IT is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) that the Hon. Minister for Town Planning approved the Shire of Port Hedland Town Planning Scheme No. 1 on the 16th February, 1968. The Text of the Scheme is published hereunder.

THE SHIRE OF PORT HEDLAND TOWN
PLANNING SCHEME, No. 1.

THE Port Hedland Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Port Hedland Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Port Hedland (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following Parts:—

- Part I.—Preliminary.
- Part II.—Reserved Land.
- Part III.—Zones.
- Part IV.—Non-conforming Uses.
- Part V.—General Provisions.
- Part VI.—Special Provisions.
- Part VII.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map, marked "Map No. 2".
- (2) Scheme Map marked "Map No. 3" until such time as notice of the Minister's final approval is published in the *Government Gazette* when "Map No. 3" is replaced by—
Approved Planning Scheme Map marked "Map No. 4".

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme as set out hereunder:—

- (a) "Flats": the following words shall be added to the definition of flats as set out in Appendix "D"—"all flats shall be subject to a height limitation of two storeys, with or without an open style service basement."
- (b) "Institute to Seaman's Mission" means a use in which any social activity is confined to the entertainment of seamen, and may at the discretion of the Council include a limited amount of residential accommodation to seamen for a period of limited duration.
- (c) "Iron-ore Storage" means a covered or uncovered area where iron-ore is stored in bulk.

- (d) "Night Club" means a use that provides dancing facilities or amusement, or both, to a restricted membership or to the public at large.
- (e) "Outdoor Recreation" means the use of land for a public park, public gardens, foreshore reserve or children's playground, but not land used as sports grounds.
- (f) "Row House" means a series of single family houses of one or two storeys (with or without an open style service basement), connected to each other by side walls and forming a continuous group.
- (g) "Trade Display" means the display of goods for advertisement as approved by the Council.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

- 2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.
- (c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.
- (d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.
- 2.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.
- (b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.
- (c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 The Scheme area is divided into seven types of zones set out hereunder:—

- Residential.
- Commercial.
- Service Industrial.
- General Industrial.
- Special.
- Private Institute.
- Places of Assembly.

3.2 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.3 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones on the top of that Table".

3.3 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

- "P" = A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
- "AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- "IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
- "X" = A use that is not permitted.

Any use not specially listed in this Table shall be included either in the appropriate use class or special use class at the discretion of the Council, or as defined in the legend of the Scheme Map.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits pre-

scribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use—

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 **Amenity:** The Council may refuse to approve any plans of development or redevelopment of lots if in its opinion the siting, appearance, design and harmony of the proposed buildings would be detrimental to or destroy the amenities of the neighbourhood, nor shall any building be so constructed, finished or left unfinished that its external appearance would disfigure the locality or tend to depreciate the value of adjoining properties. Further, all land and buildings shall be so maintained as to preserve the amenities of the area in which they are situated.

5.2 Appeals:

- (a) Any person wishing to develop land who is aggrieved by a decision of the Council exercising the discretionary powers embodied in Clauses 2.1 of Part II or Clause 5.1 of this part may appeal to the Minister against that decision.
- (b) An appeal under sub-clause (a) of this clause shall be made within 30 days of receipt of notice of such decision of the original application, the Clause or Clauses under which the decision was taken, the reasons given for the decision, the Clause under which the appeal is made and the reasons for the appeal.
- (c) The decision of the Minister on an appeal shall be final.

5.3 **Building Lines:** No building shall be constructed nearer to the road or street alignment or alignments of the lot on which it stands than the distances prescribed within Clauses 6.1 and 6.2 (c) below and/or the Uniform General Building By-laws or Council.

5.4 **Building Heights, Plot Ratios and Site Coverage:** The Council may, by by-laws, prescribe maximum heights, plot ratios and site coverages for any part or all of the Scheme providing the Council By-laws do not exceed the standards stated in the Uniform General Building By-laws.

5.5 **Vehicle Parking and Loading:** The purpose of this clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of land so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic on any road or public place. Every owner or occupier who constructs or who substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building on any site or changes the use of any land or building shall make provision in accordance with the requirements of Table II for vehicles used in conjunction with the site (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees or other persons) to stand on or, in the opinion of the Council sufficiently close to the site but not on a street while being loaded or unloaded or awaiting use.

5.6 **Size and Location of Car Space:** The minimum dimensions of every required car parking space shall be 18 feet by 8 feet, excluding all access drives. When considering any development applica-

tion, the Council shall have regard to and impose conditions on the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces. In particular the Council shall take into account, and may impose conditions concerning—

- (i) the proportion of car spaces to be roofed or covered;
- (ii) the proportion of car spaces to be below natural ground level;
- (iii) the means of access to each car space and the adequacy of any vehicular manoeuvring area;
- (iv) the location of the car spaces on the site and their effect on the amenity of adjoining development, including the potential effect, if those spaces should later be roofed or covered;
- (v) the extent to which car spaces are located within required building set-back areas;
- (vi) the locations of proposed public footpath, vehicular crossing, of private footpaths within the lot, and the effect on both pedestrian and vehicular traffic movement and safety;
- (vii) the suitability and adequacy of proposed screening or natural planting; and
- (viii) the suitability and adequacy of elevated structural decks for development and services as a proportion of the required area for natural planting and pedestrian space.

5.7 **Number of Parking and Loading Spaces to be Provided:** The number of spaces to be provided in respect of any particular site shall be determined by Council having regard to the nature of the use and the known or likely volumes of goods, materials or people moving to and from the site, and where the use is stipulated, not less than the number of spaces set down in Table 2 hereunder.

