the Poisons Act, 1964, as amended, and from the regulations from time to time in force thereunder, the substance paint as defined by the Toxic and Hazardous Substances Regulations in force under the Health Act, 1911-1966.

Factories and Shops Act, 1963-1965.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by Section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1967, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas the Australia and New Zealand Bank Limited of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the Section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the Section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) given by the Bank charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Australia and New Zealand Bank Limited of St. George's Terrace, Perth, from the operation of Section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1967 for a period expiring on the 20th day of June, 1970.

Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954. Shire of Bridgetown.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, all owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Bridgetown are hereby required, on or before the 30th November, 1968 to establish fire breaks clear of all infiammable materials and thereafter maintain such fire breaks clear of all infiammable materials until the 13th day of March, 1969, in the following positions on land owned or occupied by them:—

Rural Lands.

(a) Not less than six feet in width inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land which enjoy a common boundary with a formed public road, provided that the burning of the road verge along the boundary referred to herein shall be deemed to be a sufficient alternative.

(b) Not less than ten feet in width immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks, with a further break six feet in width within one chain of the perimeter of haystacks.

(c) Not less than six feet in width around the perimeter of land on which a cereal crop is planted.

(d) On all cleared land not less than six feet in width within one chain of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

Townsites.

(a) Lots used for grazing purposes or in agricultural pursuits:

(i) Not less than six feet in width inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land which enjoy a common boundary with a formed public road, provided that the burning of the road verge along the boundary referred to herein shall be deemed to be a sufficient alternative.

- (ii) Not less than ten feet in width immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks, with a further break six feet in width within one chain of the perimeter of haystacks.
- (iii) Not less than six feet in width around the perimeter of land on which a cereal crop is planted.
- (iv) On all cleared land not less than six feet in width within one chain of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

(b) All other lots: Effective firebreaks around the perimeter of all buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least three feet; or where the boundary is closer than three feet then for that lesser distance.

(c) All townsite lots: To be cleared of all infiammable material and rubbish on or before the 30th day of November, 1968 and kept clear of such material until the 13th day of March, 1969.

Provided that if, for any reason, it is impracticable to clear firebreaks in the situation required by this notice, any suitable alteration to the foregoing may be nominated or approved by either the Bush Fire Control Officer or Captain of the Bush Fire Brigade in the area concerned.

The owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects to comply with the above requirements is guilty of an offence under subsection 3 of section 33 of the Act and is liable to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more than two hundred dollars, in addition to which the council may have the work carried out and may recover the cost of such work from the owner and/or occupier.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954. (Section 33.) Shire of Kulin, Firebreak Order,

NOTICE to owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Kulin:---

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, owners or occupiers of land are hereby required, on or before 15th October, 1968, to plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all infiammable material, firebreaks of not less than 7 feet in width in the following positions:—

Rural Land:

- (1) Inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the property or properties.
- (2) Where the total area of each property exceeds 500 acres, additional firebreaks must be provided in such positions as to divide the property into areas not exceeding 500 acres, each area to be completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (3) Where buildings or haystacks are situated on the property, additional firebreaks not less than ten feet in width must be provided within five chains of the perimeter of such buildings or haystacks, in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings or haystacks.

Townsite Land:

(1) Owners or occupiers of townsite land are requested to remove all infiammable material from the whole of the land by 31st October, 1968.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Shire Council must be obtained to construct such firebreaks in an alternative position. Approval to any such variation will only be granted where the Bush Fire Officer for the area has first signified his approval of the variation.






