AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 24th day of April, 1968, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Land Act, 1933-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 649/64.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, it is *inter alia* made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the conditions that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 29129 (Swan Location 8260) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the Paraplegics' Association of Western Australia (Inc.) to be held in trust for the purpose of a "Quadraplegics' Centre": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Minister for Town Planning approved the Shire of Perth Town Planning Scheme No. 12B, Extension Alexander Drive on the 4th April, 1968, the Scheme Text of which is published hereunder.

SHIRE OF PERTH TOWN PLANNING
SCHEME No. 12B.

Extension Alexander Drive.

THE Perth Shire Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

Scheme Text.

1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Perth Town Planning Scheme No. 12B—Extension Alexander Drive (hereinafter called "the Scheme").
 2. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Perth (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").
 3. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the lands contained within the inner edge of the blue border on the Land Use Map and on the Scheme Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".
 4. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are:—
 - (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
 - (b) To plan and construct roads within the Scheme Area.
 - (c) To make suitable provision for the better use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
 - (d) To ensure proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage.
 - (e) To make provision for the creation of drainage reserves and easements.
 - (f) To make provision for public open space within the Scheme Area.
 5. Works to be Carried Out: The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:—
 - (a) The Scheme Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map.
 - (b) The lands shown as roads and coloured yellow on the Scheme Map shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earthworks undertaken.
 - (c) The Scheme Area shall be drained and all necessary drainage works shall be carried out. Any drainage line required in the Scheme Area may if deemed necessary by the Council be connected by a pipe drain to a point of discharge outside the Scheme Area and the costs thereof debited to the Scheme.
 - (d) The lands show as footways on the Scheme Map shall be constructed and used for that purpose.
 - (e) The land coloured light blue on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for drainage reserves and drainage easements.
 - (f) The lands which in the opinion of the Council require such treatment shall be filled.
 - (g) To carry out levelling and grading of Public Open Space within the Scheme Area.
 - (h) Those outbuildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision shall be demolished and removed.
 - (i) All new lots within the Scheme Area shall be supplied with reticulated water.
6. Closure of Roads and Rights-of-way: The roads and rights-of-way shown on the Land Use Map and not shown on the Scheme Map shall be deemed to have been closed as from the coming into operation of this Scheme and the land shall be used for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map.
 7. Public Open Space: The land coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be set aside as Public Open Space.
 8. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.
 9. Valuations: The land within the Scheme Area with the exception of those parts of lots 148, 146, 86 and 87 which lie on the East Side of the proposed extension of Alexander Drive shown on the Scheme Map and with the exception of the roads and rights-of-way (hereinafter called "the acquired land") shall be valued as at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme.
 10. The residential lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with the Scheme Map (hereinafter called "new lots") shall be valued on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of the Scheme have been carried out.
 11. The valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or by some person appointed by him.
 12. Costs of Scheme: The costs of the Scheme shall be as follows:—
 - (a) The administration costs of the Scheme.
 - (b) Subject to paragraph (c), (d) and (e) hereof the costs of the works to be carried out.
 - (c) One-half of the costs of the drainage of the Scheme Area shall be part of the Scheme Costs and the remaining one-half being paid by the Council.
 - (d) The Scheme shall be responsible to pay one-third only of the cost of construction of Alexander Drive the remainder being paid by the Council.
 - (e) The Scheme will be responsible to pay one-half of the cost of construction of The Strand the remaining one-half being paid by the Council.
 - (f) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
 - (g) The estimated compensation and costs payable under clause 29 hereof.
 - (h) The cost of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
 - (i) The cost of providing reticulated water throughout the Scheme Area.
 13. Net Cost Per Lot: The sum total of both the costs of the Scheme and the value of the "acquired land" ascertained in accordance with clause 9 shall be divided by the number of new lots created by the re-survey as shown on the Scheme Map. The resultant figure shall be the "net cost per lot" of the Scheme.
 14. In ascertaining the value of the "acquired land" for the purpose of clause 13 if any compensation or other payment has been made or estimated under subclause (e), (f) or (g) of clause 12 the amount of such compensation or payment shall

be substituted for the value of such land ascertained in pursuance of clause 9 in respect of which the payment was made or estimated.

15. Offer of New Lots: The Council shall as equitably as possible apportion new lots among the owners of the acquired land and each such owner shall be offered the new lot or lots allocated to him.

16. (1) The offer shall be made on the basis that the owner shall in respect of each new lot offered pay to or be paid by the Council a sum of money as hereinafter appears.

