IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the afternoon of 13th January, 1968, to seven o'clock in the afternoon of 30th April, 1968, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Third Schedule hereto in that part of the State which lies within the boundaries of the shires specified in the First Schedule hereto, with the exception of those areas defined in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) That from five o'clock in the forenoon of 14th January, 1968, to seven o'clock in the afternoon of 30th April, 1968, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck defined in the Third Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the

South-West and Eucla Divisions as defined in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933, with the exceptions of those areas defined in the First and Second Schedules hereto.

- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture, or for the purpose of sale.
- (4) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (5) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shot-gun, provided that this restriction shall not prohibit a person who is a native, within the meaning of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1954, from using any native artifact in the taking of wild ducks.

#### First Schedule.

Harvey, Dardanup, Collie, Donnybrook, Capel, Busselton, Augusta-Margaret River, Nannup, Balingup, Greenbushes, Bridgetown, and Manjimup Shires.

#### Second Schedule.

##### General Areas:

- (1) All municipalities and townsites in the South-West Land Division.
- (2) All State Forests, timber reserves, town reservoirs and other areas where shooting is prohibited under the provisions of any other Act, regulation or by-law.

- (4) The whole of the Rockingham Shire.

##### Albany Shire:

- (5) The whole of the waters of Lake Seppings and all land within 20 chains of its shores.
- (6) The whole of the waters of Nannarup (or Taylor) Inlet and all the land within 20 chains of its shores.
- (7) The whole of the waters of the King and Kalgan Rivers and all land within 20 chains of their banks.
- (8) The whole of the waters of Oyster and Princess Royal Harbours and all land within 20 chains of their shores.

##### Balingup Shire:

- (9) The whole of the area within a radius of 1½ miles from the Post Office of Balingup.

##### Busselton Shire:

- (10) The whole of the waters of the Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (11) The whole of the waters of the Vasse River and all land within 20 chains of its banks.
- (12) The whole of reserves 3872 and 3876 (Public Utilities) in the Broadwater.

##### Capel Shire:

- (13) All that portion of the Capel River between the Capel and Stirling bridges and all land within 20 chains of the river's bank.

##### Corrigin Shire:

- (14) The whole of reserves 12899 and 12900 at Nambadilling.

##### Dandaragan Shire:

- (15) The whole of Caro Swamp and all land within 80 chains of its shores.

##### Dumbleyung Shire:

- (16) All that portion of the Cobline River downstream from the eastern side of the bridge at the junction of road 3375 and road 323 (Oxley Road) to the prolongation eastwards of the southern boundary of Kojonup location 3928 and all land within 20 chains of that part of the river's banks.

##### Gingin Shire:

- (17) The whole of the waters of Lakes Nambung, Bambun and Mungala and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (18) The whole of Swan Location 2340 including Wallering Swamp.

##### Gnowangerup Shire:

- (19) The whole of the land and waters contained within reserves 21646 and 21647 in the Wellstead and Beaufort Estuaries, respectively.

##### Harvey Shire:

- (20) All those waters of the Leschenault Inlet extending southwards from a line drawn southeast from Waterloo Head (Belvedere), on the west foreshore to a point on the opposite foreshore and all land within 20 chains of the included foreshores.
- (21) The whole of the Harvey Catchment area.

##### Mandurah Shire:

- (22) The whole of the area within a radius of 2 miles of the Post Office at Mandurah.

##### Manjimup Shire:

- (23) All that part of the waters of Lake Muir lying north and east of a line drawn from the north-eastern corner of Nelson Location 1330, to the northernmost point of Nelson Location 9246, and all within 80 chains of the northwestern, northern and eastern shores of the said lake between the said locations.
- (24) The whole of the waters of Byenup Lagoon and all land and waters within 3 miles of its shores, including the whole of the waters of Tordit-Gurrup Lagoon, and Poorginup, Neeranup and Coorinup Swamps and all land within 80 chains of their shores.

##### Mundaring Shire:

- (25) The whole of the waters of Lake Leschenaultia and all the land within 20 chains of its shores.

##### Murray Shire:

- (26) All that portion of the Serpentine River from road 8629 at the southern end of Goegrup (Willies) Lake to Peel Inlet near the Old Mill and all the land within 20 chains of the river banks.

##### Rockingham Shire:

- (27) The whole of the shire of Rockingham.

