Child Welfare Act, 1947-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1965, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members; and whereas by section 19 (1) (b) (ii) of the said Act the Governor may amend, vary or revoke any such appointment: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby appoint the persons named in the First Schedule hereto to be Members of the Children's Court at Koorda and doth hereby revoke the appointments of the persons named in the second schedule hereto as Members of the Children's Court at Koorda.

Constitution of Valuation Appeal Courts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 813/60.

WHEREAS it is enacted inter alia by section 691 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1967, that power given by the Act to make Orders includes power from time to time to otherwise vary those Orders; and whereas by an Order made pursuant to section 556 of that Act on 7th June, 1961 and published in the Government Gazette of the 16th June, 1961, the Governor did inter alia constitute the Metropolitan Valuation Appeal Court and the Geraldton Valuation Appeal Court and did specify the respective jurisdictions of those Courts: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 691 of the said Act, do hereby vary the abovementioned Order, as subsequently amended, by adding the words "Dandaragan" and "Moora" after the word "Wanneroo" under the heading, "The Portions of the State in which each Valuation Appeal Court respectively has jurisdiction", opposite the item, "Metropolitan Valuation Appeal Court" and by deleting those words appearing under that heading opposite the item "Geraldton Valuation Appeal Court" in the Schedule of the Order.

Description of Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (i) of subsection (2) of section (12) of the Local Govern-ment Act, 1960, that the Governor, upon the presentation of a petition under the Common Seal of the district concerned, may describe the boundaries of a district as existing for the time being; and whereas the Municipality of the Shire of Wiluna has presented a petition praying that the boundaries of the district be described as set out in the Schedule hereunder; and whereas it is con-sidered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby describe the boundaries of the district of the Muni-cipality of the Shire of Wiluna as existing for the time being, as set out in the Schedule hereunder:

Schedule.

Redescription of Boundaries of the Shire of Wiluna.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the Tropic of Capricorn (adopted Latitude 23 degrees 26 minutes 30 seconds South) with the eastern boundary of Reserve 12297 (No. 1 Rabbit Proof Fence) and ex-tending east along the Tropic of Capricorn to the eastern boundary of the State; thence south along that boundary to a point situate east of the easternmost northeastern corner of Lease 395/920 easternmost northeastern corner of Lease 395/920 (on plan 62/300); thence west to that corner and west 626 chains 71 links and north 350 chains along boundaries of that lease to the northern most northeastern corner of late Lease 3478/97; thence west 410 chains along the northernmost northern boundary of that late lease and the northern boundary of the eastern severance of late Lease 3476/97 to the eastern boundary of late Lease 3477/97; thence north 150 chains and west 400 chains along boundaries of that late lease to the northeastern corner of late Lease 3655/97: thence northeastern corner of late Lease 3655/97; thence west 959 chains 54 links along the northern boundary of that late lease to the northeastern corner of late Lease 973/97; thence south 320 chains and west 624 chains 85 links along boundaries of that late lease and onwards 363 chains 87 links to the eastern-most southeastern corner of late Lease 3647/97; thence west 140 chains, south 636 chains 51 links, again west 1953 chains 93 links and north 119 chains along boundaries of that late lease to the southeastern corner of late Lease 3457/97; thence west 833 chains 2 links along the southern boundary of that late lease and onwards about 580 chains along the southern boundary of late Lease 3646/97 to a north-south line passing through Survey Mark JR 80. (Longitude 121 degrees 46 minutes 41.62 seconds East.); thence south along that line to intersect an east-west line passing through Mt Falconer (on plan 53/300); thence west along that line to the eastern boundary of late Lease 1323/94; thence north about 265 chains and west 300 chains along boundaries of that late lease to the southeastern corner of late Lease 1324/94; thence west 917 chains along the south-ern boundary of that late lease to its southwestern corner; thence westerly about 715 chains to the 299 Mile Post on the surveyed line of the No. 1 Rabbit Proof Fence aforesaid; thence generally northerly along that surveyed line to the 443½ Mile Post thereon; thence east to the eastern boundary of Reserve 12297 (No. 1 Rabbit Proof Fence) aforesaid and thence generally northerly along that boundary to the starting point.

PUBLIC SERVICE ALLOWANCES (MOTOR CAR HIRE) AGREEMENT, 1968.

Agreement No. 4 of 1968

THIS agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966, of Western Australia this 1st day of April, 1968, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated (hereinafter referred to as the Association) of the one part and the Public Service Commissioner (hereinaîter referred to as the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth that the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:---

This agreement shall be known as the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, No. 4 of 1968.

2.-Scope.

This agreement shall apply to all officers and temporary employees employed under the provi-sions of the Public Service Act, 1904-1967, whose offices are not included in the Special Division of the Public Service.

3.—Arrangement.

4.—Definitions.

In this agreement the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the meaning hereby respectively applied to them, namely:

- "Metropolitan Area" means that area within a radius of thirty (30) miles from the Perth Railway Station.
- "South-West Land Division" means the South-West Land Division as defined by section 28 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, excluding the area contained within the metropolitan area.
- "Other Areas" means that area of the State of Western Australia south of 26 degrees south latitude, excluding the metropolitan area and the South-West Land Division.

5.—Payment of Hire for Use of Officer's Own Vehicle.

(a) An officer who is required to maintain a motor car for use when travelling on official business and who is not in receipt of an allowance provided under subclause (b) shall, for journeys approved by the permanent head, be paid hire for such vehicle to cover all expenses in connection therewith, in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule hereto.

(b) The Commissioner may authorise a com-muted amount for the hire of motor vehicles or any other conveyance belonging to an officer.

(c) Where an officer in the course of a journey travels through two or more of the separate areas, payment of hire at the rates prescribed by sub-clause (a) shall be made at the appropriate rate applicable to each of the separate areas traversed.

(d) The Commissioner may increase the rates prescribed by this clause in any case in which he is satisfied that they are inadequate.

(e) A year for the purpose of this clause shall commence on the first day of July and end on the thirtieth day of June next following.

7.—Copies of Agreement.

Every officer shall be entitled to have access to a copy of this Agreement. Sufficient copies shall be available in each Department for this purpose.

8.-Term of Agreement.

This agreement shall operate as from and includ-This agreement shall operate as from and includ-ing the 1st April, 1968 and shall remain in force for a period of three years from that date, pro-vided that either of the parties may after the 1st April, 1969, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this agreement or approach the Arbitrator for an amendment to this agreement.