(2) The average value of the new lots as valued for the purpose of this Scheme shall be ascertained.

(3) In ascertaining the amount payable by or to be paid to an owner who is offered a new lot in accordance with the terms of this Scheme the owner shall be—

- (a) credited with the value of the land which entitled him to be offered the lot and which has been or is to be resumed or acquired from him as ascertained by clause 9;
- (b) debited with the "net cost per lot" of the Scheme as ascertained by clause 13;
- (c) credited or debited as the case may be with the amount by which the new lot offered to him is less than or exceeds the average value of the new lots within the Scheme Area as ascertained by paragraph (2) of this clause.

17. Nature of Offers: The offers shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by certified post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot the subject of the offer and the old lot or lots in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify how the offer is calculated, the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be.

18. If a new lot is one on which a drainage line is or is to be situated as shown on the Scheme Map the new lot shall be offered subject to the condition that the owner shall grant to the Council a drainage easement over so much of the said lot as is shown as a drainage line on the Scheme Map; or if the Council shall have already granted an easement to the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage & Drainage Board then the offer will be subject to that easement.

19. An owner who accepts an offer shall pay to the Council the amount of rates which would have been payable if the land which entitled him to receive the offer had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the new lot.

20. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

21. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall subject to the Council's right to extend the time be deemed to have been rejected. No acceptance of the offer shall be deemed a valid acceptance unless all rates and taxes owed by the owner in respect of land within the Scheme Area have been paid unless the owner is a pensioner and payment of rates has been postponed.

22. If the offer be accepted it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot or lots in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of the Scheme and on the condition that the owner will indemnify the Council against any claims which may be made by any other person who has or claims to have any estate or interest in the lots in respect of which the offer is made.

23. Registration of Transfers: The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each offer of a replacement lot which has been accepted by the

owner in accordance with this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act 1893 as amended to make the payment of the amount payable by him and return the transfer to the Council for registration within twenty-eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post and on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the land in respect of which the offer of the replacement lot or lots was made and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

24. Rejected Lots and Surplus Lots:

- (1) If an owner does not accept an offer made to him by the Council in accordance with the Scheme or fails to make any payment due to him or to complete a transfer of the said lot in manner aforesaid the Council may deal with the lots so affected as hereinafter appears.
- (2) If there are any surplus lots they may be dealt with as hereinafter provided.

25. Sale of Rejected Lots and Surplus Lots: The Council may sell the rejected lots and surplus lots either by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

26. Valuation of Rejected Lots and Surplus Lots: The Council may instead of selling all or any of the rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

27. Profits of Scheme: In the event of the Scheme showing a profit the amount of such profit shall be expended by the Council in the development of the public open space within the Scheme Area.

28. Time Limit for Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six (6) months of the coming into operation of this Scheme or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption of the issue of a notice or rescission under Clause 23 hereof whichever is the later.

29. Estimate of Compensation: In the event of any claim for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to make the offers of lots in pursuance of this Scheme the Council may estimate the amount of Compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the net amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

30. Encumbrances on Title: In the event of any land in the Scheme Area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser mortgagee chargee or lessee the Council shall not transfer a new lot to the owner unless subject to similar encumbrances or with the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance.

31. Powers of Council: The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Area.

- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the Area.
- (c) To enter into arrangements and agreements with the Crown and the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority and to postpone the operation of the Scheme until arrangements satisfactory to the Council have been so made.
- (d) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (e) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land within the Scheme Area.
- (f) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of land within the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (g) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of the Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (h) If an owner is offered more than one replacement lot and does not desire to accept all lots offered to enter into such agreements with the owner as seem to the Council to be equitable.
- (i) To grant drainage and sewerage easements and dispose of land subject to such easements.
- (j) To make minor alterations to the design shown on the Scheme Map.

Minister for Town Planning approved the Shire of Gosnells Town Planning Scheme No. 1 on the 10th May, 1968, the Scheme Text of which is published hereunder.

TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT,
1928 (AS AMENDED).

Shire of Gosnells Town Planning Scheme
No. 1.

THIS Town Planning Scheme is prepared by the Council of the Shire of Gosnells under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959, primarily for the purpose of zoning and classifying land within the District of the Shire of Gosnells and regulating development thereon, but also includes other purposes authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. The Scheme is known as "Shire of Gosnells Town Planning Scheme No. 1", hereinafter called "the Scheme", and shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. (a) This Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the Maps in the appendices hereto.

(b) The Scheme is complimentary to and not a substitute for the Metropolitan Region Scheme. The provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time, shall continue to have effect.