##### Toodyay Shire:

- (28) All that portion of the Avon River in the Toodyay District between the northern boundary of Avon Location 3 and a point opposite road number 2069, and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.
- (29) All that portion of the Avon River from Dumbarton Bridge to the Railway Bridge north of Toodyay, and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.

##### Upper Blackwood:

- (30) The whole of the area within a radius of 2½ miles of the Post Office at Boyup Brook.

##### Wanneroo Shire:

- (31) The whole of the Yanchep Caves Reserve.

##### Wickepin Shire:

- (32) The whole of the waters of Lake Yealering and all land within 20 chains of its shores.

##### Woodanilling Shire:

- (33) The whole of the Waters of Wardering Lake and all land within 20 chains of its shores.

## SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1964.

WE, the Honourable Sir Albert Wolff, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, the Honourable Sir Lawrence Walter Jackson, Kt., Senior Puisne Judge, and the Honourable Roy Vivian Nevile, the Honourable Gordon Bede D'Arcy, the Honourable John Hale, and the Honourable Oscar Joseph Negus, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, being a majority of the Judges of the said Court, acting in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1964, the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act, 1943-1967, and of every other power enabling us in this behalf, hereby amend Order LIX of The Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, as follows:—

1. Rule 1 is amended by adding after paragraph (k) the following paragraph:—

(l) Appeals from the Third Party Claims Tribunal.

2. The following rule is added after rule 10:—

11. (1) Subject to this rule, the provisions of these Rules relating to appeals to the Full Court from a Judge shall apply so far as is practicable to and in relation to appeals to the Full Court from the Third Party Claims Tribunal (in this rule called "the Tribunal").

(2) An appeal shall be instituted by notice of motion which shall be served and filed within twenty-one days from the date of the decision, determination or judgment appealed from or within such extended time as may be fixed by the Full Court or a Judge.

(3) When an appeal is instituted, the Registrar of the Tribunal shall forthwith upon a request being made by the Master transmit to the Master:—

- (a) a certified copy of the pleadings and other documents (not being exhibits) that were before the Tribunal in the proceedings out of which the appeal arises;
- (b) certified copies of the record of evidence and of the reasons for judgment in those proceedings;
- (c) a certified copy of the decision, determination or judgment appealed from; and
- (d) a list of the exhibits adduced in evidence or marked for identification and, so far as is practicable, the original exhibits.

No. 6 of 1967.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966, of Western Australia this twenty-second day of December, 1967, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated (hereinafter referred to as the Association) of the one part and the Public Service Commissioner (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth that the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

## 1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Public Service (Administrative and Clerical Officers) Salaries Agreement No. 6 of 1967.

## 2.—Arrangement.

## 3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all Government Officers who are employed in the Administrative and Clerical Divisions under and within the meaning of the Public Service Act, 1904-1966.

## 4.—Adjustment of Salary Rates.

The salary rates prescribed by this Agreement shall be varied to the extent necessary to give effect to any decision of the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission in a National Wage Case, made during the currency of this Agreement and expressed to be on general economic grounds and which has general application.

## 5.—Male Officers—Salary Classes and Grades.

(a) Except where otherwise provided in this Agreement, the classes and grades applicable to male officers in the Administrative and Clerical Divisions shall be as indicated in Schedule A.

(b) In allocating salaries or salary ranges, in accordance with section 12 of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966, the Commissioner may amalgamate any two classes.

## 6.—Male Officers—Automatic Range.

(a) The rates of pay for male clerical automatic range officers shall be as follows:—

Age or Year of Adult Service	\$ per Annum
16 years of age	1,263

20 years of age	2,292
21 years of age or first year of adult service	2,452

(b) Classes and grades beyond a salary of \$3,200 per annum shall be those set out in Schedule A to this Agreement, provided that an officer shall not be eligible for promotion to a position above the automatic range or to claim or receive a salary higher than a salary of \$3,200 per annum, until he has passed a promotional examination as determined by the Commissioner from time to time or has acquired equal or higher qualifications as approved by the Commissioner.

(c) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment to the automatic range may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

(d) A male clerical automatic range officer who is a married man or is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the Commissioner, shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale of the automatic range, with a maximum salary, inclusive of such allowance of \$3,200 per annum.

