Land Act, 1933.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1748/67.

WHEREAS by Section 33 of the Land Act, 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 28573 should vest in and be held by Crawford David Nalder the Minister for Agriculture for the time being and his Successors in office in trust for the purpose of Western Australian Potato Marketing Board Site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by Crawford David Nalder the Minister for Agriculture for the time being and his Successors in office, in trust for Western Australian Potato Marketing Board Site with power to the said Crawford David Nalder the Minister for Agriculture for the time being and his Successors in office, in trust for Western Australian Potato Marketing Board Site with power to the said Crawford David Nalder the Minister for Agriculture for the time being and his Successors in office subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1967. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1502/63.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1967, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 29267 (Geraldton Lot 2435) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Baptist Union of Western Australia Incorporated to be held in trust for a "Church Site (Baptist Union)": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Local Government Act, 1960

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the councils mentioned in the schedule hereunder have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Excutive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such land shall, from the date of the Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

6. Rivers:-On all river banks a firebreak will be provided on the cleared land as close as is practicable but not further than three (3) chains from High water mark.

Townsite:-The whole of all Townsite and 7. subdivision lots to be cleared of all infiammable debris. Additionally a firebreak seven (7) feet wide completely free of all infiammable material cleared inside and along the external boundaries.

8. Fuel Dumps:--All grass or other infiammable materials must be cleared from areas where fuel drums, either empty or containing fuel, are stored or intended to be stored. The cleared area is to extend for a distance of ten (10) feet completely surrounding the fuel drums.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks in the positions required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to provide them in an alternative situation.

Firebreaks in the situation hereunder will be accepted as complying with the requirements of the notice so far as it applies to the common boundary between the land of any owner or occupier and the abutting lands referred to hereunder:-

(a) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on the public road and the owner

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

(4) Townsites-Blocks with buildings: Provide by the 31st October, 1968, and maintain thereafter until the 31st March, 1969, a firebreak cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least three feet inside and around the boundary of each block.

Cotherstone Road, Scheme, Kalamunda.

RESOLVED that the Shire of Kalamunda in pursuance of Section No. 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1962, prepare the above Town Planning Scheme with reference to an area situated wholly within the Kalamunda Shire and enclosed within the outer edge of a blue border on the plan now produced to the Kalamunda Shire Council, and marked, and designated as Plan Nos. 1 and 2 and No. 3, the scheme proposals plan, and certified by the President and the Shire Clerk under their hands dated the 20th day of May, 1968.

Town Planning Scheme No. 3.

Cotherstone Road Scheme.

Scheme Text:

1. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Kalamunda (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

2. Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within a blue border on Plan Nos. 1 and 2 and on Plan No. 3, the scheme proposals plan. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Area".

3. General Objects: The general objects of the scheme are—

- (a) to improve and develop the area to the best possible advantage;
- (b) to make suitable provision for the better use of the land within the Area for building purposes;
- (c) to make suitable provision for roads within the Area;
- (d) to ensure proper drainage of those parts of the Area that require drainage.

4. Works to be Carried Out: The following works shall be carried out within the Area:—

- (a) The Area shall be resurveyed in conformity with the design as shown on the Scheme proposal plan, with such minor variations as may be determined by the Council;
- (b) The roads of which the proposed carriageway is coloured yellow on the Scheme proposals plan, shall be constructed and drained.
- (c) The land coloured green on Plan No. 3 the Scheme proposals plan, shall be set aside for public open space and the land coloured blue shall be set aside as a dam site.
- (d) To make provision for water reticulation.

5. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

6. Valuations: The land within the Area shown on Plan Nos. 1 and 2 shall be valued at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme.

7. The lots created by the re-survey of the Area in accordance with Plan No. 3, (hereinafter called "New Lots") shall be valued on the basis that all works have been undertaken as part of the Scheme and the drainage has been carried out.

8. The valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or by some person appointed by him to ascertain the unimproved value as defined by Section 533(3) of the Local Government Act, 1960-1962.

9. Increased Value Ratio: From the sum of the values of the new lots shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the new lots. The increased value ratio is the relationship between the sum of the values of the old lots and the net value of the new lots.

10. Owners Interest in Scheme: Each owner from whom an old lot or portion of an old lot has been resumed, shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in this Scheme of a value equal to the value of the land resumed from him increased in the ratio of the "increase value ratio" determined in accordance with paragraph (9) hereof. The Council being the owners of land described as Lot 11 Canning Location 422, Canning Location 420 and Ptn. of Canning Location 227 shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in this scheme of a value equal to the value of the land made available to the scheme increased in the ratio of the increase value ratio determined in accordance with paragraph (9) hereof.

11. Costs of Scheme: The scheme shall be debited with—

- (a) the administration costs of the Scheme, including a sum of recoup the Council with overhead costs as may be relative to this Scheme;
- (b) the costs of the works to be carried out;
- (c) all compensation payable and expenses and all costs of determining and settling compensation;
- (d) the estimated compensation and costs payable under clause 12 hereof;
- (e) the costs of acquisition of any land within the Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption;
- (f) the cost incurred by the Metropolitan Water Board in providing water mains for the service of the Area. The costs of the Scheme shall be divided equally between the new lots on the Scheme proposal plan.

12. Estimate of Compensation: In the event of any claim for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance of this Scheme, the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the net amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing, the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be and shall form part of the receipts or expenditure of this Scheme.