1. Dwellings, duplex houses, and flats, and row houses	2 to every dwelling unit.
2. Licensed hotels	1 per bedroom plus 1 for each 20 sq. ft of bar and lounge floor area.
3. Other residential buildings	1 to every 2 persons the building is designed to accommodate.
4. Government hospital	To be determined by Council in consultation with Authority involved, before building operations commence.
5. Theatres, cinemas, halls and non-residential clubs	1 to every 4 persons whom the building is designed to accommodate.
6. Church halls	1 to every 4 persons whom the building is designed to accommodate.
7. Funeral parlour	Not less than 6 spaces.
8. Educational establishments—	
Primary schools	1 to each member of teaching staff.
Other	To be determined by Council in consultation with Authority involved before building operations commence.
9. Warehouses and showrooms, including incidental offices on premises used for such purposes	1 to each 1,000 sq. ft of open space and 1 to each 1,000 sq. ft of gross floor area and 1 to every 2 persons employed.
10. Shops	1 parking space to every 100 sq. ft of gross floor area.
11. Administrative, commercial and professional offices	1 to every 200 sq. ft of gross floor area.

5.8 **Nuisance:** No lot, building or appliance shall be used in such a manner as to permit the escape therefrom of smoke, dust, fumes, odour, noise, vibration or waste products in such quantity or extent or in such a manner as to create or be a nuisance to any inhabitant of the neighbourhood of such land or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.

5.9 **Traffic Entrances:** If in the opinion of the Council separate entrances to and exits from any lot for road vehicles are desirable for the avoidance of traffic hazards on public roads adjacent thereto it may require the owner to provide such entrances and exits as it may direct.

PART VI.—SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

6.1 **General Industrial Zone and Port Installation Reserve provisions:—**

- (a) No person shall stock or place any fuel or raw materials or products or by-products or waste of manufacture in the General

Industrial Zone and/or the Port Installation Reserve nearer to the Esplanade, Wedge Street and/or Wilson Street than fifty feet from the public road alignment.

- (b) No person shall in that part of the General Industrial Zone and the Port Installation Reserve which adjoins the Esplanade, Wedge Street and/or Wilson Street—

(i) use the land within twenty feet of the public roadway except for either a means of access or for lawns, gardens or the planting of trees and shrubs.

(ii) use the land between the building line and the fifty feet from the public roadway as stated in (a) hereof for any purpose other than a means of access, for parking of vehicles used by employees and customers, for loading and unloading of trees or shrubs, or if special permission of the Council shall be given thereto: trade display.

- (c) The occupier of land within that portion of the General Industrial Zone or within the Port Installation Reserve which adjoins the Esplanade, Wedge Street and/or Wilson Street shall within twelve months from the first occupation of a building constructed thereon after this Scheme is approved—

(i) plant and thereafter maintain lawns or gardens on so much of that portion of the parcel of land which lies within twenty feet of the Street alignment as is situated between a building and a street alignment but with the exception of such part thereof as is used or set aside as a means of access;

(ii) on so much of that portion of the parcel of land which lies within twenty feet of the street alignment as is not situated between a building and a street alignment either plant and thereafter maintain lawns or gardens or plant and thereafter maintain trees or shrubs not more than fifty feet apart.

- (d) In the General Industrial Zone and in the Port Installation Reserve no building shall be erected within ten feet of one of the side boundaries of the parcel of land in order that provision may be made for access to the rear or side of the building for the removal of rubbish or waste products.

6.2 Commercial Zone provisions—Land which has been set aside within the Commercial Zone shall be planned and developed to the approval of Council incorporating the principles and provisions enumerated below—

- (a) Building and Landscape:

(i) The building group shall be designed to produce an integrated layout.

(ii) Buildings shall be of complimentary design with particular reference to height and slope of verandahs and Cantiliver Awnings; and also in terms of colour, tone and texture if facing materials so that all components of form and finish will blend harmoniously.

(iii) The design shall make provision for general uniformity of future advertising outside of shops to be in keeping with the architectural quality of the development.

(iv) Provision shall be made for planting and landscaping of the development to enhance its appearance and to secure a harmonious relationship between the centre and the existing or potential use of adjoining land.

(v) Service access to rear of shops shall be screened from public view to satisfaction of Council.

- (b) Traffic—Access, Safety and Circulation:

(i) Services for shops shall be provided by vehicle access to the rear of such shops.

(ii) Off-street parking shall be laid out to provide the highest possible degree of safety and convenience to users.

(iii) Access from public roads to parking area shall be sited to reduce traffic hazards to a minimum.

(iv) Items (i) to (iii) inclusive, shall be to the satisfaction of the Council.

- (c) Building Line:

In the whole of the Local District Business Zone the Building line at street pavement level must be set back an additional minimum distance of ten feet so as to allow the colonnading of permitted development at ground floor level to take place. The colonnading should provide for the provision of a public footpath and services.

The owner of abutting land may build over the footpath with clearances, support, signs, street lighting provisions, maintenance, fire escape stairs etc., as set out in the Uniform General Building By-Laws and/or as directed by Council.

PART VII.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

7.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

7.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

7.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

7.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

- (1) Any local authority or person interested may object in writing to the construction of the proposed waterworks.

- (2) Every objection shall be lodged with the Minister within one month from the date of the publication of the advertisement in the *Government Gazette*.

Section 63 empowers the Minister to make and levy water rates on land whether actually occupied or not and whether actually supplied with water or not where such land is within the prescribed distance of any water main laid in pursuance of the advertisement.
