Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1967.

Metropolitan Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 816381/68.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1967, it is provided that subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works, and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Council: Now, therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Shire of Cockburn.

(a) The construction of a twenty-one inch diameter water main about one thousand feet in length.

(b) The construction of an eighteen inch diameter water main about four thousand two hundred and fifteen feet in length.

(c) The construction of a twelve inch diameter water main about three thousand two hundred and seventy feet in length.

(d) The construction of an eight inch diameter water main about one thousand and ninety-five feet in length.

The above mains to be complete with valves and all other necessary apparatus and as shown on Plan M.W.B. No. 9918.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 23rd day of August, 1968.

Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts a constructed road, and the owner or occupier has after obtaining the approval of the Council, burned or cleared the bush between the road formation and the boundary of his land, such firebreaks will be accepted as complying with the requirements of this notice so far as it applies to the abutting boundaries of the property.

## 2. Townsite Land (Mingenew): On or before 1st November, 1968:—

- (a) Vacant Blocks: Provide and thereafter maintain until 15th April, 1969, an effective firebreak around the perimeter of all

vacant blocks, cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least six feet (or) completely remove all inflammable material from vacant blocks, and thereafter keep clean until 15th April, 1969.

- (b) Blocks with Buildings: Provide and thereafter maintain until 15th April, 1969, an effective firebreak around the perimeter of all buildings or group of buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land, cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least three feet or where the boundary is closer than three feet then for that lesser distance.

## BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

Shire of Murray-Pinjarra.

Notice pursuant to Section 33.

Firebreak Order.

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land.

Burning is not Permitted on Sundays (except in areas defined in Item No. 4).

PURSUANT to the powers contained in the above Act, you are hereby required by the 30th November, 1968, to clear, and thereafter maintain clear, of all inflammable material, until the 15th March, 1969, firebreaks in the positions, and by the dates, as set out hereunder.

## 1. Rural Lands—breaks to be completed by 30th November, 1968:—

- (a) On all land, having an area of 1 acre or more, which is not within a townsite or subdivision, a firebreak at least 6 feet wide, inside and along the external boundaries of all properties.
- (b) Immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks or within 5 chains of the perimeter of all buildings and haystacks.

## 2. Townsites—breaks to be completed by 30th November, 1968:—

On all land a firebreak 6 feet wide inside the external boundaries of such land having an area of 1 acre or more. Lots of less than 1 acre to be cleared of all inflammable material.

## 3. Subdivisions approved by Shire Council—breaks to be completed by 30th November, 1968:—

On all lots having an area of less than 1 acre, a firebreak of 6 feet wide inside and along the external boundaries of each lot, or all inflammable material must be cleared from each lot.

On all lots having an area of 1 acre or more, a firebreak at least 6 feet wide inside and along the external boundaries of each lot.

Where several adjacent lots are held by one owner, the break may be provided along the perimeter of such holdings.

## 4. Sunday Burning—Subdivisional Residential Lots Only:—

Between 15th October and 30th November, 1968, burning on Sundays is permitted for the purpose of removing fire hazards from residential lots within the subdivisions of Murray Bend, Ravenswood, North and South Yunderup, Furnissdale, Coodanup, Riverview Estate and Riverside Gardens Estate.

Owners are requested to exercise caution when undertaking burning operations and should not proceed to burn during high temperatures or under conditions when a fire could escape from effective control.

## Absentee Owners of Subdivisional Lots:—

Contractors are available in the subdivisional areas to undertake this work if required. Arrangements should be made with contractor direct at an early date, to ensure that breaks are completed by required date.

It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the firebreaks comply with this order. The Shire will not arrange for this work to be done.

Note: If, for any reason, it is considered impractical to comply with any provision of this order, a written application for a variation may be made to the Shire Clerk and must reach him no less than two weeks prior to the date by which the firebreak is required to be established. Any such application must bear the signature of the fire control officer for the area, signifying his agreement to the variation.

Inspections: An officer of the Council will inspect properties and prosecutions could result where this order is not complied with.

Penalty: Minimum fine, \$10; maximum, \$200.

#### BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

Shire of Plantagenet.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Plantagenet are required to remove from the land owned or occupied by them all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of May, 1969:

1. Rural Land: Owners and Occupiers of Land other than within a townsite shall—

- (a) plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear firebreaks, not less than six feet wide, inside and along and within one chain of the boundaries of all the land owned or occupied by them, or inside and along and within one chain of the boundaries of all land used for pasture and for crops; and
- (b) plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear firebreaks, not less than 10 feet wide, immediately adjacent to the perimeter of all grain producing crops.

As an alternative to (a) and (b) above it is permissible to plough, cultivate or otherwise clear firebreaks, not less than 10 feet wide, inside and along and within one chain of the boundaries of all land owned or occupied by them or inside and along and within one chain of the boundaries of all land owned or occupied by them and used for pasture and for grain producing crops; irrespective of whether such grain producing crops are to be harvested or not; and

- (c) plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear firebreaks not less than six feet wide, around and within five chains of all buildings and haystacks.

All firebreaks as designated above must be prepared on or before the 15th day of November, 1968 within that portion of the Shire lying generally east of the dividing line described in Schedule No. 10 (*Government Gazette* No. 72 of the 2nd August, 1968, page 2276) and on or before the 15th day of December, 1968 within that portion of the Shire lying generally west of the dividing line described in Schedule No. 10 (*Government Gazette* No. 72 of the 2nd August, 1968, page 2276).

2. Townsite Land: Owners and Occupiers of land within a townsite shall—

- on or before the 15th day of December, 1968, remove from the land owned or occupied by them all inflammable material or in cases where such townsite lots are used for grazing purposes or agricultural pursuits, clear a firebreak of not less than six feet in width around and within the boundaries of such individual or combined lots used as one parcel of land for such

grazing or agricultural purposes, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreak clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of May, 1969.

"Inflammable material" is defined for the purposes of this order to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act), timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like inflammable materials, rubbish, and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes and plants in gardens, or lawns.

#### BUSH FIRES ACT 1954. (Section 33.)

Pingelly Shire Council

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Pingelly.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 11th day of November, 1968, to plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than six (6) feet wide in the following positions on all land owned or occupied by you and thereafter to maintain such firebreaks until the 1st day of April, 1969:—

(a) Rural Land:

- (i) Inside and within one (1) chain of the boundaries of all land used for pasture;
- (ii) Within one (1) chain of the boundary of all land under crop;
- (iii) Within five (5) chains of the perimeter of all buildings on the land.

Firebreaks in the situation described hereunder will be acceptable as complying with the requirements of this notice as far as it applies to the common boundary between the lands of any owners and occupiers and the abutting lands referred to hereunder:—

- (i) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on a public road and the owner or occupier has burned or cleared the bush between the road formation and the common boundary. (NOTE: ploughing of road sides is prohibited by the Pingelly Shire Council).
- (ii) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on Crown Land or Reserves and the owner or occupier has cleared a fire break not less than six (6) feet wide on the Crown Land or Reserve along the Common boundary.

(b) Townsite Land:

- (i) All vacant Lots are required to be cleared of all debris and inflammable material;
- (ii) Material constituting a fire hazard to be cleared from all other Townsite Lots.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to comply with any provision of this notice, a written application for a variation may be made to the Shire Council and must reach the Shire Clerk by the 8th day of November, 1968.

#### BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

Shire of Toodyay.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Toodyay.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required, on or before the dates referred to below, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with

the following, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable materials up to and including the 28th day of April, 1969.

A. Rural Land (i.e. all land within the Shire of Toodyay other than land within the townsite).

- (1) You shall on or before the 28th day of October, 1968, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least six feet wide inside and within five chains of the external boundaries of the land owned or occupied by you, and
- (2) You shall on or before the 28th day of October, 1968, where more than 500 acres of land owned or occupied by you has been cleared or part cleared for agricultural purposes, clear of all inflammable material additional firebreaks not less than six feet wide so as to divide the land which has been cleared or part cleared for agricultural purposes into areas of not more than 500 acres, and
- (3) You shall, on or before the 28th day of October, 1968, where buildings or haystacks exist on the land owned or occupied by you, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than six feet wide within five chains of the perimeter of such building or haystack in such manner as to completely encircle the building or haystack, and
- (4) You shall on or before the 28th day of October, 1968, where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than one chain wide in the following positions on the land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated—
  - (a) Immediately inside the external boundaries of the land, and
  - (b) In such positions as would divide the land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.
- (5) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained, or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and such bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush is completed after the 28th day of October, 1968, you shall, within 28 days of completing the bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than one chain wide in the following positions

on the land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated:—

- (a) Immediately inside the external boundaries of the land, and
- (b) In such positions as would divide the land into separate areas of not more than 300 acres, each surrounded by a firebreak at least one chain wide.

