WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by section eight of the Prisons Act, 1903-1964, that the Governor may, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare any building, enclosure or place to be a gaol and may in like manner discontinue and close any such gaol; and whereas the gaol at Carnarvon, being established before the commencement of the said Act, was declared by section seven thereof to be a gaol, within the meaning, and for the purposes, of the Act and it is now expedient that it be discontinued and closed: Now therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the gaol at Carnarvon to be discontinued and closed with effect from the 1st March, 1968.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 21A of the Poisons Act, 1964-1967, that where the Minister is of opinion that sufficient provision is made by other laws of the State regulating the supply, sale or use of any substance containing any poison or hazardous substance, he may certify in writing to that effect, and thereupon the Governor may by proclamation exempt that substance from all or any of the provisions of that Act and the regulations made thereunder; and whereas the Minister for Health has certified in writing that in his opinion sufficient provision is made in other laws of the State, namely, the Toxic and Hazardous Substances Regulations in force under the Health Act, 1911-1966, regulating the supply, sale or use of the substances specified in Appendices 1, 2 and 3 to those regulations when those substances are contained in paint as defined by those regulations: Now therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt from the provisions of the Poisons Act, 1964, as amended, and from the regulations from time to time in force thereunder, the substances specified in Appendices 1, 2 and 3 to the Toxic and Hazardous Substances Regulations in

force under the Health Act, 1911-1966, when those substances are contained in paint as defined by those regulations.

Land Act, 1933-1967.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 3334/16.—That Reserve No. 16617 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, in trust for the purpose of "Water".

Corres. 4176/46.—That Reserve No. 22974 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Meekatharra, in trust for the purpose of "Swimming Pool, Park and Gardens".

(The Order in Council dated the 10th August, 1949, is hereby superseded.)

Corres. 155/64.—That Reserve No. 28927 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kalgoorlie, in trust for the purpose of "Public Recreation".

Corres. 3909/65.—That Reserve No. 28960 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Works, in trust for the purpose of "Water Supply".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the conditions that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres 11653/12.—That Reserve No. 14647 (Nyabing Lot 31) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the Nyabing Community Church Association (Inc.), to be held in trust for the purpose of "Church Site (Undenominational)".

Corres. 3698/65.—That Reserve No. 28371 (Gnowangerup Lot 357) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the Shire of Gnowangerup, to be held in trust for the purpose of "Shire Council Buildings, Public Library and Parking Area".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid bodies, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Local Government Act, 1960.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and foot-paths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereunder have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such lands shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

- (2) a reinforced concrete and brick pumping station;
- (3) a 15-inch diameter reinforced concrete rising main approximately 2,150 feet long,

for the Aberdare Road Pumping Station, Rising Main and Compensating Basin, as shown on plan M.W.B. 9896.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 1st day of March, 1968.

HOUSING LOAN GUARANTEE ACT, 1957-1965.
Declaration under and Pursuant to Section Seven F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act, 1957-1965.

I, THE HONOURABLE DAVID BRAND, the Treasurer, having been requested under the provisions of section seven F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act, 1957-1965 (in this notice called "the Act") to do so, do by this notice declare the following matters, that is to say—

- (a) the maximum amount which the Treasurer may guarantee under the Act during the period commencing the 19th May, 1958, and ending the 31st December, 1970, is the sum of eighteen million dollars (\$18,000,000);
- (b) the maximum amount in respect of which agreements for indemnity may be entered into by the Treasurer during the period commencing the 1st January, 1962, and ending the 31st December, 1970, is the sum of one million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$1,800,000);
- (c) the maximum rate of interest which an approved institution may charge on a loan to a borrower or on the purchase money to a purchaser in respect of any period whilst an agreement for indemnity is in force in respect of the loan or purchase money, is six and one-half per centum (6½%); and
- (d) for the purposes of section seven B of the Act the maximum amount which an approved institution shall advance to a borrower on the giving of a first mortgage

of a new house or the maximum amount of the purchase moneys which an approved institution shall permit to remain payable under a contract for sale and purchase of a new house before an indemnity is given by the Treasurer under the Act, is seventy per centum (70%) of the value of a new house, as defined in the Act.