(c) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Scheme the Council may with the consent of the Minister require or when required by the Minister so to do, shall require that the development of any land within the Scheme Area, however zoned, shall be subject to the provisions of clauses 10, 24 and 30 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

3. The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Gosnells except that where land is defined in the Scheme Map as "Regional Reservation" the responsible authority shall be the Metropolitan Regional Planning Authority and the provision of the Metropolitan Regional Planning Scheme shall apply to such land.

4. The Scheme is divided into the following Parts and Schedules:—

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Reserved Land.

Part III.—Zones.

Part V.—Non-conforming Use of Land.

Part VI.—Non-conforming Use of Land.

Zones and Uses.

Part VI.—Building Alignments.

Part VII.—General.

Schedules:

First—Land Use Map (Annotated Map No. 2.)

Second—Scheme Map (Annotated Map No. 3.)

Definitions.

5. Interpretation—In the Scheme, unless the context otherwise indicates:—

"Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928.

"Lot" bears the same meaning as in the Act.

"Approved date" means the date on which notice of the approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*.

"Lodging house" bears the same meaning as in the Health Act, 1911.

"Building" means any structure, whether fixed or otherwise, permanent or temporary, which is roofed or wholly or partially enclosed by walls.

"Building line" is a line established prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme inside a lot and indicated on the Scheme Map by a broken red and black line.

"Caravan Park" means an area set aside for the parking of caravans in conformity with the Caravan and Camp Regulations, 1961, and the Local Government Model By-law (Caravan Parks) No. 2.

"Drive-in-Theatre" means an open air cinema that makes provision for the audience or spectators to view the entertainment while seated in motor vehicles.

"Duplex House" means a single-storey building comprising two tenements, but so designed as to have the appearance of a single dwelling house.

"Dwelling House" means a building used or designed or adapted for use as a single tenement. The term includes such out-buildings as are ordinarily used therewith.

"Existing Use" means a use of a building or land for the purpose for which it was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of the Scheme.

"Extractive Industry" includes an industry involving the extraction of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, rock, stone or similar material from the land, and when carried out on land adjacent thereto, the treatment of such materials.

"Frontage" bears the same meaning as is given to it in the Uniform Building By-laws.

"General Industry" means any industry other than a light, offensive, rural, extractive or service industry.

"Home Occupation" means an occupation carried on within a dwelling or the curtilage of a dwelling which—

- (a) does not cause injury to, or prejudicially affect the amenity of the neighbourhood whether by the emission of noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil, waste water, or waste products;
- (b) does not entail the employment of any person not a member of the occupier's family, except in the case of horticulture and the practice of professions;
- (c) does not occupy an area greater than 300 square feet, except in the case of a medical or dental practitioner, or a masseur, or where used for horticulture, or a kindergarten; or
- (d) in which the dwelling or curtilage of a dwelling does not require the provision of any essential service main of a greater capacity than normally required in the zone in which it is located.

"Hotel" means premises in respect of which there is granted a publican's general licence or a hotel licence under the Licensing Act, 1911.

"Industry" means the carrying out of any process for or incidental to—

- (a) the making, altering, repairing or ornamentation, painting, furnishing, cleaning, washing, packing, canning or adapting for sale, or breaking up or demolition of any article; or
- (b) the winning, processing or treatment of minerals; or
- (c) the generation of electricity or the production of gas; or
- (d) the manufacture of edible goods for human or animal consumption;

being a process carried on in the course of trade or business for gain, other than operations connected with—

- (i) the carrying out of agriculture;
- (ii) site works on buildings, works or land; and

(iii) in the case of the manufacture of edible goods referred to in subparagraph (d) hereof, the preparation on the premises of a shop of food for sale;

and includes, when carried out on land upon which the process is carried out, and in connection with that process, the storage of goods, any work of administration or accounting, the sale of goods, resulting from the process and the use of land for the amenity of persons engaged in the process.

"Land" includes buildings and structures thereon.

"Light Industry" means an industry, not being an Extractive Industry or a Special Industry, in which the processes carried on, the materials and machinery used, and the transportation of materials, goods and commodities to and from the premises whereon the industry is carried on will not cause injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the locality whether by the emission of noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil, waste water and waste products.

"Liquid Fuel Depot" means a site, not being a petrol filling station, a service station or motor repair station, used for the storage in bulk and the distribution of liquid fuels.

"Motel" bears the same meaning as it has in the Local Government Model By-laws (Motels) No. 3.

