WHEREAS by section 31 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, the Governor may by Proclamation and subject to such conditions as may be expressed therein, classifying as of Class "A" any lands of the Crown reserved to Her Majesty for any of the purposes specified in the said section; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the addition to Class "A" Reserve No. 9868 "Protection and Preservation of Caves and Flora, and for Health and Pleasure

Resort," comprised in Swan Location 8239 should be classified as of Class "A": Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator with the advice of Executive Council do by this my proclamation classify as of Class "A" the addition to Class "A" Reserve No. 9868 comprised in Swan Location 8239. (Plan Yanchep 40, Sheet 1.)

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 3127/65.—That Reserve No. 28397 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Works in trust for the purpose of "Drainage".

Corres. 3314/46.—That Reserve No. 28399 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Manjimup in trust for the purpose of a "Kindergarten".

Corres. 3693/66.—That Reserve No. 29244 should vest in and be held by Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board in trust for the purpose of "Water Supply".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 4791/13, V.5.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 29241 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Fisheries and Fauna in trust for the purpose of "Conservation of Fauna (University Marsupial Research)": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Fisheries and Fauna in trust for "Conservation of Fauna (University Marsupial Research)", with power to the said Minister for Fisheries and Fauna to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Local Government Act, 1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres 861/12 (R.1812).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Shire of Murray has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within its municipal district be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.
