AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth, on the 7th day of August, 1968, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Clean Air Act, 1964-1967. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 6 of the Clean Air Act, 1964-1967, that the Governor may by Order in Council from time to time amend the Schedule to the Act by adding thereto or removing therefrom any premises or class of premises and the Schedule as so amended shall be the Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act doth hereby amend the schedule to the Act—

- (a) by removing from paragraph (a) the premises or class of premises being used for "chemical works (class 2)" and in lieu thereof, adding to that paragraph the following premises or class of premises being used for
 - chemical works (class 2), being premises in which any chemical or chemical product not included, or referred to, in the definition of the premises or class of premises of chemical works (class 1) is manufactured, blended, mixed or re-packaged, and in which the nature or natures of the processes carried on, or the materials used is or are likely to cause air pollution; ; and
- (b) by removing from paragraph (a) the premises or class of premises being used for "scrap metal recovery works" and in lieu thereof, adding to that paragraph the following premises or class of premises being used for—

scrap metal reclaiming works, being premises in which scrap is treated by heat for the recovery of metal, irrespective of whether that is the principal activity carried on on any particular premises, and including premises where metal is recovered from scrap cable by burning the insulation on that cable.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Local Government Act, 1960. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.