(e) A male clerk appointed to the automatic range who, at the date of such appointment, has successfully completed—

- (i) English and three other subjects including either Mathematics A, Mathematics B, General Mathematics, Economics or Accountancy at the Leaving Certificate examination of the University of Western Australia; or
- (ii) the Promotional Examination as determined by the Public Service Commissioner from time to time; or
- (iii) such examinations as may be accepted by the Public Service Commissioner as being of a standard equivalent to or higher than that attained in acquiring the requirements contained in paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subclause;

shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum on and from the date of his appointment to the automatic range.

(f) A male clerk appointed to the automatic range who, subsequent to the date of such appointment, successfully completes one of the examination requirements, contained in paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of subclause (e), shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum on and from the first day of the month following the date on which the final examination paper was held.

(g) Payment of an allowance prescribed by subclause (c) or subclause (f) shall be in addition to any allowance received by the officer in accordance with the provisions of subclause (d).

(h) Payment of an allowance prescribed by subclause (e) or subclause (f) shall cease on the date when—

- (i) the officer becomes eligible to receive a Qualifications Allowance in accordance with clause 9 of this Agreement; or
- (ii) the officer becomes eligible to receive an allowance in accordance with subclause (i) of this clause.

(i) A male clerical automatic range officer who has passed the promotional examination or has acquired equal or higher qualifications approved by the Commissioner, and who has been retained on the maximum salary of the automatic range for at least one year, shall be paid an allowance of \$140 per annum which shall be increased to \$280 per annum on completion of a further year's service on the automatic range. Thereafter the allowance shall be increased—

- (i) to \$420 per annum when the officer has been in receipt of the allowance of \$280 per annum for a period of twelve months; and
- (ii) to \$560 per annum on the completion of a further twelve months' service.

## Provided that—

- (a) an allowance under this subclause shall not be granted unless the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties;
- (b) on the promotion of an officer to a higher position, any allowance received by him under this subclause shall be reduced by the amount which is required to bring his salary up to the minimum salary of the position to which he is promoted, and thereafter, any allowance still received by the officer shall be reduced and converted to salary as and when the officer becomes eligible for annual grade increments; and
- (c) an allowance paid under this subclause shall cease, should the officer refuse to accept promotion.
- (j) a Male clerk classified in a Class 1 position shall be paid an allowance of \$140 per annum after completion of twelve months' service on the maximum salary of such Class 1 position, which allowance shall increase to \$280 per annum after completion of a further twelve months' service.

## Provided that—

- (a) in each case, the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties;
- (b) on the promotion of an officer to a higher position, any allowance received by him under this subclause shall be reduced by the amount which is required to bring his salary up to the minimum salary of the position to which he is promoted, and thereafter, any allowance still received by the officer shall be reduced and converted to salary as and when the officer becomes eligible for annual grade increments;
- (c) an allowance paid under this subclause shall cease, should the officer refuse to accept promotion; and
- (d) an officer shall not be eligible to receive an allowance under this subclause unless he has completed not less than nine years' service in the Clerical Division as an adult permanent officer.

## 7.—Female Officers—Salary Classes and Grades.

(a) Except where otherwise provided in this Agreement the classes and grades applicable to female officers in the Clerical Division shall be as indicated in Schedule B.

(b) In allocating salaries or salary ranges in accordance with section 12 of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966, the Commissioner may amalgamate any two classes.

(c) A female Clerical Division officer who has obtained promotion to either Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 as set out in Schedule B to this Agreement and who has completed not less than twenty (20) years of continuous permanent service, shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum, provided the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer and provided further that an allowance under this subclause shall not apply to an officer paid in accordance with the provisions of subclause (d) hereof.

(d) An adult female officer who is paid in accordance with the rates prescribed in Schedule B and who, on or after the 1st January, 1968, is performing work of the same or a like nature and of equal value to a male officer shall, subject to the principles and conditions laid down by Ministerial Circular (L238/67) dated 28th November, 1967, receive payment on the basis set out in such Circular. Provided that as from the date of this Agreement a female officer shall not be appointed to any position the duties of which are the same or a like nature and of equal value to those performed by a male officer, unless she has passed the promotional examinations prescribed for male officers from time to time.

## 8.—Female Officers—Automatic Range.

(a) The rates of pay for female Clerical Division officers who occupy positions in the automatic range shall be as follows:—

(b) Classes and grades beyond a salary of \$2,350 per annum shall be those set out in Schedule B.

