WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Local Government Act Amendment Act, 1967 that that Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by proclamation, and that it shall not be necessary to proclaim that the whole of the Act shall come into operation on one date but the several sections of the Act may be proclaimed to come into operation on such dates as are respectively fixed by proclamation: Now, therefore, I the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby—

- (a) fix the date on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette* as the date on which the provisions of the Local Government Act Amendment Act, 1967, other than sections 24 and 26 of that Act, shall come into operation; and
- (b) fix the 1st day of July, 1968 as the date on which sections 24 and 26 of the Local Government Act Amendment Act, 1967 shall come into operation.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres. 2307/63 (R.1874).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the Public street: And whereas the Shire of Mandurah has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within its municipal district be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.
