AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 10th day of July, 1968, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Local Government Act, 1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL. L. &. S. Corres. 1691/68 (R.2292).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by

Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Shire of Busselton has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within its municipal district be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.