"Motor Repair Station" means premises used for or in connection with mechanical repairs and overhauls to or for motor vehicles, tractors or engines, including tyre recapping, retreading, panel beating, spray painting and chassis reshaping.

"Motor Transport Depot" means land used for the garaging of road motor vehicles used or intended to be used for carrying goods for hire or reward or for any consideration, or for the transfer of goods from one such motor vehicle to another of such motor vehicles, and includes maintenance and repair of vehicles.

"Non-conforming Use" means the use of land which, though lawful immediately prior to the coming into operation of this Scheme is not in conformity with the Scheme.

"Offensive Trade" means an offensive trade within the meaning of the Health Act, 1911, but excludes fish shops and dry-cleaning establishments.

"Office" means a building or part thereof used for the conduct of administration, the practice of a profession, the carrying on of agencies, banks, typing and secretarial services and services of a similar nature or, where not conducted on the site thereof, the administration of or accounting in connection with an industry.

"Owner" in relation to any land includes the Crown and every person who, jointly or severally, whether at law or in equity—

- (a) is entitled to the land for an estate in fee simple in possession; or
- (b) is a person to whom the Crown has lawfully contracted to grant the fee simple of the land; or
- (c) is a lessee or licensee from the Crown; or
- (d) is entitled to receive or is in receipt of, or, if the lands were let to a tenant, would be entitled to receive the rents and profits thereof, whether as a beneficial owner, trustee, mortgagee in possession, or otherwise.

"Professional office or room" means any building or part thereof used or designed or adapted for use for the purpose of his profession by an accountant, architect, artist, author, barrister, chiropodist, medical or dental practitioner, consulting

engineer, masseur, nurse, physiotherapist, quantity surveyor, solicitor, teacher, or town planner, or a person having in the opinion of the responsible authority an occupation of a similar nature.

“Public Building” means a building that may suitably form part of a civic or neighbourhood centre.

“Reserved Land” means land reserved for a purpose under the scheme.

“Residential Flat” or “flat” means a separate tenement used for living purposes in a building containing two or more such tenements other than a Duplex house or terrace of dwelling houses.

“Rural Industry” means an industry handling, treating, processing or packing primary products grown, reared or produced in the locality, and a workshop servicing plant or equipment used for rural purposes in the locality.

“Set Back Line” means a line inside a lot at a distance specified by the Scheme from and parallel to the alignment of the street on which the lot abuts, or where a building line has been established prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme a line inside a lot at the distance specified from and parallel to that building line.

“Service Station” means business premises for the supply of liquid fuels, lubricants, accessories and parts for motor vehicles, and the carrying out of service and minor repairs to motor vehicles, tractors and engines, but does not include panel beating, spray painting or motor engineering works.

“Shop” means any permanent roofed building, used or designed or adapted for use for retail sales, in which the major part of the street frontage is used for the display of goods for sale, and which is not used by, or in association with any industry, office, service station, used car business, warehouse or wholesale business.

“Site” means an area occupied, by one building and its accessory buildings, and includes in every case the curtilage of the building.

“Special Industry” means an industry in which the processes involved constitute an offensive trade as defined in the Scheme.

“Tenement” means a building or part of a building used, or designed or adapted for use, as self-contained living quarters for a single family.

“Trade display” means the controlled and moderate display of goods for advertisement, as approved by the responsible authority.

“Wayside stall” means a movable or temporarily fixed structure used for the sale of produce alongside a road or highway but not on the road reserve.

“Zone” means a portion of the area shown on the Zoning Plan by distinctive colouring, hatching or edging for the purpose of indicating the restrictions imposed by the Scheme on the erection and use of buildings and/or the use of land, but does not include land reserved for public purposes.

“Zoning table” means the reference table set out in clause 16 hereof.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

6. Land that is coloured and delineated on the Scheme Map in the manner set out in Column 1 of Table 1 to this clause is deemed to be reserved for the purpose or purposes set forth opposite thereto in Column 2 of the said table.

7. Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under the Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Responsible Authority.

8. In giving its approval the Responsible Authority shall have regard to the purpose for which land has been reserved and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

9. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

10. Where the Responsible Authority refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

11. Any claim for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Responsible Authority not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Responsible Authority refusing approval or granting approval subject to conditions.

12. In lieu of paying compensation the Responsible Authority may purchase the land affected by the decision of the Responsible Authority to an application for approval of development at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of the decision.

PART III.—ZONES.

13. Land, other than land reserved under Part II of this Scheme is classified into zones as set out in Column 1 of Table 2 of this clause and shown coloured and delineated on the Scheme Map in the manner described in Column 2 of that Table.

