and dividends calculated for the horses placed first, second and third respectively in the manner hereinafter set out.
- (ii) If five, six or seven horses remain in a race when the totalisator is opened on that race, two separate pools (one for the horse placed first and one for the horse placed second) shall be established and dividends calculated for the horses placed first and second respectively in the manner hereinafter set out.
- (iii) If less than five horses remain in a race when the win totalisator is opened, the place totalisator shall not be opened.

(b) Calculation of Dividend—

- (i) There shall be deducted from the total amount invested for a place in each race the total amount of the winning bets, i.e., the aggregate of the amounts invested on the horses placed first, second and third, or first and second, as the case may be.
- (ii) The balance then remaining (being the aggregate of the losing bets in that race) shall be divided equally between each pool. There shall then be added to the pool for each placed horse the amount invested on that horse.
- (iii) A commission equal to fifteen per centum shall then be deducted from each pool and the dividend for each pool calculated by dividing the amount remaining in each pool by the number of winning tickets (based on a unit investment of fifty cents (50c) per ticket) on the horse the subject of the pool.

(c) Dead Heats:

In the event of a dead heat which does not necessitate the payment of an additional dividend the following shall apply:—

- (i) There shall be a pool for each such horse.
- (ii) The provisions of subparagraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (b) shall apply *mutatis mutandis*.

In the event of a dead heat which does necessitate the payment of an additional dividend or dividends the following shall apply:—

- (i) For the purpose of subparagraph (i) or (ii) of paragraph (a) (as the case may be) the respective amounts invested on the horses in the dead heat shall be divided by the number of horses in the dead heat and a sub-pool of the amount so obtained constituted for each such horse.
- (ii) There shall be added to each sub-pool an amount obtained by dividing the principal pool constituted under subparagraph (i) or (ii) of paragraph (a) (as the case may be) in respect of the place relative to the horses in the dead heat by the number of horses in the dead heat.
- (iii) The dividend payable for each horse in the dead heat shall then be calculated in the manner set out in paragraph (b).
- (d) If only one horse be placed by the Judge, investors on such horse will divide the whole of the amount invested less commission and other proper deductions.
- (e) If only two horses be placed subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (a) shall apply and the dividends shall be calculated in accordance with paragraph (b).

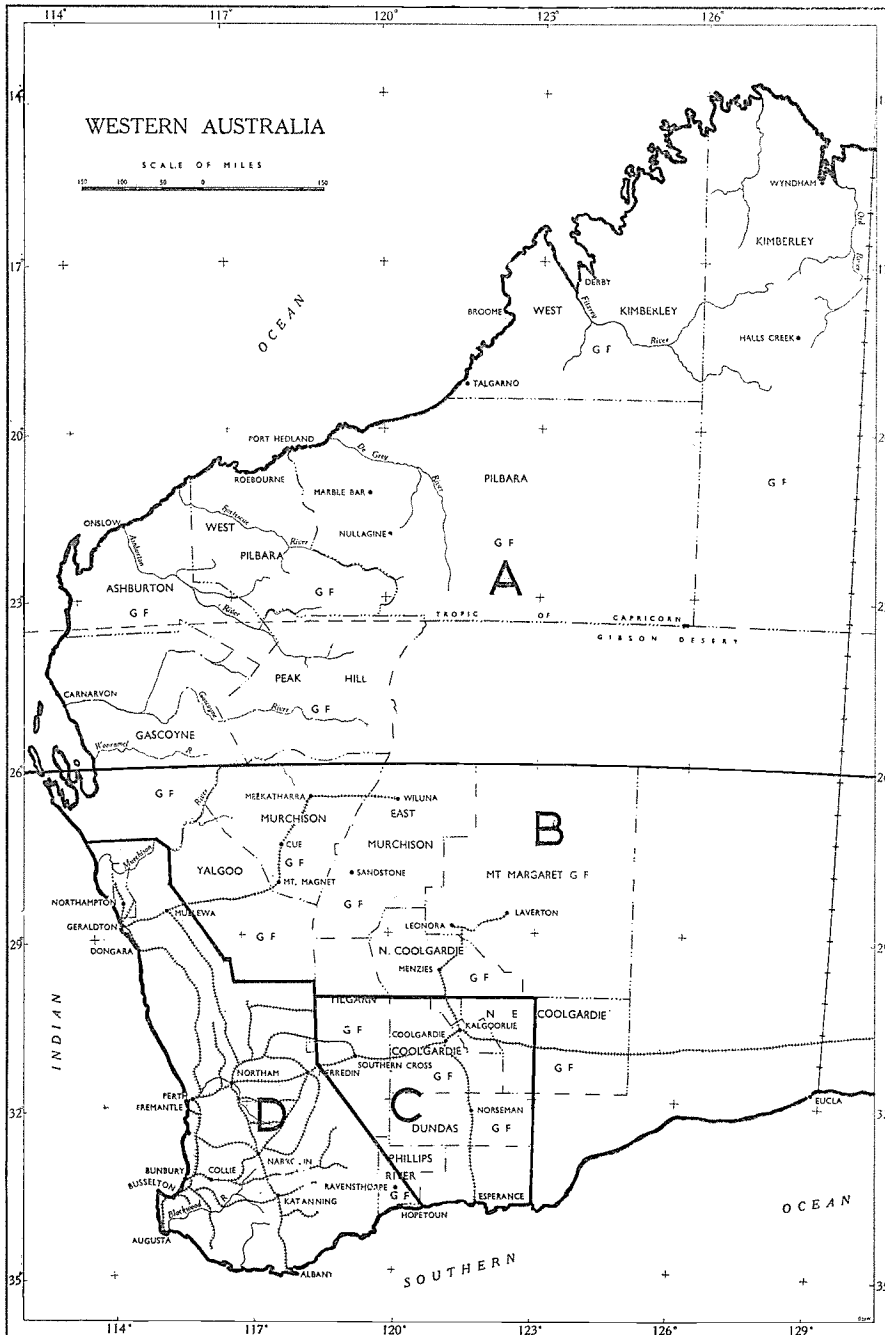
