THE HARKNESS FELLOWSHIPS OF THE COMMONWEALTH FUND—NEW YORK AUSTRALIAN PUBLIC SERVICE FELLOWSHIPS.

THE Harkness Fellowships for education and travel in the United States are offered in different categories to candidates from the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and Western Europe.

In Australia, up to three Public Service Fellowships are offered in open competition each year to outstanding men and women holding appointments under the Commonwealth and State Governments of Australia.

A candidate must be between 21 and 35 years of age and qualified by education and experience to carry out a definite scheme of advanced study, research or inquiry related to a problem which is of importance to the candidate's Government and can be investigated to special advantage in the United States. Probationers or junior officers desiring elementary grounding or University degrees are not eligible for these Fellowships.

All applications from State Public Servants and employees of semi-government and statutory authorities must be returned to the Public Service Commissioner, 184 St George's Terrace, Perth, by 15th AUGUST, 1968.



THE Donnybrook Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of controlling land development by zoning.

PART I.-PRELIMINARY.

- 1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Donnybrook Town Planning Scheme No. 1. hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps in the appendices hereto.
- 1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Donny-brook

- 1.4 In the Scheme the planing area is divided into Communications reserves and Industrial zones.
- 1.5 Arrangements of Scheme: The Scheme is divided into the following Parts and Appendices:—

Part 1-Preliminary.

Part II-Zones.

Part III—Non-conforming Uses.

Part IV-Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are appended as follows:—

- 1. Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2".
- Planing Proposals Map marked "Map No. 3" or Approved Planning Scheme Map marked "Map No. 4" (as the case may be).
- 1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

PART II.—ZONES.

- 2.1 Land zoned for Industry may be used for Light Industry, General Industry, Service Industry, Transport Depot and Storage. With the approval of the responsible authority it may be used for a Motor Repair Station, Service Station, Car Sales Premises, Trade Display, Showroom Offices, or a Caretaker's house.
- 2.2 Any use not mentioned in Clause 2.1 is not permitted in the Light Industry Zone.

PART III.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

- 3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent-
 - (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
 - (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.
- 3.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part 11 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-Laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-law made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.
 - 3.3 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use-
 - (a) Not withstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
 - (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART IV.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

4.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

- 4.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette.
- 4.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may be its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.
- 4.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.