If for any reason it is considered to be impractical to clear firebreaks, or to remove inflammable material from land as required by Part A. of this notice, you may apply in writing to the Council or its duly authorised officer on or before the 14th day of October, 1968, for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position.

If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

B. Townsite Land (i.e. all land within any townsite within the Shire of Toodyay).

- (1) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1968, clear all inflammable material from the whole of the land owned or occupied by you.

If the land referred to in part B. of this notice is used permanently for the purpose of grazing animals you may apply in writing to the Council or its duly authorised officer, on or before the 1st day of November, 1968, for permission to clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least six feet wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land in lieu of removing all inflammable materials from the whole of the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects to comply with the requirements of this order is guilty of an offence under subsection 3 of section 33 of the Act and is liable to a penalty of not less than \$10 or more than \$200, and the Council may do the work and charge the owner or occupier for such work.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Prohibited Burning Times:

Zone 4: November 1st, 1968, to February 2nd, 1969.

Zone 6: November 1st, 1968, to February 28th, 1969.

Goomalling Town Planning Scheme, No. 1.

IT is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) that the Hon. Minister for Town Planning approved the Shire of Goomalling Town Planning Scheme No. 1 on the 20th August, 1968, the Scheme Text of which is published hereunder.

#### SHIRE OF GOOMALLING TOWN PLANNING SCHEME No. 1.

THE Goomalling Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) Setting aside land for future public use as reserves.
- (b) Controlling land development by zoning.
- (c) Other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

#### PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Goomalling Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.



1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps in the Appendices hereto.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Goomalling hereinafter called "the Responsible Authority".

1.4 In the Scheme the planning area is divided into reserves and zones. The basic types of reserves are—

- Public Open Space.
- Public Purposes.
- Roads.
- Railways.

The basic types of zones are—

- Residential.
- Commercial.
- Industrial.
- Rural.

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme:

- Part I.—Preliminary.
- Part II.—Reserved Land.
- Part III.—Zones.
- Part IV.—Non-Conforming Uses.
- Part V.—Special Provisions.
- Part VI.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are appended as follows:

- (1) Land Use Map marked "Map No. 2".
- (2) Planning Proposals Map marked "Map No. 3" until such time as notice of the Minister's final approval is published in the *Government Gazette* when Map No. 3 is replaced by—
- (3) Approved Planning Scheme Map marked "Map No. 4".

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1963, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

#### PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

##### Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the approved Planning Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this scheme, other than by the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Responsible Authority.

(c) In giving its approval the Responsible Authority shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.2 (a) Where the Responsible Authority refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Any claim for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Responsible Authority not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Responsible Authority refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Responsible Authority may purchase the land affected by the decision of the Responsible Authority at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions.

#### PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 Table No. 1 appended to clause 3.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that table.

3.2 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

- "P" = A use that is permitted as of right under the provisions of this Scheme.
- "AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Responsible Authority.
- "IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Responsible Authority.
- "X" = A use that is not permitted.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning & Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Responsible Authority has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on the land such land may continue to be used for that purpose so long as any buildings or works comprised thereon at such approved date is not, except with the consent of the responsible authority, enlarged, rebuilt or extended. Such consent may be refused if in the opinion of the Responsible Authority the use thereon as enlarged rebuilt or extended is likely to cause injury to or prejudicially effect the amenity of the neighbourhood or to increase any existing injury to or prejudicially effect of the neighbourhood.

4.3 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

## PART V.—SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 Building Line: No building shall be constructed closer to the road or street alignment or alignments of the lot on which it stands than the distances prescribed hereunder:—

- (a) For land in the Residential Zone—twenty-five (25) feet.
- (b) In the Business Zone—street alignment.
- (c) In the Light Industry Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (d) In the General Industrial Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (e) In the Fuel Depot Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (f) In the Service Station Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (g) In the Church and Institutional Zone—thirty (30) feet.
- (h) In the Hotel Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (i) In the Motel Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (j) In the Drive-In Theatre Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (k) In the Sale Yard Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (l) In the Rural Zone—fifty (50) feet.
- (m) In the Special Site Zone—fifty (50) feet, except that the Responsible Authority may at their discretion reduce the prescribed distance to less than fifty (50) feet on land within this zone.

