Land Act, 1933.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 6460/51.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 24780 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Bassendean, in trust for the purpose of "Recreation": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Bassendean, in trust for "Recreation", with power to the said Shire of Bassendean, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

The Order in Council dated 24th July, 1957 is hereby superseded.

Land Act, 1933-1967.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.