(f) Red Purple with Red Purple diagonal Hatch	Light Industrial.

14. Subject to Part IV of the Scheme, no buildings shall be erected and no land or building shall be used or adapted for use for any other purpose than a purpose permitted in the zone in which such land or building is situated or proposed to be situated provided that—

- (a) land which is not built on may be used for a purpose for which a building could be erected and used on such land under the Scheme or for any purpose directly ancillary to any such building, and
- (b) land in any zone may be used for the purpose of a private garden.

15. Certain uses of land in the Shire of Gosnells are controlled. These controlled uses are known as "Use Classes" and are classified as follows:—

- Use Class 1—Dwelling houses.
- Use Class 2—Hostels, lodging houses, unlicensed hotels, residential clubs.
- Use Class 3—Home occupations, but always subject to an annual permit from the responsible authority.
- Use Class 4—Shops, department stores, and those uses classified under Use Class 5, where the building is designed and constructed with the major part of its shop frontage for window display and when used for the purpose of display of goods for retail sale.
- Use Class 5—Restaurants, cafes, ticket offices and bureaux, receiving offices, hairdressers, local post offices.
- Use Class 6—Show rooms in connection with retail warehousing or offices and intended for the display of goods of a bulky character.
- Use Class 7—Offices, banks, stock or produce exchanges.
- Use Class 8—Public buildings and places of assembly (other than those in Class 9) including churches, halls, cinemas and theatres, Government and Local Government offices and buildings, non-residential clubs, colleges, and institutions for the care of infants, aged and the infirm other than a hospital or mental home.
- Use Class 9—Special places of assembly, including athletic or sports grounds with spectator provision, racecourses or trotting tracks, stadia, showgrounds.
- Use Class 10—Service Stations.
- Use Class 11—Motor Repair Stations.
- Use Class 12—Wholesale warehouses designed for the storage of goods and transaction of business other than retail business.
- Use Class 13—Storage warehouses and yards including builder's or contractor's yards, furniture storage warehouses, grain silos, Government or Local Government depots and stores transit warehouses.
- Use Class 14—Light Industry.
- Use Class 15—General Industry.
- Use Class 16—Schools, residential colleges or universities.
- Use Class 17—Hospitals, sanatoria, clinics, convalescent and nursing homes.
- Use Class 18—Outdoor recreation, including public parks or gardens, playing fields, children's playgrounds, private open spaces which do not fall within other use classes.
- Use Class 19—Professional rooms or professional offices.
- Use Class 20—Liquid fuel depots.

Use Class 21—Other uses (special sites)—

- Airports.
- Bus Garages, stations or tram depots.
- Caravan Parks and/or camping grounds.
- Cemeteries.
- Crematoria.
- Drive-in Theatres.
- Licensed Hotels.
- Major Public Utility Installations (water, electricity, gas, sewerage, drainage).
- Mental Homes.
- Motels.
- Motor Transport Depots.
- Prisons.
- Refuse Destructors and Refuse Disposal Areas.
- Residential Flats.
- Warehouses.
- Wireless or Television Buildings or Installations.
- Zoological Gardens.

Use Class 22—Uses of land for the purpose of farming, including pastoral, agricultural and dairy farming, afforestation, market and nursery gardening and other similar uses.

Use Class 23—Rural Industry.

Use Class 24—Extractive Industry.

Use Class 25—Open air displays and premises for sale of motor vehicles or other goods and equipment but always subject to an annual permit from the responsible authority.

Use Class 26—Wholesale markets, but always subject to an annual permit from the responsible authority.

Use Class 27—Special industries.

Use Class 28—Wayside stalls, but always subject to an annual permit from the responsible authority.

Use Class 29—Car Parks and Taxi Parks.

Use Class 30—Stables.

Use Class 31—Fish Shops and Dry Cleaners.

Use Class 32—Veterinary Establishments, Animal Hospitals, Kennels, Cat Homes.

16. The Zoning Table hereunder (Table 3) sets out:—

- (a) All of the use classes itemised in clause 15 by number. Each number in the first vertical column of the zoning table representing the appropriate use class described in clause 15.
- (b) The basic zones into which the Shire is divided (horizontal columns of the Zoning Table.)
- (c) By cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" and the basic zones whether—
 - (i) the use is permitted as of right indicated by the letter "P".
 - (ii) the use is not permitted unless approval is obtained from the Responsible Authority indicated by the letters "AA".
 - (iii) the use is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use and the approval of the responsible authority is obtained, indicated by the letters "IP".
 - (iv) the use is not permitted indicated by the letter "X".