Provided that where the lot is situated at the corner of two or more roads then such distances may, at the discretion of the Responsible Authority, be reduced below the distances hereinbefore set out. Provided further that the above-described building line shall not apply to the eastern and western alignment of Throssell Street, between Railway Terrace and Quinlan Street where the building line shall be 10 feet; and for land on the eastern side of Throssell Street between Quinlan Street and Slater Street, shall be 60 feet.

5.2 No person shall stock or place any fuel or raw materials or products or byproducts or waste of manufacture in a Light Industrial Zone or a General Industrial Zone, nearer to a road or street than the building line.

5.3 No person shall in a Light Industrial or General Industrial Zone use the land between the building line and the road or street for any purpose other than a means of access, for parking of vehicles, for loading or unloading vehicles, or for lawns, gardens or trade displays.

## PART VI.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purposes of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provision of Part II shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its Shire Clerk, Building Surveyor, or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

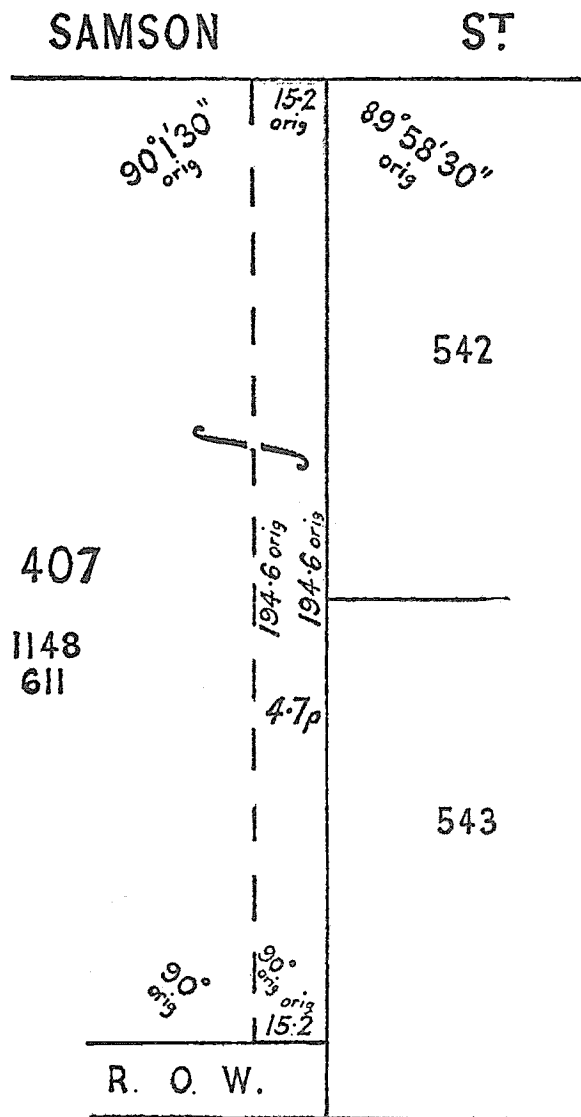

I, THE UNDERSIGNED MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE, being the minister charged with the administration of the Agricultural Products Act, 1926-1966, for the time being acting in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by section 3D of the said Act, and on the recommendation of the Citrus Sales Advisory Committee constituted under the Act do hereby revoke the prohibition concerning the sale of citrus fruits as proclaimed by notice in The West Australian newspaper of the 11th May 1968, and the Government Gazette of the 10th May 1968, under the provisions of the aforesaid section 3D and hereby prohibit the sale except for the purpose of export of all grades and varieties of citrus fruits as listed in column 1 of the schedule hereto that are below the minimum sizes specified in column 2 of the schedule from the 23rd August, 1968, until further notice but in any case not later than the 31st December, 1968.

A person shall not sell, except for the purpose of export from the State, any citrus fruits of which the sale is, pursuant to the provisions of section 3D of the Act prohibited and any person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.
