At a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 15th day of May, 1968, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Land Act, 1933-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 2236/65.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, it is inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the conditions that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 28651 (Kununurra Lot 970) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Roman Catholic Vicar Apostolic of the Kimberleys to be held in trust for the purpose of "School and Church Purposes (Roman Cathlic)": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Land Act, 1933-1967. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 1895/66.—That Reserve No. 29175 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Cranbrook, in trust for the purpose of "Public Recreation."

Corres. 857/68.—That Reserve No. 29177 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Upper Blackwood in trust for the purpose of "Public Recreation."

Corres. 1165/65.—That Reserve No. 29180 should vest in and be held by the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board in trust for the purpose of a "Fire Station."

Corres. 2543/40.—That Reserve No. 29183 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Bassendean in trust for the purpose of "Drainage."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres. 614/12 (R.2268).