17. Subject to Part IV of the Scheme—

- (a) land within any zone may not be used for a controlled use (known as a use class) except as authorised by the Zoning Table;
- (b) no building in any zone shall be erected or altered and no building in any zone shall be used or adapted for use for any purpose other than a purpose authorised by the Zoning Table;
- (c) approval under this Part does not exempt the person to whom the approval is granted from the requirement if any, to obtain permission or approval for development on the land under any other law.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

18. No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into operation of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Act, or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

19. (1) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised pursuant to clause 18 no building shall be erected altered or extended or used except with the written approval of the Responsible Authority.

(2) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised pursuant to clause 18, any building thereon may be extended to the limits permitted by the Uniform Building By-laws, or by any other by-laws made under the Local Government Act 1960 for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme.

Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use.

20. (1) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, for a

period of twelve consecutive months, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

(2) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner and/or occupier for that purpose.

21. If any land, to which clause 18 hereof applies, be subdivided only such lots upon which on the coming into operation of the Scheme, there existed substantial buildings or works, or upon which, with the consent of the responsible authority, any enlargement or extension of a building or works had been carried out, may, in pursuance of clause 18, continue to be used for a purpose not conforming with the provisions of the Scheme.

22. A person having the benefit of non-conforming use shall comply with all requirements and conditions as would pertain to the site if it were zoned for its non-conforming use.

PART V.—SPECIAL PROVISIONS AS TO CERTAIN ZONES AND USES.

Site Restrictions.

23. (1) Dwellings: A person shall not erect or convert to use any building or structure as a dwelling or a shop and attached dwelling unless such building or structure is erected on a lot having a frontage of not less than sixty-six (66) feet and an area of not less than eight thousand five hundred (8,500) square feet.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (1) of this clause a dwelling may be erected on any lot resulting from a subdivision approved by the Town Planning Board under the provisions of the Act, or by the Minister on appeal to him under section 26 of the Act.

(3) Provided however, that in the case of a tapered lot having a minimum width of fifty-six (56) feet at a distance of thirty (30) feet from the street alignment, the lot may have a frontage of not less than forty-nine (49) feet six (6) inches.

24. Duplex House: A person shall not erect or convert to use any building or structure as a duplex house unless such building or structure is erected on a lot having a frontage of not less than sixty-six (66) feet and an area of not less than ten thousand, eight hundred and ninety (10,890) square feet.

25. (1) Shops: A person shall not erect or convert to use any building or structure as a shop or local business site unless the building or structure is erected on a lot having a frontage of not less than sixteen (16) feet six (6) inches, and an area of not less than two thousand (2,000) square feet.

(2) On any subdivision subsequent to the coming into operation of the Scheme an access way of a minimum width of sixteen (16) feet six (6) inches shall be provided for services and off-street loading giving access to a public road or street.

26. Light Industrial and General Industrial and Warehouse Zones:

(1) A person shall not stack or place any fuel or raw materials or products or by-products or waste of manufacture in a light industrial, general industrial or warehouse zone between the alignment of the building and the street alignment.

(2) A person shall not in a light industrial, general industrial or warehouse zone use the land between the alignment of the building and the street alignment for any purpose other than for a means of access for parking of vehicles for loading or for unloading vehicles or for lawns or gardens or with the special approval of the Council for trade display.

27. Rural Zone—Wayside Stalls: Within a rural or deferred urban zone temporary structures may be erected as wayside stalls, provided that sales are restricted to those produced or grown on the site by the stall owners.

Plot Ratios, Site Coverage.

28. Dwellings in Residential Zones: A person shall not erect or convert to use any building or structure as a dwelling that, together with any buildings appurtenant thereto is a total gross area that—

- (a) in the case of a dwelling of one storey, exceeds a plot ratio of .33 ($\frac{1}{3}$);
- (b) in the case of a dwelling of two storeys, exceeds a plot ratio of .5 ($\frac{1}{2}$);
- (c) in any case exceeds a percentage site coverage of 33.

29. (1) Shops and Local Business Zones: A person shall not erect or convert to use any building or structure as a shop or other business that together with any buildings appurtenant thereto is of a total gross area that exceeds a plot ratio of 2 and a percentage site coverage of 60.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause 1 hereof, the Responsible Authority may determine in any particular case a percentage site coverage less than that thereby prescribed to enable the site to be adequately drained and to ensure the efficient operation of an effluent disposal system.

Amenity Control.

