WHEREAS it is provided, firstly, by subsection (1) of section 79 of the Married Persons and Children (Summary Relief) Act, 1965, that, where the Governor is satisfied that the law in any country makes provision for the enforcement in that country of maintenance orders made in another country of maintenance orders made in another country, the Governor may, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, declare that country to be a reciprocating country for the purposes of Part V of the Act; secondly, by subsection (3) of that section that the Governor may specify, in relation to the country to which the proclamation applies, a date, which may be before or after or the same day as the date of the proclamation, and declare that maintenance orders made in that country on after that date shall be enforceable in the State in accordance with the provisions of Division 3 of Part V of the Act; and, thirdly, by subsection (4) of that section that the Governor may, by like proclamation, vary or further vary any proclamation made under subsection (1) or (2) of the section; and whereas the Governor did by proclamation made the 17th February, 1966, and published in the Government Gazette on the 25th February, In the Government Gazette on the 25th February, 1966, declare, among other countries, the Federated Malay States and Sarawak to be reciprocating countries for the purposes of Part V of the Act and it is now expedient that, to that extent, the proclamation be varied; and whereas I, the Lieutenant Governor, am satisfied that the law of the Federation of Malaysia makes provision for the enforcement in that country of maintenance orders made in another country: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, do vary the proclamation hereinbefore mentioned by deleting from the schedule thereto the reference to the Federated Malay States and Sarawak and do, by this pro-

clamation, declare the Federation of Malaysia to be a reciprocating country for the purposes of Part V of the Married Persons and Children (Summary Relief) Act, 1965, and declare that maintenance orders made in any of the component States of the said Federation that were in force on, and are in force after, the 16th September, 1963, and maintenance orders made and in force in the said Federation after that date shall be enforceable in the State, in accordance with Division 3 of Part V of the said $\mbox{Act}.$