(c) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

(d) An automatic range officer shall be paid an allowance of \$60 per annum.

## Provided that—

- (i) in the case of a typist or clerk-typist she passes an efficiency examination approved by the Commissioner in shorthand writing at a speed of 100 words per minute and typewriting at 50 words per minute;
- (ii) in the case of a machinist she passes an examination approved by the Commissioner in typewriting at a speed of 35 words per minute and in the operation of accounting and listing machines; and
- (iii) such allowance shall cease on the promotion of the officer to a higher position or should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(e) An automatic range officer who has passed either of the examinations referred to in subclause (d) and has completed at least two years' continuous service on a salary of \$2,350 per annum exclusive of allowance, shall be paid an allowance of \$130 per annum, inclusive of the allowance under subclause (d). Thereafter the allowance shall be increased to—

- (i) \$200 per annum when the officer has been in receipt of the allowance of \$130 per annum for a period of 12 months; and to
- (ii) \$280 per annum on the completion of a further 12 months' service.

(f) The payment of an allowance in accordance with subclause (e) shall be subject to a certificate from the Permanent Head as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties and such allowance shall be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or shall cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(g) An automatic range officer who has not passed either of the examinations referred to in subclause (d) shall be paid—

- (i) an allowance of \$50 per annum on completion of five years' continuous service on a salary of \$2,350 provided the Permanent Head certifies that the officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position or should the officer refuse to accept promotion; and



(ii) an allowance of \$60 per annum on completion of not less than 20 years of continuous permanent service, provided the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer.

9.—Qualifications Allowance.

(a) Diplomates: A male adult clerk who holds—  
 the diploma in Commerce of the University of Western Australia; or  
 the diplomas in Public Administration, Accountancy, Business Studies or Management Studies of the Technical Education Division of the Education Department;  
 or passes the final examinations in all subjects in the syllabus of—  
 an Institute of Accountants, Secretaries or Cost Accountants approved by the Commissioner; or  
 The Commonwealth Institute of Valuers; or  
 The Australian Insurance Institute;  
 or passes—  
 in five (5) units (including English I) of a degree course in Arts, Science, Economics or Law at the University of Western Australia; or  
 the examination in Law prescribed under section 25 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1966;  
 or passes—  
 in the first four years of the part-time syllabus of the Associateship in Accounting or the Associateship in Administration of the Western Australian Institute of Technology;  
 or holds or passes—  
 a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid,  
 and who is in receipt of a salary which is expressed in column (a) of Schedule C to this Agreement, shall be paid qualifications allowance at the rate expressed in column (b) of that Schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's salary.

(b) Graduates and Associates: A male adult clerk who holds—  
 a degree in Arts, Commerce, Science, Economics or Law of the University of Western Australia; or  
 an Associateship in Commerce, Management, Business Administration or Public Administration of the Technical Education Division of the Education Department; or  
 who passes an Associateship in Accounting or Administration of the Western Australian Institute of Technology; or  
 who holds or passes—  
 a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid,  
 and who is in receipt of a salary which is expressed in column (a) of Schedule C to this Agreement, shall be paid qualifications allowance at the rate expressed in column (c) of that schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's salary.

(c) Payment of an allowance under the provisions of this clause shall cease as a result of the officer becoming entitled to a salary for which no qualifications allowance is provided.

10.—Annual Increments.

Subject to good conduct, diligence and efficiency an officer shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of his salary range by annual increments according to the grades of such classification.

11.—Temporary Employees.

A person employed in a temporary capacity in the Clerical Division under the provisions of section 31 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1966, shall be paid at a daily or weekly rate of pay equivalent to the annual rate that would be payable under the provisions of this Agreement to a permanent

officer engaged on duties of a similar nature and equal responsibility but in no case shall the provisions of classes 6 (d), 6 (i), 6 (j) and 8 (e) of this Agreement apply in respect of a person temporarily employed.

12.—Copies of Agreement.

Every officer and temporary employee shall be entitled to have access to a copy of this Agreement. Sufficient copies shall be available in each Department for this purpose.

13.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate as from and including the 22nd day of December, 1967, and shall remain in force for a period of three years, provided that at any time after the expiration of the first twelve months from the date of this Agreement or after the expiration of any period of twelve months from the date of any variation thereof, either of the parties may negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement or approach the Public Service Arbitrator for an amendment to this Agreement.
