WHEREAS by section 31 of the Land Act, 1933, the Governor may by Proclamation and subject to such conditions as may be expressed therein, classify as of Class A any lands of the Crown reserved to Her Majesty for any of the purposes specified in the said section; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 11710, for the purpose of "National Park" as described hereunder, should be classified as of Class A: Now, therefore, I, the Governor with the advice of Executive Council do by this my Proclamation classify as of Class A the reserve described hereunder.

Canning and Belmont,

The construction of a twenty-four inch diameter water main complete with valves all other necessary apparatus.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 26th day of January, 1968.

PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE PUBLIC SERVICE ARBITRATOR.

No. 3, 1967.

In the matter of Government Officers who are public service officers or temporary employees under and within the meaning of the Public Service Act, 1904-1966, and The Public Service Commissioner, and in the matter of a Claim made by The Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated concerning rates to be paid for overtime worked by Government officers in addition to ordinary salary, and the circumstances in which payment for overtime shall be made.

HAVING heard and considered the above Claim and having determined the same in accordance with section 11 (1) (e) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, the Public Service Arbitrator, pursuant to section 24 of the said Act, hereby makes the following Award:-

PUBLIC SERVICE OVERTIME AWARD, 1967. Award No. 4 of 1967.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Public Service Overtime Award, 1967, Award No. 4 of 1967.

2.-Scope.

This Award shall apply to all officers and temporary employees employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904-1966, whose offices are not included in the Special Division of the Public Service.

4.—Definitions.

In this Award, the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the meaning hereby respectively applied to them, namely:-

"Prescribed Hours of Duty" means the hours of duty prescribed by Public Service Regulation 6 or by administrative instruction issued thereunder.

"Public Service Holidays" means the days mentioned in section 57 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1966, and any other days which the Governor may appoint as public service holidays under the said Act.

-Overtime.

- (a) All work performed by direction of the Permanent Head or of a Senior Officer duly authorised
 - (i) before or after prescribed hours of duty on any working day including where applicable, Saturday, or-
 - (ii) on any Saturday not so included, Sunday or public service holiday,

shall be classed as overtime and subject to the provisions of this Award shall be paid for at the hourly rate prescribed by subclause (b) of this clause.

(b) (i) Payment for overtime shall be calculated on an hourly basis in accordance with the following formula:

Week Days:

For the first four hours on any one week day-

Fortnightly Salary 3 75 2 After the first four hours on any one week day-Fortnightly Salary

Saturdays:

Up to 12 noon on any one Saturday-

Fortnightly Salary 3 $\frac{-}{2}$ After 12 noon on any one Saturday-

Fortnightly Salary 2 - X 1

75 Sundays:

> Fortnightly Salary 2 1

Public Service Holidays:

Payment for all work performed on a public service holiday shall be computed on the basis of ordinary time and shall be paid in addition to the day's pay which the officer would ordinarily receive in respect of such period.

(ii) For the purpose of this subclause "fortnightly salary" shall not include any district allowance, personal allowance, qualifications allowance, efficiency allowance, service allowance, special allowance or higher duties allowance, unless otherwise approved by the Commissioner.

Provided that special allowance or higher duties allowance shall be included in "fortnightly salary" when overtime is worked on duties for which these allowances are specifically paid.

- (c) Where an officer so elects in writing before commencing to work overtime, equivalent time off in lieu of payment, to be determined on an hourly basis by dividing by his normal hourly rate of pay the amount to which he would otherwise have been entitled at the prescribed rate, may be granted.
- (d) A commuted allowance and/or time off in lieu of overtime may be negotiated between the Commissioner and the Association, provided that where there is disagreement between the Commissioner and the Association as to the necessity for or the amount of a commuted allowance or time off, a dispute within the meaning of section 11 (1) (f) of the Public Service Arbitration Act shall be deemed to have arisen.
- (e) A break of at least 30 minutes, which shall not be reckoned as overtime, shall be made for meals between 12 noon and 2 p.m. when overtime is worked on a Saturday, Sunday or public service holiday, and between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. on any week day on which overtime is worked.
- (f) No claim for payment or time off in lieu under the provisions of this clause shall be allowed in respect of any day on which the additional time worked amounts to less than 30 minutes.
 - (g) An officer who is required to return to duty-
 - (i) on a Saturday, (otherwise than during prescribed hours of duty) Sunday or public service holiday, shall be entitled to payment for overtime at the prescribed rate for a minimum period of three hours,
 - (ii) without prior notice after prescribed hours of duty on a week day, shall be so entitled for a minimum period of two-and-a-half hours.
- (h) When an officer is directed to work overtime at a place other than his usual headquarters and the time spent in travelling to and from that place is in excess of the time normally spent in travelling to and from his usual headquarters then such excess time shall be deemed to form part of the overtime worked.
- (i) Except as provided in subclause (j) of this clause, payment for overtime, or the granting of time off in lieu, shall not be approved in the following cases:—
 - (i) Officers whose salary, or salary and allowance in the nature of salary, exceeds that determined from time to time as the maximum of Class 8 in the appropriate Division,
 - (ii) field officers and officers whose work is not subject to close supervision; or
 - (iii) officers whose salary includes specific provision in respect of overtime.
- (j) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (i) of this clause, where from the nature of the duties required or from other relevant circumstance it appears just and reasonable, any such officer as is referred to in that subclause shall, with the special approval of the Commissioner, be paid overtime or granted time off in lieu as prescribed by subclause (b) or subclause (c) respectively of this clause and if in any such case the Commissioner declines to give such special approval a dispute within the meaning of section 11 (1) (f) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, shall be deemed to have arisen.

6.—On Call.

- (a) An officer who is authorised by the Permanent Head or by a Senior Officer duly authorised by him, to hold himself on call during his period off duty shall be paid such allowance as may be agreed between the Commissioner and the Association, and in event of disagreement a dispute within the meaning of section 11 (1) (f) of the Public Service Arbitration Act shall be deemed to have arisen.
- (b) For the purpose of this clause "On Call" shall mean an instruction to an officer to remain at his place of residence or otherwise to hold himself available for immediate contact in the case of an emergency call-out requiring the performance of duties away from such place of residence.

7.—Travelling Time.

An officer who, in the course of his duties, is called upon to travel before the usual time for commencing or after the usual time for ceasing duty may, at the discretion of the Commissioner, be granted time off in respect of such time or part of such time spent in travelling.

8.—Special Conditions.

Leave is reserved to the Association to apply to the Public Service Arbitrator in accordance with section 11 (1) (e) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966, in respect of a specific occupational group covered by the provisions of this Award.

9.—Copies of Award.

Every officer shall be entitled to have access to a copy of this Award. Sufficient copies shall be available in each Department for this purpose.

10.—Term of Award.

This Award shall operate as from and including the 1st day of January, 1968, and shall remain in force for a period of three years from that date, provided that either of the parties may after the 31st day of December, 1968, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Award or approach the Arbitrator for an amendment to this Award.