30. Vehicle Parking and Loading: The purpose of this clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of land so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic on any road or public place. Every person who constructs or who substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building on any site or changes the use of any land or building shall make provision for vehicles used in conjunction with the site (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees or other persons) to stand on or sufficiently close to the site but not on a street while being loaded or unloaded or awaiting use.

31. Size and Location of Car Spaces and Loading Facilities: The minimum dimensions of every required car parking space shall be 18 ft. x 8 ft., excluding all access drives. When considering any development application, the Responsible Authority shall have regard to and impose conditions on the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces and loading facilities. In particular, the Responsible Authority shall take into account, and may impose conditions concerning—

- (a) the proportion of spaces to be roofed or covered,
- (b) the proportion of spaces to be below natural ground level,
- (c) the means of access to each space and the adequacy of any manoeuvring area,
- (d) the location of the spaces on the site and their effect on the amenity of adjoining development, including the potential effect if spaces should later be roofed or covered,
- (e) the adequacy of proposed screening or planting,
- (f) the extent to which spaces are located within required setback areas, and
- (g) the location of proposed footpaths and the effect on traffic movement and safety.

32. Number of Parking and Loading Spaces to be Provided: The number of spaces to be provided in respect of any particular site shall be determined by the Responsible Authority having regard to the nature of the use and the known or likely volumes of goods, materials or people moving to and from the site, and where the use is stipulated, not less than the number of spaces set down in Table 4 hereunder.

6. Theatres, cinemas, halls and non-residential clubs	1 to every 4 persons whom the building is designed to accommodate.

8. Funeral Parlours	Not less than 6 spaces.
9. Educational Establishments	1 to each member of the teaching staff.
10. Motor Repair Stations and Service Stations	1 to each working bay plus 1 to each person employed on the site.
11. Warehouse, Show-rooms, storage yards and Motor Transport depots including incidental offices on premises used for such purposes	1 to each 1,000 sq. ft. of open space and 1 to each 1,000 sq. ft. of gross floor area, or 1 to every 2 persons employed on the site; whichever is the greater.
12. Light Industry, General Industry	1 to every 500 sq. ft of gross floor area, or 1 to every 2 persons employed; whichever is the greater.
13. Shops	1 to every 135 sq. ft of gross floor area.
14. Administrative, commercial and professional offices.	1 to each 400 sq. ft. of floor area.

PART VI.—BUILDING ALIGNMENTS.

33. Set Back Lines: A person shall not erect any building closer to the front of any lot, than the distances specified hereunder:—

- (a) in General Industrial, Hotel, Motel or Rural Zones, a line fifty (50) feet inside and parallel to the alignment of the street boundary on which such land abuts.
- (b) in all other zones a line 30 feet inside and parallel to the alignment of the street boundary.
- (c) provided however, that in the case of land abutting on Albany Highway and Mills Road the set back line shall be established by measurement as aforesaid but in relation to the Building Line established by the Shire of Gosnells Building Line By-laws numbers 1 and 2 and not in relation to the alignment of Albany Highway and Mills Road.

34. Irregular Frontages: Where the road or street alignment is curved, irregular or not at right angles to the side boundaries of the land, a person may erect a building in front of the set back line, provided that the mean of the greatest and least distance of the building from the road or street is not less than the distance fixed for the set back line.

35. Corner Lots: Where a lot has a frontage to more than one road or street, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) The set back line shall be forty (40) feet from the lesser frontage.
- (b) With the approval of the Responsible Authority in a residential zone or a light industrial zone, a person may erect a building nearer to one only of the roads or streets than the set back line, but not nearer than fifteen (15) feet to that road or street.

- (c) With the approval of the Responsible Authority, in a business zone a person may erect a building nearer to one only of the roads or streets than the set back line, but not nearer than ten (10) feet to that road or street.

36. Existing Adjoining Buildings.—If in the case of any lot, buildings have been erected on the lots adjoining on both sides and one or both of these buildings is in front of the set back line, the Responsible Authority may permit a building to be erected on the firstmentioned lot in front of the set back line, but not nearer to the road or street than the front of the rearmost building, but in any case not nearer to the road or street than fifteen (15) feet.

PART VII—GENERAL.

37. No building of any class shall be erected unless means of access be provided for the removal of rubbish and servicing to every separate tenement and/or shop within the building. The means of servicing shall be provided in such a manner that every separate tenement or shop can be serviced without passing through the front entrance thereof or through any other shop or tenement.

38. No land shall be subdivided or built on until it is drained and/or filled as instructed or directed to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority; and, in the case of land to be built on, provision also made for the disposal of roof water and any household or trade waste, to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

39. Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may, by its Shire Clerk or other authorised office, enter, at all reasonable times, any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the scheme are being observed.

