South Belmont Drainage Area.

Esther Street Branch Drain, Section 2.

The construction of compensating basin and pipe drain approximately 1,700 feet in length, together with all other necessary apparatus and as shown on plan M.W.B. No. 9965.

- (a) A waste water treatment plant and a land filtration area.
 - (b) A brick and concrete pumping station and a reinforced concrete well together with a 6-inch diameter rising main and all other apparatus connected therewith.
 - (c) Twelve inch, 9-inch, 6-inch and 4-inch diameter reticulation pipe sewers together with manholes and other apparatus connected therewith, and shown on plan M.W.B. 9957.

(e) The Control Officer can approve a well burnt roadside as a substitute for a firebreak inside the property.