13. Time Limit for Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six (6) months of the coming into operation of the Scheme, or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption or the issue of a notice of rescission under clause 21 hereof whichever is the later.

14. Allocation and Disposal of New Lots: The new lots created by the re-survey of the Area shall be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) Each owner of an old lot or portion thereto will be offered the new lot or lots with the position and dimensions as nearly as possible as that shown on Plan No. 3 bearing the numbers shown in red assigned to his old lot on Plan Nos. 1 and 2 (hereinafter called "replacement lots").
- (b) The Council shall set aside sufficient lots (hereinafter called "saleable lots") in order that the costs of the Scheme may be paid from the sale of them.
- (c) The remaining new lots shall be apportioned among the owners of the old lots as equitably as possible and offered to such owners.
- (d) The offer mentioned in subclause (c) hereof will be made either with an offer of payment of money or subject to the owners making a payment of money in order that the total value of the replacement lots offered and the new value of any land within the Scheme area not required by the Council and retained by the owner, together with or subject to a payment in money, is equal to the owners interest in the Scheme as ascertained in accordance with clause (10) hereof.
- (e) An owner from whom land has been resumed but to whom no offer of land is made shall be offered a cash payment equal to that owners interest in the Scheme.

15. Nature of Offers: The offers mentioned in clause 14 hereof shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by certified post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot or lots the subject of the offer and the old lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owners interest in the Scheme, how the offer is calculated, the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be.

16. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

17. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time, shall, subject to clause 22 hereof, be deemed to have been rejected. No acceptance of the offer shall be deemed a valid acceptance unless all rates and taxes owned by the owner of land within the area specified have been paid.

18. The offer of the replacement lot may be accepted and the offer of the remaining lots may be rejected.

19. If the offer of the replacement lot be accepted only the replacement lots shall be treated as being in payment on account of any claim for compensation the owner may have for the resumption of his old lot or by reason of the operation of this Scheme.

20. If the offer be wholly accepted it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme.

21. Registration of Transfers: The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each offer of a replacement lot which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1959, and return it to the Council for registration within and return it to the Council for registration within twenty-eight (28) days after having called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer), the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon where a shall have a claim agging the Council such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the land in respect of which the offer of the replacement lot or lots was made and the land subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

Rejected Lots: If an owner does not accept an offer made to him by the Council in accord-ance with this Scheme or fails to complete a transfer of the said lot in the manner aforesaid, the Council may deal with the lots so affected as hereinafter appears.

Sale of Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots: The Council may sell the saleable lots and the re-Jected lots either by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recom-mended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation De-partment of Western Australia, unless, after sub-mitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not be obtained.

24. Valuation of Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots: The Council may instead of selling all or any of the saleable lots or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained, sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

25. Profits of Scheme: In the event of the Scheme showing a profit, the profit shall be divided equally among the replacement lots and shall be paid to the owners who accept the offer mentioned in clause 14 (a) hereof. The amount of profit referable to rejected lots shall be paid to the Council.

26. Encumbrances on Title: In the event of any land in the Area being subject to a regis-tered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser, mortgagee; chargee or lessee, the Council shall not transfer a new lot to the owner unless subject to similar encumbrances or with the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance.

27. Powers of Council: The Council in the con-duct and management of this Scheme shall have the following powers:-

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Area.
- (b) To enter into agreement or arrangement with the owners of any land within the Area.
- (c) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (d) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land within the Area.
- (e) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of land within the area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit.
- (f) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreement relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (g) To demolish wholly or partly any buildings which are in the area of or within the building lines of any new streets on Plan No. 3.
- (h) To make minor variations to the survey design where necessary or desirable.

Arbitration: Any dispute or difference aris-28. ing out of the operation of this Scheme may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in the manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any Statutory modification thereof for e being in force.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Meekatharra.

1.4 In the Scheme the planning area is divided into zones.

Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme is 1.5 divided into the following Parts and Appendices:-

- Part I.—Preliminary. Part II.-Zones.
- Part III.-Non-conforming Uses.
- Part IV .--- Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are appended as follows:-

- (1) Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2".
- (2) Planning Proposals Map marked "Map No. 3" or Approved Planning Scheme Map marked "Map No. 4" (as the case may be). (3) Scheme Report.

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1963, except that the following words shall be added to the definition of service station:—"a cafe may also form part of such premises"

PART II.-ZONES.

2.1 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross references between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Tallist of "Zones" on the top of the Table. on the left-hand side of the Table and the

2.3. (a) No development of any land in the Scheme Area shall be commenced or continued without the approval of the Responsible Authority.

(b) Approval under this Part does not exempt the person to whom exemption is granted from the requirements, if any, to obtain permission or approval for development on the land under any other law.

- PART III.-NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.
 - 3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent-(a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
 - (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Develop-ment Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law, authorising the development to be law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

3.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 3.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may by extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under the Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for the class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

3.3 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART IV .- FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

4.1-Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authare belowed and the second sec

4.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette.

4.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

4.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

When conexcluding all access drives. sidering any development application, the Council shall have regard to and impose conditions on the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces. In particular the Council shall take into account, and may impose conditions concerning:
 - (a) the proportion of car spaces to be roofed or covered;
 - (b) the proportion of car spaces to be below natural ground level;
 - (c) the means of access to each car space and the adequacy of any vehicular manoeuvring area;
 - (d) the location of the car spaces on the site and their effect on the amenity of adjoining development, including the potential effect if those spaces should later be roofed or covered;
