Poisons Act, 1964-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by section 21 of the Poisons Act, 1964-1967, it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, amend any of the Schedules referred to in section 20 of that Act by—

- (i) the addition thereto or the deletion therefrom of any substance;
- (ii) the deletion and substitution of all of the items in any Schedule;
- (iii) the transference of any substance from any Schedule to any other Schedule; or
- (iv) the alteration of any item in any Schedule.

and whereas by Orders in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 29th June, 1965, the 28th January, 1966, the 26th April, 1967, the 2nd June, 1967, and the 3rd November, 1967, the Governor did amend the Schedules so referred to as set out in the Appendices to those Orders in Council; and whereas it is deemed expedient to further amend the Schedules so referred to in the manner hereinafter set forth: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby further amend the Schedules referred to in section 20 of the Poisons Act, 1964, as amended by the abovementioned Orders in Council in the manner set out in the Appendix to this Order in Council.