40. (1) Application for Consent: Any application for the consent of the Responsible Authority under the provisions of this regulation shall be made in writing to the Responsible Authority and shall—

- (a) describe both by reference to the particulars of title and by plan, the land in respect of which the application is made;
- (b) state the interest of the applicant in the said land;
- (c) state the purpose for which the said land is used at the date of the application;
- (d) describe the matter, in respect of which the consent is sought;
- (e) if the applicant be not the owner of the said land, be accompanied by the written approval of such owner to the application;
- (f) if the application is for consent to the erection carrying out enlargement rebuilding or extension of any building the application shall conform to the requirements of the Uniform Building By-laws.

(2) The Responsible Authority may require and the applicant shall furnish further information which the Responsible Authority may consider necessary in order that it may deal with the application.

41. Consent to Lapse: Every consent given pursuant to the Scheme by the Responsible Authority shall, unless extended by the Responsible Authority, lapse at the expiration of twelve (12) months from the date upon which that consent is given, if—

- (a) where consent is given for land to be used for a specified purpose, that use has not commenced,
- or
- (b) where consent is for the erection carrying out enlargement rebuilding or extension of any building or works, that erection carrying out enlargement rebuilding or extension (as the case may be) has not been commenced.

42. Annual Permit: Where any use class is permitted under the Scheme subject to an annual permit from the Responsible Authority, an application shall be made annually by the owner or occupier as required by the Responsible Authority.

43. Service of Notices: Any notice for enforcing the scheme shall be served in accordance with the provisions of Section 657 of the Local Government Act 1960 and that section shall apply to the Scheme as if reprinted here.

44. Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purposes of Part II shall be made not later than six months from coming into operation of the Scheme.

45. Penalties: Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein or by the Act is liable to a penalty of \$100.

TOWN PLANNING SCHEME No. 12, AMENDMENT No. 1.

1. In addition to the Maps now forming part of and attached to Shire of Canning Town Planning Scheme No. 12, published in the *Government Gazette* of 25th March, 1966, (hereinafter called "the Scheme") the Maps marked and designated as Scheme Maps numbered 4 and 5 shall form part of the Maps of the Scheme.

2. For the purpose of Clauses 6, 12 and 16 of the Scheme, the lands delineated and marked Area A, Area C, Area D, Area E, and Area F on Map No. 4 shall be excluded from the old Lots.

3. For the purpose of Clauses 7, 11 and 16 of the Scheme the Lots numbered 46, 47, 52, 71, 75, 76, 77, 78, 81, 95, 96 on Map No. 5 of the Scheme shall be excluded from the new Lots.

THE Narembeen Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- Controlling land development by zoning;
- other matters authorized by the enabling Act.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Narembeen Town Planning Scheme No. 1. (Narembeen town area) hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps in the Appendices hereto.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Narembeen.

1.4 In the Scheme the planning area is divided into the following zones—

- Residential
- Commercial
- Industrial
- Rural

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme is divided into the following Parts and Appendices:—

- Part I.—Preliminary
- Part II.—Zones
- Part III.—Non-conforming Uses
- Part IV.—Finance and Administration

The remaining documents of the Scheme are appended as follows:—

- Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2"
- Planning Proposals Map marked "Map No. 3" or Approved Planning Scheme Map marked "Map No. 4" (as the case may be).

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1963, except that the following words shall be added to the definition of service station—"a cafe may also form part of such premises".

PART II.—ZONES.

2.1 Table No. 1. appended to Clause 2.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross references between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

2.2 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1. appended to this clause have the following meanings—

- "P" = A use that is permitted under the provisions of this Scheme.

“AA” = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Responsible Authority.

“IP” = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Responsible Authority.

“X” = A use that is not permitted.

By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

3.3 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART IV.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

4.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

4.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

4.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorized officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

4.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

2.3 (a) No development of any land in the Scheme Area shall be commenced or continued without the approval of the Responsible Authority.

(b) Approval under this Part does not exempt the person to whom exemption is granted from the requirements, if any, to obtain promises or approval for development on the land under any other law.

2.4 No building shall be so constructed or finished or left unfinished that its external appearance would disfigure the locality or tend to depreciate the value of adjoining property. Further, all land and buildings shall be so maintained as to preserve the amenities of the neighbourhood in which they are situated.

PART III.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorizing the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

3.2 (a) Where in respect of land zoned under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorized as mentioned in clause 3.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building
