WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (i) of subsection (2) of section (12) of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor, upon the presentation of a petition under the Common Seal of the district concerned, may describe the boundaries of a district or the wards as existing for the time being; and whereas the Municipality of the Shire of Meekatharra has presented a petition praying that the boundaries of the district and the wards be described as set out in the schedule hereunder; and whereas it is considered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby describe the boundaries of the district and the wards of the Municipality of the Shire of Meekatharra as existing for the time being, as set out in the Schedule hereunder:

Shire of Meekatharra—Description of Boundaries.
